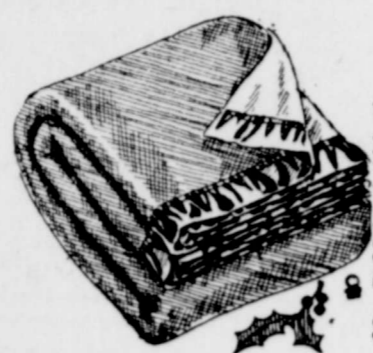

### Lack of Laborers Holds Up Sanitary Project In County

Need for more labor is holding up the project most vital to the welfare of citizens of Eddy county, Carl Henderson, county sanitarian, said at Carlsbad Saturday.

While \$9,000 is available now for the sanitary toilet project in Eddy county, and thirty-two should be on the job, only ten are working on the project now, Henderson said.

Although most of the unemployed labor in this county is absorbed by the several projects, there are available workers who should be at work, he said, but the government is slow about getting them back on the rolls so that they can be available.

The sanitarian pointed out the fact that the infant mortality rate in New Mexico is higher than any other state or territory in this nation.

Causes of the alarming rate of infant mortality in this county, he said, are those which would be corrected by completion of the project, which calls for 830 sanitary toilets in this county. Cause of most deaths of children less than a year of age are intestinal diseases, all of them bred in unsanitary places in the rural communities where modern plumbing is not available.

Nine thousand dollars is available right now for the project, and if it proves workable, \$19,000 will be appropriated for this county. It is up to those interested in the welfare of the community to do what they can to speed up the availability of more workers, Henderson said.

While thirty-eight units have been completed in the northern part of the county, under the supervision of R. M. Thorne, there are no workers in the southern part, where this work is badly needed.

The government furnishes all the labor in the building of sanitary toilets, the owner furnishing only the materials, the cost of which is placed at \$5. The completed unit is worth \$20. Statistics show that, in addition to the value to the owner and to the health of the community, each unit is worth \$6 to the community.

One hundred, thirty-seven Eddy county persons have signed contracts for the units.

### Game Department To Make War On Predatory Animal

The state game and fish commission in a special meeting at Santa Fe Saturday laid plans for an intensive war on predatory animals during the coming spring, after reports of State Game Warden Elliott Barker and J. Stokely Ligon, game specialist, described increasing game losses in many areas from the predators.

The commission was informed that lions, coyotes and bobcats are increasing their tolls in various sections of New Mexico and notably the southwestern area.

Plans for the campaign contemplate the employment of the regular force of hunters and trappers, two or three new men, a crew of five WPA workers and several regular deputies to be employed temporarily. They will work under the supervision of Ligon, called by Barker "the best predatory animal authority in New Mexico."

Expressing satisfaction on the commission's action which also drew the endorsement of Gordon White, president of the state game protective association, Barker said: "This job is acknowledged to be too big for any one organization to handle. The biological survey, sportsmen and ranchers will be asked to cooperate in an intensive campaign against the predatory animals."

Game department receipts from July 1 to December 1, Barker told the commission, increased from \$72,257 in 1934 to \$77,146 in the five months ending November 30, a gain of \$4,888.

Present at Saturday's meeting were Federal Judge Colin Neblett, chairman; Commissioners Henry Raitzel, Deming, and A. Gilberto, Espinosa, Albuquerque; State Game Warden Barker and President Gordon White of the state GPA.

MISS MITCHELL DIES

News was received here last week of the death of Miss Helen Mitchell on last Thursday at her home in Los Angeles, California. Miss Mitchell, a former resident of Roswell, was also a former teacher in the Artesia schools before moving to Los Angeles in 1915.

### Can Sell Isolated Range Tracts Now

WASHINGTON — The interior department Thursday was free to proceed with the administration of the Taylor grazing act in regard to sale and lease of isolated tracts of public domain not included in grazing districts.

Legal obstacles which have hindered effective administration of grazing act provisions relating to sale and lease of these tracts were removed with the signing by President Roosevelt of a modification of his order of November, 1934, withdrawing all unreserved public lands from sale, lease, entry, or settlement.

The 1934 order was interpreted as covering all public lands and as a result the interior department was hindered in its attempts to carry out the sale and lease provisions of the grazing act.

Senator Joseph C. O'Mahoney, Wyoming democrat, who has had several conferences on the subject with Secretary Ickes, said he was advised the president had signed the modified order and the "lease and sale sections of the grazing act can now become operative."

### EDDY COUNTY FARMERS PAY UP

Ninety percent of Eddy county farmers who borrow money for seed have repaid their loans to the government, John W. March of the Emergency Corporation loan office at Carlsbad said last week.

Since harvesting of crops is unusually late this year, March said, between ninety-five and 100 percent of the loans probably will be repaid.

March has been working on collection of loans on feed and seed in this county for several months.

He called attention to the fact that the government has filed suit against three New Mexico residents for failure to pay their feed and seed loans. Named in the suit were Ray M. Miller of Rio Arriba county, Mrs. Rinaldo Miera of Sandoval county and Fanny Knotts of Colfax county.

### CONCHAS DAM TO SERVE THREE-FOLD PURPOSE

Irrigation of 65,000 acres of land, mostly in Quay county, is one of the principal developments expected from the Conchas dam, according to engineering and irrigation experts at Santa Fe.

Other possible projects include development of water supply for Tucumcari and the Southern Pacific railroad, and construction of a 135-mile pipeline to Amarillo, Texas.

The Conchas dam primarily is a flood control project, but its construction will make feasible an irrigation project heretofore considered too costly. It is estimated that it would cost \$15,000,000 to put the 65,000 acres under irrigation.

### Fall Loses Skirmish In Effort To Hold Three Rivers Ranch

ALAMOGORDO—While he lay gravely ill in an El Paso, Texas, hospital, Albert E. Fall, former secretary of the interior, and one of the central figures in the sensational teapot dome case, lost the first skirmish at Alamogordo Monday in his legal battle against eviction from his famous Three Rivers ranch home in New Mexico.

The aging former Harding cabinet member, and Mrs. Fall, had answered the complaint of the Petroleum Securities Corporation seeking to oust them from their ranch home with a demurrer alleging no title or interest in the property had been shown in the plaintiff's action.

Monday the demurrer was denied by Judge Numa C. Frenger in Otero county district court.

The court's decision which gives the Falls thirty days in which to answer, delays the date of any trial until January or later.

Previously the Doheny company had ordered the former secretary, bedfast with illness which has culminated in his present critical condition, from the property.

### PATTON NAMED TO CRIME COMMISSION

Gov. Clyde Tingley Friday appointed Attorney General Frank Patton as representative for New Mexico on the interstate crime commission, such appointment having been provided by the legislature in New Mexico, authorizing compact to suppress crime, expedite apprehension and trial and other crime matters.

A wire here from Richard Harts-horne, Newark, New Jersey, chairman of the commission, said there would be a meeting soon to adopt important statutory recommendations and propose compacts.
