It was announced that the next business in order was reports of committees, and called for the report of the committee on the revision of the constitution and by laws. Major Waddor, chairman of that committee, reported the following: Sec. 4.—Each mission station situated within the limits of an organized parish shall be entitled to one delegate to be elected by the congregation of such parish in such manner as may be provided by the delegates from other mission stations are elected.

Section four from any cause the vestry from any parish or the congregation of any mission station may have failed to elect delegates to any convocation, any layman from such parish or mission station who may be present at the meeting of the convocation, and possessing the qualifications prescribed by section 3 of this article, may be appointed as delegate to represent such parish or mission station by the Bishop or by the vestry of the parish or mission station, if the committee is accessible, otherwise by the Bishop himself, and any delegates so appointed, not exceeding the number limited to parishes or mission stations, shall be entitled to all the rights and privileges of delegates regularly elected by their respective parishes or mission stations. Also change section 4 to section 5.

The changes proposed by the committee in the constitution caused a good deal of debate pro and con. Several amendments were submitted and voted down. Finally it was decided to divide the report and vote upon each section separately. Section four was adopted unanimously. Section 5 was changed so as to strike out the words "by and with the consent of" the standing committee, if the committee is accessible, otherwise by the Bishop alone. We have enclosed the words struck out in parentheses. In reading the section as amended they should be omitted.

It was announced that the next business in order was reports of committees, and called for the report of the committee on the revision of the constitution and by laws. Major Waddor, chairman of that committee, reported the following: Sec. 4.—Each mission station situated within the limits of an organized parish shall be entitled to one delegate to be elected by the congregation of such parish in such manner as may be provided by the delegates from other mission stations are elected.

Section four from any cause the vestry from any parish or the congregation of any mission station may have failed to elect delegates to any convocation, any layman from such parish or mission station who may be present at the meeting of the convocation, and possessing the qualifications prescribed by section 3 of this article, may be appointed as delegate to represent such parish or mission station by the Bishop or by the vestry of the parish or mission station, if the committee is accessible, otherwise by the Bishop himself, and any delegates so appointed, not exceeding the number limited to parishes or mission stations, shall be entitled to all the rights and privileges of delegates regularly elected by their respective parishes or mission stations. Also change section 4 to section 5.

The changes proposed by the committee in the constitution caused a good deal of debate pro and con. Several amendments were submitted and voted down. Finally it was decided to divide the report and vote upon each section separately. Section four was adopted unanimously. Section 5 was changed so as to strike out the words "by and with the consent of" the standing committee, if the committee is accessible, otherwise by the Bishop alone. We have enclosed the words struck out in parentheses. In reading the section as amended they should be omitted.
