On the aluminum cap, atop the Washington Monument, in Washington D.C. are displayed ee these words from the ground In fact, most visitors to the monument are totally unaware
they are even there. they are even there. These words have been there for many years; they are 555 feet,
5,125 inches in the air, perched atop the monument, facing skyward to the Father of our nation, overlooking the 69 square
miles which comprise the District miles which comprise the District of Columbia, capital of the United States of America.
Laus Deo! Two seemingly Out of sight and, one might think, out of mind, but very meaningfully placed at the highest point over what is the powerful city in the most successful nation in the world. So, what do those two four syllables and only seven letters mean? Very simply, they say, "Praise be to God!" Though construction of this giant obelisk began in 1848 when James Polk was President of the 1888 that the monument was inaugurated and opened to the public. It took twenty-five years oo finally cap the memorial with a tribute to the Father of our ations, "Laus Deo!"
From atop this magnificen visitors may take in the beautiful panoramic view of the city with its division into four major segments. From that vantage point one can also easily see the original plan of the designer, fect cross imposed upon the andscape, with the White house to the north, the Jefferson Memorial to the south, the Capitol to the east and the Lincoln Memorial to the west.
