GALVESTON.

Mayor Fisher votes the Appropriation for Mardi Gras and Firemen's Annual Celebration - Cotton Reports from Central Texas - Brazos River Booming - Oyater Creek on a Boisterous - Notes, &c.

GALVESTON, February 10.-In conformity with the provisions of the city charter, which holds that the council has no authority to make appropriations from the public revenue for celebrating or assisting in celebrating any public events or holidays, or to give or assist in giving any private or public entertainment, Mayor Fisher has vetoed the resolution of the city council, passed at the regular session of Monday evening last, appropriating one thousand dollars for the Mardi Gras parade on the 12th inst. and one hundred dollars for the fire department in good order for the annual parade of April 27th. This action of the mayor's is generally commended.

Charles Victor, of the cotton exchange, addressed a letter to the freight department of the Houston and Texas Central railway, inquiring the probable amount of cotton which would be shipped by that road, and was answered by C. J. True, assistant freight agent, who sent Mr. Victor report from sixty-five stations on the line. The estimated shipments from these points from January 20th to September 1st is 36,610 bales, and the actual stock on hand, at date of the report, was 19,433 bales.

The water is reported as being the highest since the great freshet of 1852. The river is full of large quantities of timber, which had been driven down since fifteen feet and a foot more will rise the whole country.
