

GULLINGS FROM THE CAPITAL.

FIRE AT THE RAYMOND.

One Thousand Dollars Worth Damaged Covered by Insurance—District Court—Cost and Wool—Governor Roberts on the Apportionment Question.

At Austin, Texas, December 2.—About 3 o'clock this morning the energetic ringing of the fire-bell told the Austinites that a fire of no insignificant consequence was under way in the southward. It proved to be the Raymond house. The manager went through the kitchen and closed up and saw that it was safe at eleven o'clock. The fire, from some cause, was discovered in the southwest corner of the kitchen, and had burned through the ceiling into a room above before it was discovered. Just above the corner of the kitchen in the second story was the room of Mr. Thompson, a member of the Heavy Artillery. This lady was awakened by the smoke and flames which were pouring through the window of her room, and she hastened to the fire. She had a large bedstead with her, and she heated the bedstead with a stove, and she sat on the bedstead, and she was covered with smoke and flames. She was rescued by the firemen, and she was taken to the hospital. She is now recovering from her injuries.

There was no business of importance transacted at any of the state departments in the district court today the case of Haddock vs. the state is still pending. Hence, the case is not likely to reach a termination until next week.

The governor says that the redistricting of the legislature is a very important matter, and should meet with the approval of all. Such a session would be of a large number of the knowing ones.
