A Beautiful Center—Some Neatly Situated Homes.

BEVILLE, BEZ CO., TEX., March 3, 1881. Editors San Antonio Express:

This beautiful little village is something over one hundred miles from San Antonio, and is situated in the middle of a rolling prairie country, which is generally well adapted for farming, being mostly black sandy loam, just enough sand to make it easy to cultivate. The country is almost entirely enclosed by pasture fences. The stock is doing well except sheep, a large part of which have been killed during the past season. A few men are doing well with sheep, but the losses have been so large that most men are abandoning the business and are anxious to leave in cattle. This region would pasture thousands of head more cattle than are now here and consequently there is a great demand for stock cattle.

Farming operations are being carried forward rapidly by those who are engaged in that business, but there is a great scarcity of reliable help for farm work. Agriculture is becoming more popular every year, and this country is just on the eve of a great advance in that direction. The people are beginning to discover that farming will pay, and in a few years that any attempt has been made to plant out trees.

Minor part of the Bill home, here in Beville, has a good amount of one and a half acres which has supplied his table during the winter with all the vegetables he needed. He has also a small garden which yields him a revenue of about one hundred dollars from the sale of vegetables, and that is a considerable amount for a man who has no "garden truck" besides he has had one and two yearling calves during the winter of his turnip patch.

I have a good amount of one and a half acres here and have many more. I am a farmer, and I have been so far that I have visited. But my growth is retarded by the immense pastures in its vicinity, and I have been unable to get it under cultivation. I hope the day is not far distant when this beautiful section of our state will be covered with farms, and that its rich veins of wheat will swell the wealth of the country.
