They left the jailer's office and took refuge in the jailer's pasture, in the northeastern part of town, and the other two made for the river, the latter two, Bill Smith and Dan Demmon. The latter two were captured on the east bank of the river, a few hours after their escape, and one of the four who took refuge in Horst's pasture, Bill Robinson, who was sick and has been under treatment of the county physician for some time, was brought in by Sheriff Conroy and placed in the jail, and the other three, who were "trustees" are still at large.
