## City News.

ABCHITECTURE What a Reporter of the Express Saw in Way of Public and Private Im-provements in a Ride

Hotel Maverick was the first place visited, where the reporter found Mr. George Maverick and Captain Silvey in close conversation. Carpenters, stone masons and laborers were builty at work, and the sound of hammer and saw made bearing almost impossible. On the first floor there will be two large dining rooms, one for guests of the hotel and laddes, and the other as a public restaurant, together with a cigar store, office and three large rooms.

On the second floor are eight large bed rooms in the rear, with three double bed rooms and a parlor in the front, and on the third floor there are seventeen spacious rooms, with a wide hall. This hotel will probably be open and ready for visitors within two weeks. This magnificent hotel was the conception of Mr. Giles, and on close inspection proves to be one of the handsomest buildings in the city. The carving on the pillars and cornices in front are chaste and elegant in design and workmanship, revealing the hand of an experienced artist.

The view to be had from the yet uncompleted mansard roof is little short of the sublime, enabling one to get a perfect bird's-eye view of the whole city. When completed this will undoubtedly be (as in houses in Asia) a resort of ladies and gentlemen on hot summer-evenings. The kitchen is under the building, while the laundry and nine servants' rooms are in a building to the rear of the hotel.

As the reporter was about to leave, Mr. Alfred Giles kindly invited him to accompany him in a drive through the city as he (Mr. Giles) was about to visit some of the many buildings he was constructing. Driving rapidly down Houston street we passed the George, Milam and vance & Edwards' blocks, all of which were the fruit of one short year, while the cellar of Albert Maverick's new block on Houston street was passed the new residence of G.
