A "Vernon" in the El Paso Times is endeavoring to prove that the Mexicans are more numerous than the Americans in Texas, and estimates of the Arabs and ancient Jews.

What, what! We have had a glorious day. Shall we gratulate because it did not come a little earlier or a little later, or because it came on the date that we will have no more in the next twelve or eighteen months? It won't do to be satisfied.

The country is now breathing freer, the dangerous point in the president's illness being considered favorably turned. Unless something unusual occurs in the course of nature, there is little doubt of his recovery, though it must necessarily be slow and tedious.

In pleading "not guilty" to the bribery charge, Senator Sessions reserved the right to change his plea. Senator Sessions in this case is almost as bad as the Irishman accused of stealing a pig. When asked whether he was guilty or not guilty, he replied, "From the devil can I tell, your honor, till I hear the evidence!"

Mr. CHARLES M. BARNES complains that justice was done him by his arrest on Friday last. He says he was seeking a pistol only to defend himself in case he was assaulted, and for that he was arrested, the honey charge being an effort to frighten him from the judge promptly discharged him on hearing the evidence.

Each county in the State is to have the privilege of presenting a block of stone to be used in the new capitol building at Austin. We move that Bexar county present the corner-stone of the old Alamo plaza market-house, and that to remove it with safety, we commence at the top of the building and work down until the corner-stone is reached.

President GARFIELD has signed a consent to the Eagle Pass & Topolovampo railway company, including a subvention of \$8,000 a mile to be paid only in government toll on the completion of the road, the company to deposit with the government \$150,000 as a guarantee of good faith.

The immigration of 1881 is thus far at the rate of half a million a year. The total number since January 1 is 245,926—an increase of 65,000 over the same period last year. The month of June alone showed nearly one-third of the total, bringing 100,000 more immigrants than June of last year. Nearly one-half of the June arrivals were Germans, the Irish and Swedes making about one-sixth each of the whole number.

The financial success of the great international exposition to be opened at Atlanta, Ga., October 5th, being considered assured beyond a doubt, the executive committee have decided to exhibit which required payment for every square foot of space occupied and to make the entry fee of \$25 the only charge for admission. Under this decision, ever merchant, mechanic or manufacturer in the civilized world can enter his wares for exhibition, and secure the necessary floor space, by sending his formal application addressed to the International Cotton Exposition, accompanied with his check for the entry fee of \$25.

The tax assessors are to be powerless at Albany, and the legislature is evidently as far from a solution of the difficulty as ever. Individual ambition and personal prejudice or favoritism is costing the people of New York a round sum for which there is no chance of a return. The people should hold mass meetings and insist that the legislature compromise their differences at once or adjourn. In addition to the enormous expense involved, the legislature is bringing odium and disgrace upon the state, and there is no pleasant feature about the whole business to set as a recompense. Conking gains nothing in the voting, and there can be little doubt of his losing friends among the people by his act in the matter of policy.

The New York Tribune, commenting upon federal taxation of foreign banking capital, says that it is a question likely to be brought before the courts. The record of Commissioner Ransom in regard to the taxes on the money employed in the business of the Chicago branch of the bank of Montreal in the matter of taxing the entire money paid by the branch bank, but not the nominal capital allotted to it by the home bank. This was said to be one of the strongest in favor of the government, because the laws of Illinois permit the bank to receive deposits and to do a general banking business. The agencies of foreign banks are not allowed in New York to receive deposits or in any way interfere with the business of the national or state banks.

There is a natural disposition on the part of the American people to croak; at least there is always an army of croakers in the field. The country is always in a dreadful state, if not because of one thing, then it is another. We are always, too, on the verge of a great political or social calamity. The croakers and speculators during the past week have largely displayed their croaking tendency. All sorts of calamities have been prophesied in the event of Arthur becoming president, though the prophets without exception admitted that Conkling would be the ruling power. Columns after columns of high colored news articles have been written on the great danger threatening the country from such an event, the writers not stopping to consider the fact that the only difference ever yet manifested between Conkling and Garfield was confined to the appointment of a few government officers, in which, as between the candidates of each, the only difference could have resulted would have been confined to Garfield's supporters among the office holding class, and they might not have been disturbed to any considerable extent.

Our attention has been called to an editorial in the Erie Press, of this city, of a few days ago, reflecting on the action of the reigning county commissioners and city fathers in passing resolutions denouncing Senator Massey and asking him to resign, their action being based on the insinuations of his political enemies that he was originally connected with the star route fraud. For the quieting of those who were bitten by the dog last week, we give what the medical authority in the state says on the subject. A bite of a snake sends the venom immediately into the blood, and thus becomes deadly. The bite of a dog does not do this, and if there is any poison from hydrophobia, the action does not cause damage until after a period of incubation, the incubation takes place. At any time within 24 hours it is considered a good preventive to cauterize the wound and destroy the poison. Where the persons bitten have immediately had the wounds cauterized there cannot be any danger, even if the dog was mad—which has not yet been established. We believe there is no cure for hydrophobia, but it does not necessarily follow that all persons or animals bitten by a rabid animal are mad. There are several cases where persons have had their flesh torn by dogs known to have the rabies, notably the case of F. M. White Esq., a gentleman well known in Northwestern Texas, who was bitten by a dog known to have the hydrophobia about twenty years ago, and who, to his knowledge, beyond the slight flesh wound inflicted. It is said that no dog ever dies if the animal's teeth do not penetrate the flesh; also that if the dog dies anything, it will be an hour or more before after the poison thus removed will be removed on the teeth. These, however, are but consolatory reflections. The safe way is the best way, and that is to muzzle or kill the dogs. The chances of serious consequences from the bite of a mad dog may be less than one to the thousand, but nobody wants to take that chance.

The people of San Antonio might learn a useful lesson by noting the course pursued by the people of New Braunfels through their city council, in relation to securing public health. The corporation of New Braunfels owned certain properties which, if the town became a great city and a large manufacturing centre, would be very valuable, but a little progress was being made in that direction, the council proposed to devote a portion of the property to the work of horticulture, and have clearly made a long step in advance. For a more detailed account of the progress of the corporation on condition that the purchasers erect or cause to be erected thereon, or on adjoining property, a substantial factory worth at least one hundred thousand dollars, the factory to be in operation within five years. The benefit of the people of New Braunfels will derive from the establishment of such a factory will be worth more in one year than the property in worth, or ever would be unless the town should greatly increase in size and importance.
