Dr. A. E. McDonald, superintendent of a ward in the insane hospital, took the stand. Witness had, during his practice attended a thousand cases of insanity, and had given special study to insanity. He states the difference between delusions and insane delusions, the former being the subject of a connection by judgment and sense, and the latter not being correct, and for that reason denominated insane delusions. He believed, judging by his observations and experience, that the claim of inspiration frequently asserted by insane persons, proceeds from some hallucination.

Witness was asked if persons acting by inspiration would indicate it in any other way than by their associations, and he replied that their actions and be-havior would indicate it as well as their associations.

In answer to a question if such persons would fear any apprehension of bodily injury or take any precaution against danger, said that inspiration always over-rides all fear of bodily pain and renders the person who believes he is acting under inspiration oblivious to such considerations. They seldom plan with deliberation, but on the contrary, their acts are sudden, and the conception and execution are simultaneous, and seldom attempt to avoid the consequences, in any way.

Guiteau suggested that there were two kinds of insanity—the crank insanity and the Abraham insanity, that he belonged to the latter class.

Witness described what is commonly called temporary insanity, and said he did not believe in such insanity and had never seen any instance of it. McDonald did not believe in heriditary insanity, an eccasional defect might be transmitted but not disease itself; as a rule the descendants of insane persons.


