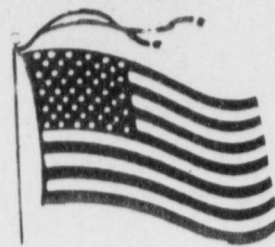

## MISD Board Hires New Football Coach

### Coach Adair Begins Duties January 6

Upon the recommendation of Superintendent Bill Moore, the board of trustees of MISD hired Randy Adair as Athletic Director and Head Football Coach at the meeting Monday night.

Coach Adair will assume his new position on January 6, 1992. He comes to Muleshoe from McCamey, TX where he served in the same capacity for the past three years. Coach Adair has 19 years of coaching experience with the last ten as Athletic Director and Head Football Coach.

Coach Adair and his wife, Sandra, have been married 19 years. They have two sons, Jacob, 14, and Joseph, 9. The boys are in the eighth grade and third grade respectively.

Mrs. Adair is also a teacher, with 12 years of teaching experience in science and English. She plays the piano and enjoys reading.

Jake (Jacob) is sports-oriented and participates in football, basketball, track and tennis. Joe (Joseph) likes sports but is also an avid reader. Both boys enjoy computer games and are honor roll students. The entire family is active in the Baptist Church.

Coach Adair is a product of a teaching/coaching family. His father, D.H. Adair, was a head coach in several towns in Texas before starting a career with Gulf Oil. Adair has several family members who are also teachers and coaches in Texas. He states that he has spent much time in the Ballinger-San Angelo area and considers that area his home. Coach Adair enjoys Cajun-style cooking on special occasions in addition to golf and hunting.

As a player, Coach Adair was an all-Metro quarterback at Palmetto High School in Miami, Florida, where he also participated in basketball and track. He started at safety for Howard Payne University and was also their punter. In 1971, he was a member of the Lone Star Conference championship football team that posted a record of 10-1-1 and was ranked number three in the nation (small college poll). He was All-Conference and captain of the team in 1972.

As a coach, Adair has been an assistant at both the junior high and high school levels. He was an assistant at Leander (AAA), Bryan (AAAAA), and White Oak (AAA). Adair's first head coaching job was at Wills Point (AAA) in 1982. After a 2-8 first year, his second team there was 8-2 and district co-runner-

up. In 1984, he was hired at Lindale (AAA), where, in his third year, they were 9-1 and 10 AAA champions in football. At Lindale they also won 21 championships in other sports over the three years. In 1987, he was hired at Texas High School in Texarkana (AAAAA) as athletic director and head football coach. There he administered a staff of 29 coaches, including two junior high programs. In 1989, Coach Adair was hired at McCamey. In that year his team was 6-4 and co-runner-up in football. Coach Adair was the head track coach at both Wills Point and McCamey and golf coach at Lindale.

Coach Adair has a Bachelor of Science degree in secondary education from Howard Payne (1973) and is certified to teach English, health/PE, and driver education. In 1981, he received his master's degree in education administration from Stephen F. Austin State University. He completed his mid-management certification in 1990. He also has completed his Academic Leadership training through the Region Service Center in Kilgore, TX.

Coach Adair is an active member of the Texas High School Association, a member of the National Strength Coach and Conditioning Association, and a national member of the Fellowship of Christian Athletes.

Superintendent Moore said, "We are delighted to have the Adair's coming to Muleshoe. Not only will they be assets to the community, but I know Coach Adair will provide excellent leadership to our athletic Cont. Page 6, Col. 1

High pointers for the Muleshoe boys were: Eric McElroy, 18, and Sean Roberts, 17.

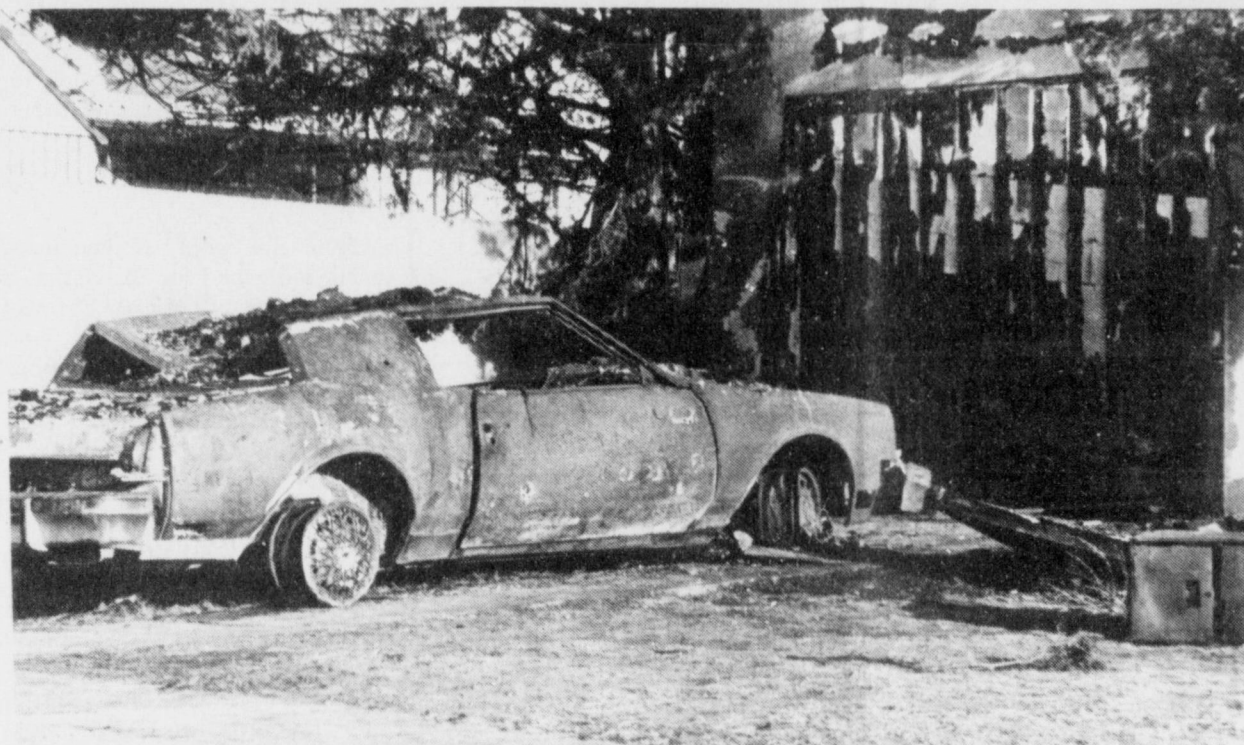
On December 13, the boys played Texico at Farwell. The final score of the game was Muleshoe 57, Texico 73.

## TV Station Interviews Local People Thursday

Because of national publicity given to Channel 6 closed cable TV station here in Muleshoe, a feature story on the station will be aired world wide on CNN (Cable News Network).

Tuesday, one day after CBS Affiliate KHOU left Muleshoe, the Southwest Bureau of CNN sent Mike Capp, correspondent; Jerry Mohn, Sound Technician to Muleshoe to get their story from Magann and Jack Rennels, owners of the station.

"The Bureau Chief requested that the arrival of the crew be kept secret so they could see our town and its people as they really are," explained Carolyn Johnson, Chamber of Commerce manager. "They didn't want anything staged," she added.

The angle of their story was the legacy created by Gil Lamb, creator of Channel 6 and how that legacy is still felt in Muleshoe and is being carried out by his family daily at the station.

The crew arrived in Muleshoe Thursday morning, December 13. Waiting for them were gift baskets and packets of information promoting Muleshoe from the directors of the Chamber of Commerce and Agriculture. "This really impressed them," stated Rennels. "They said they

had worked all over the country and had never been in a town where the chamber made them feel so welcome," she said. They began their work by filming Payton, Rennel's son, and then conducted an extensive interview with Mrs. Rennels at the station. They then went with Mrs. Rennels to Dillman Elementary and filmed her interviewing the "super kids" of the month, a monthly award given to a group of students who have excelled

academically.

The crew also went to the home of Thurman and Vivian White, a long time friend and advertiser of Gil Lamb had plenty to share with the newsmen.

After leaving the Thurman White home, the crew met and visited with Carolyn Johnson. "They had a very positive feeling about Muleshoe," stated Mrs. Johnson. "They praised

## Cotton Harvest Half Over: 50,050 Bales Ginned

With area cotton harvest slightly over one half through, ten area gins reported that they had ginned 50,050 bales of cotton as of Monday morning.

Muleshoe Co-Op Gin has ginned 10,000 bales and Della Puckett reported that they were about one half through. "We are having some pretty good grades, (average) some are low depending on when it was planted.

At the West Camp Gin, James Shepard stated that they were a little over half through, having ginned 3100 bales. "We're getting a fair grade with a low mike," Shepard said.

Due to a hail storm that got a lot of the cotton, Willard Tibbits said, "Its pretty slow, there isn't much cotton in the Pleasant Valley area. The Pleasant Valley Gin has ginned 1850 bales, according to Tibbits.

The Lariat Gin got caught up last week, the rain last week slowed the ginning process.

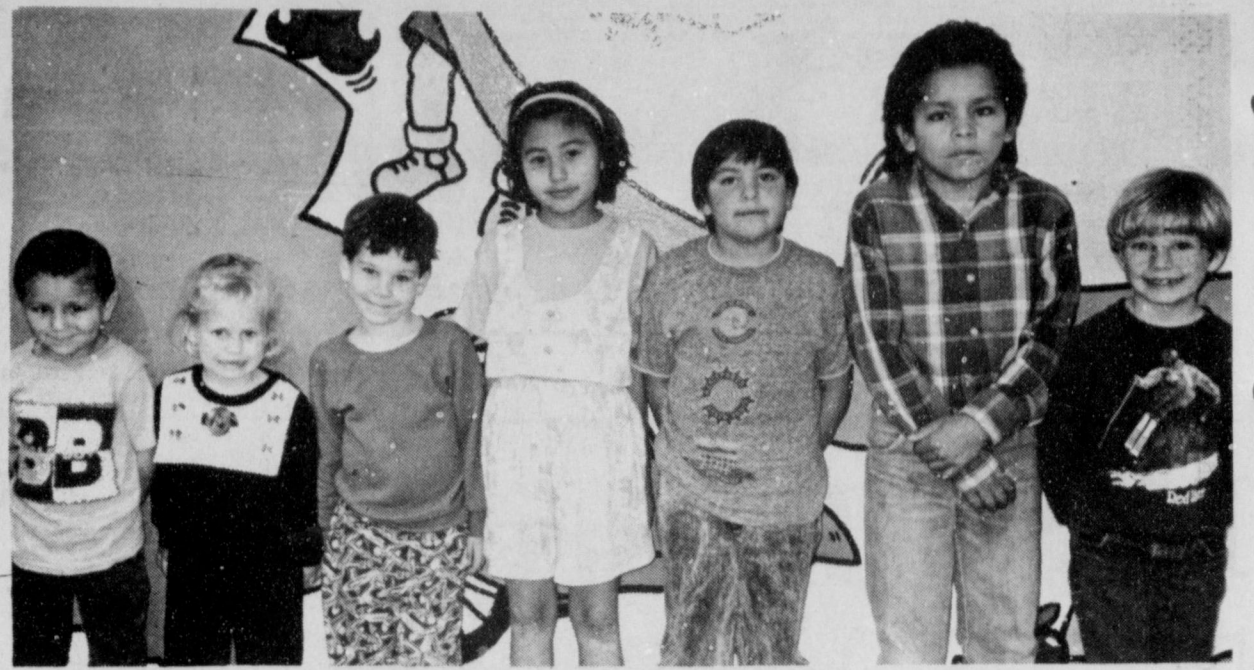

## 60 Years Ago

1931

## 40 Years Ago

1951

## 30 Years Ago

1961

Mule Memorial Association's goal of erecting a monument to the mule in Muleshoe moved a big step closer to reality today. Gil Lamb, president of the Mule Memorial Association, signed a lease agreement with Santa Fe Railway for a plot of ground as a site for the monument. The land is located at the north end of Main Street, just south of the depot, and abutting on U.S. Highway 84. The proposed memorial would be a life-size replica of a mule in a meditative pose, typical of George Washington Carver's famous remark, "I never saw a mule that didn't look like he thought he was thinking."

## 20 Years Ago

1971

One local woman has expressed her opinion to the Journal on a loose dog problem in Muleshoe. She stated that she is tired of loose dogs that relieve themselves in her front yard and tear up her flower beds. The woman, who prefers to remain anonymous, said many of the dogs running loose in Muleshoe have owners who are not keeping them restrained. At the last city council

## Cade Morris Wins Lazbuddie ISD Geography Bee

Cade Morris, son of Gail and Marca Morris, a fifth grade student at Lazbuddie Elementary, won the school-level competition of the National Geography Bee on December 11 and a chance at a \$25,000 college scholarship. The school-level Bee, at which students answered oral questions on geography, was the first round in the fourth annual National Geography Bee, which is sponsored by National Geographic WORLD, the Society's magazine for children, and Amtrak.

The kick-off for this year's bee was the week of December 2 to coincide with Geography Awareness Week. Thousands of schools around the United States, the District of Columbia, and five U.S. territories participated. The school winners, including Cade Morris, will now take a written test; up to 100 of the top scorers in each state and territory will be eligible to compete in their state bee March 27.

Second place winner was seventh grade student Heath Brown, son of Scott and Claire Brown. Other finalists were Garrett Magby, Bobby Martha, Joshua McDonald, Brice Foster, Don Burch, Blake Mimms, Guy Nickels and Josh Warren.

The National Geographic Society with its co-sponsors will provide an all-expenses-paid trip to Washington, D. C., for state champions and their teacher escorts to participate in the National Geographic Bee national championship on May 20 and 21. The first-place national winner will receive a \$25,000 college scholarship; the second-place winner, a \$15,000 scholarship; and the third-place winner, a \$10,000 scholarship.

The National Geographic Society, with 10 million members, has as its mission the "increase and diffusion of geographic knowledge." In addition to the National Geography Bee, the Society sponsors a number of

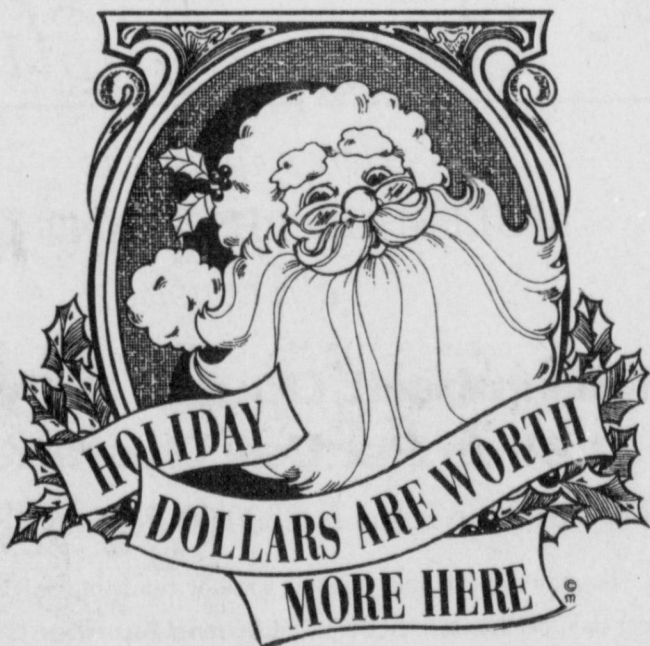

### Crop Insurance

#### Seminar Offered

A seminar to introduce farmers and crop insurance agents to a new computer software program designed by Texas A&M University to help evaluate crop insurance alternatives will be presented Dec. 5 during the Amarillo Farm and Ranch Show at the Civic Center at Amarillo.

"Although producers understand the basics of crop insurance, it is very difficult to evaluate it in a whole farm setting," says Dr. Ashley Lovell, agricultural economist with the Texas Agricultural Extension at Stephenville. He will conduct the seminar from 11 to 11:45 a.m.

"Recognizing the need for crop insurance is one thing," Lowell said. "But knowing which price selection and yield coverage will provide optimum farm protection consistent with the grower's risk preference is complex." Many factors must be considered in each situation, he noted.

Given this wide array of considerations, agricultural economists at A&M are developing and field testing an expert computer model, CIRMAN (Crop Insurance Risk Management Analyzer). It runs a computerized model for 100 simulations and summarizes the results.

Lovell and Greg Allen, Extension Service management associate, will explain CIRMAN in the seminar. CIRMAN applies advanced computer technology to the evaluation of the many choices faced in a whole farm environment where multiple crops may be involved, Allen said.

The model incorporates such factors as yield and price risk dimensions, the farm's financial condition, taxes, family consumption, machinery replacement, marketings and crop mix.

### Insurance Department

#### Adopts Deductible

#### Requirement

The state Department of Insurance announces the approved rules requiring insurance carriers to offer worker's compensation policies with deductibles, a requirement authored by state Senator Teel Bivins (R-Amarillo). The action will result in lower rates for many businesses.

"This is good news for businesses crippled by worker's comp expenses," he said. "This new deductible requirement will allow businesses to reduce their rates immediately. The larger the deductible a company carries, the larger the premium reduction."

Bivins placed an amendment on last year's worker's compensation reform bill instructing the state to adopt a deductible requirement. Bivins has worked closely with the Insurance Department to ensure that its regulations preserved his legislative intent of providing businesses relief from the high costs of worker's compensation insurance, while maintaining protec-

"We should be through by Christmas, if the weather holds out," said Wanda Shafer at the Needmore Co-Op Gin. "We've ginned 4300 bales and should gin about 500 more. The grade is average, but the price is low."
