

Our Wool Interests

If all of the wool men who sell their wool in the San Antonio market would observe the same rule as Messrs. Scott & Foster, there would be infinitely less complaints from the producers of that the state of the sale is made being made known to the public, and not reported at "private terms." When your neighbors know what you get for your wool, they will be better enabled to know what their own should command. Of course, it is to the interest of the buyers to keep the terms private, so they will be the better enabled to realize good bargains, from the next customer that comes along. When the growers become convinced of this fact, they will insist upon the terms being made public for the benefit of others. When the Scott & Foster cilp was soid at 27 cents per pound, they were told that the terms must be considered private. This they objected to, saying that if that was the condition, the sale must be considered "off." But rather than lose this valuable clip, the sale was closed without conditions. San Antonio has thus far paid the highest prices for wool over any other market in western Texas, the highest prices in Corpus Christi, as published in their local papers, ranging from 18 to 21 cents per pound. The price of shipping wool to this market from Tom Green is \$1.25 per 100 poun's. It will be readily seen, from these figures, that San Antonio difers far superior inducements over all others.
