

Kaeponly those cows that yield butter of good calor, haver and texture. There are some cows from which no one can get good butter. Feed only proof, sweet food, the best for butter being early cut timothy and clover hay, and corns-meal, and give only pure water. Observe the most scrupulous cleanliness in the stable and dairy. Keep the cows "good health and contented. Use a chust that brings the butter in thirty minites. Keep the temperature of the milk and cream as near to sixty degrees as possible, and churs the cream when only alightly sour. Work the butter-milk out of the butter with the ladle, and not with the hand. If water is used it should be pure and cold. The butter should be gashed or out in working, not "plankered" or flattened out. One cause of pure dairy sait should be used for each pound of butter at two workings, with an interval of twelve hours between the workings (for immediate use many prefer less sait).
