How to Raise Cotton.

How to Raise Cotton.

David Dickson, of Sparia Ga., who took the premium at the State Fair in Georgia, in 1809, for eighteen bales of cotton on six acres, who before the war made \$500,000 in fitteen years by farming, having begun with a carital-of-only-825,000, and was equally successful after the war, thus laid down before his death the rules by which he was governed in the cultivation of cotton: Lay off rows four feet apart with a shovel plow, double furrow, and pot in fertilizers eight inches deep. Ridge with a long seconder, five inches wide. Make the beds with a turning-plow, and subsoil with the turnplow. That with cotton-seed sower and cover with board or harrow. First piowing, run wenty-two lach sweep with right wing turned docked to days after plowling. Becond printed the ten days after plowling. Becond purned up a little more. The rule of the law way run standing in the drill will be much more forward in maturing. Cotton only requires disance one way. On ievel land run the rows north and south. A cotton plant, to stand a two weeks drouth, must have four inches soil and six inches subsoil; three weeks', six inches soil and the same subsoil; three weeks', six inches soil and the same subsoil. To improve the cotton plant, select seed every year after the first picking, up to the middle of October, taking the best stalks and the best boils on the stalk. From the 10th to the 20th of Auril is the best time to plant cotton. Plow every three weeks, and left the hoes come ten days behind cleaning the cotton perfectly.




