





BE IT ORDAINED by the City Council of the City of Sam Antonio:

That section 2 of chapter XVII, R. O. shall read as follows the running at large of dogs in the streets of this city, be, and is hereby declared to be a misannee, and the police, under the instruction of the marshal, are hereby. Instructed to kill, or cause to be killed, in a summary manner, all dogs found running at large, whose owners have not compiled with the provisions of sec. I hereof; provided, it shall be unlawful for any person other than said police officers as may be charged with the execution of this ordinance, to kill any dog not his own, or shall any politonister poison to any dog, for the purpose of destroying such dog, nor shall any politonister poison to any dog whose owner shall have compiled with sec. I; and any person violating this ordinance shall, upon conviction, be fined in any sum not execeding two hundred dollars, and, if a policeman, shall, in addition to such fine, be removed from office; and that this ordinance take effect and be in force from and after passage.
