Also, 2012 was a record year for vehicle sales in Clyde, and the service operation has also grown, Blake Fulenwider says.


All those things, he says, played roles in offering Foster a partnership.

Just a reminder that the Senior Center has game night on the 1st and 3rd Tuesday of each month at 6:00 p.m. Bring a snack food and join the fun!!!



Alex Henry "A.H." Ringhoffer, 84, went to be with the Lord on January 3, 2013 in Coleman, surrounded by family. Services were held at First Baptist Church, Cross Plains with Bro. Burlie Taylor officiating, assisted by Pastor Ronnie White on Sunday, January 6, 2013. Burial followed at the Burnt Branch Cemetery where Alex's parents were buried.

A.H. was born March 28, 1928 near San Angelo, Texas in Tom Green County to parents Emil and Clevia Moore Ringhoffer. A.H. was the younger of two brothers and started school in Water Valley before completing his primary education in Cross Plains, graduating in 1945. After farming a year, A.H. volunteered for the U.S. Air Force in March 1946 following the end of WWII serving for three years stationed in Japan and the Pacific as an Aerial Photography Specialist. After military service, A.H. attended Tarleton State for two years before transferring to Texas A&M, graduating in 1953 with a Bachelors degree in Range and Forestry. A.H. married Jo Ann Montgomery of Cross Plains on June 18, 1955 at the home of Loyd and Cassie Montgomery near Cross Plains.

After graduation, A.H. worked for the U.S.D.A. Soil Conservation Service as a Range Conservationist in Spur, Aspermont and Baird. A.H. retired from the U.S.D.A. Soil Conservation Service after 32 years in 1984. After retiring, he farmed and ranched in Cross Plains until 2010. A.H. loved horses and raising cattle and was locally renowned for the quality of both by special announcements being sent to buyers when A.H. had cattle to sell. After retirement A.H. served as a Board Member for Callahan Divide Soil and


He was preceded in death by his parents and a brother Emil Ringhoffer, Jr.

## First Part of "Pushing the Limits 4-part Series Begins January 17th

The Cross Plains Public Library's first part of a four-part series called "Pushing the Limits" will be held next Thursday, January 17, in the library's conference room. This is a science-related project funded by the National Science Foundation.

We will discuss the book, *When the Killing's Done* by T.C. Boyle, which is available free at the library. The sponsors for the Nature segment of the series chose this book. Boyle's work often focuses on complex questions where culture, ethics and science intersect. His current book fictionalizes a conflict between National Park Service's efforts to destroy an invasive species and radical animal rights activist endeavors to save an island's non-native population of black rats, which are causing the decline of native bird populations.

After watching a short video on a similar subject, participants will

consider questions such as, "What is natural?" and "How long must a species be in place before it's considered 'native'?" We look forward to a lively and thoughtful discussion since science is a part of our lives.

Libraries are a science gateway, a place of ideas, and a place to share. Please join the twenty-two participants who have already signed up and pick up your free copy of the book at the library. Bob Childress will facilitate the program discussion. Bob's degree and years of experience in Forestry and Range Management make him ideal as a moderator for the exchange and exploration of ideas on this topic.

A light supper will be served at 6:30 p.m., and the program will begin at 7:00 p.m.

On the afternoon of the 18th from 2:00 p.m. - 6:00 p.m. all steers and heifers will be classified and weighed.



### The New Year brings new visitors to the Museum

Wendell and Cindy Bowen of Wynnewood, OK took a winter break from their teaching jobs at the OK State School for the Deaf to make a swing down through here to visit the Robert E. Howard Museum. They had recently watched "The Whole Wide World" movie portraying Howard's casual relationship with local English teacher, Novalyn Price. As Wendell has long been interested in Howard's writings, it seemed natural to visit Cross Plains to see just how accurate the movie was.

The Bowsens are part of a unique team that administers a total program for the school which has a graduation rate of 12-15 students per year. Having been established in 1908 in Sulphur, OK, a few minutes drive from Wynnewood, the school now has a full fledged campus with academic centers, sports facilities, housing, a physical plant, a student union center and a first class computer media program. The school fields teams in football, basketball and volleyball playing other small schools in a rather far reaching area. Some of their opponents are also deaf and others have full hearing capabilities, making for interesting competition.

Wendell and Cindy are the first visitors from this interesting vocation.

Matt Underwood brings another interesting first to the Museum, as he is employed by the Harvard Medical School Library in Boston as part of the computer support team. Although he was born in Philadelphia, he grew up in Lewisville and graduated from SMU before moving back east for the job. He was visiting his family on his Christmas vacation and stopped in Cross Plains on a jaunt around West Texas. Having been in the Big Bend area, Ft. Davis and Marfa, as well as spending the night at the famous Gage Hotel in Marathon, he was duly impressed with our little town, commented in the over-all neat appearance and especially the downtown area.

Underwood had also recently seen the "Whole Wide World" movie and was delighted to be able to tour the town, sharing in the atmosphere of the movie.

## School Land Board votes to release \$300 million to fund schools

AUSTIN — The School Land Board voted today to release an additional \$300 million to public schools during its 2013 fiscal year after review of the Permanent School Fund's projected royalty income, cash flows, and investment capital requirements indicated the fund would not be hurt by lawmakers' demands for cash.

The \$300 million release approved today is in addition to the \$500 million previously approved for release by the board for public schools during the 2012-2013 fiscal biennium. The board voted to release the \$300 million in two installments of \$150 million each, with the first payment in February and the last in June.

Texas Land Commissioner Jerry Patterson, chairman of the board, cast the lone vote against the payment. He said the decision was frustrating because lawmakers passed a flawed budget last session that addressed short-term problems without providing a coherent long-term vision.

"We need to strive to do better," Patterson said. "Spending down our kid's trust fund to pay today's bills is a path I don't want to go down any further. Fortunately, the fund is healthy enough to protect Texas schools from one year of bad budgeting."

Patterson said he would oppose future legislative raids on the Permanent School Fund. "If we invested this \$300 million

today, and earned a return of 8 percent a year on it, it would be worth \$3 billion in 30 years," Patterson said.

Under the current operational guidelines of the Permanent School Fund's Bond Guarantee Program, up to \$9 billion of school district bonds could ultimately be guaranteed by that money, resulting in higher credit ratings and lower borrowing costs for school districts across the state.

Today's action runs contrary to the long-term vision held by the statesmen who founded the Permanent School Fund in 1876. "This kind of short-term thinking will kill the goose that lays the golden egg," Patterson said.

As chairman of the School Land Board, Patterson has overseen the diversification of the state's Permanent School Fund to include more real assets investments. Last year, these assets earned a return of more than 12 percent. Because of the strong returns on these investments, the School Land Board has released more than ever — nearly \$1.3 billion — to public schools since 2002.

The School Land Board oversees about 10 percent of the Permanent School Fund, Patterson said. But since 2003, that 10 percent of the pie has been responsible for providing from one-sixth to one-third of the total dollars released annually from the Permanent School Fund to public schools.

### Emergency unemployment insurance benefits deadline extended claimants should continue to apply for benefits while searching for work

AUSTIN — The deadline for jobless Texans to qualify for emergency unemployment insurance benefits has been extended to Jan. 1, 2014.

Federal legislation signed by President Barack Obama on Jan. 2, 2013 will extend benefits to approximately 120,000 Texans who would have otherwise exhausted their unemployment benefits on Dec. 31, 2012. Claimants should continue to request unemployment benefit payments on their scheduled day.

The legislation did not add benefits for individuals who have already exhausted their regular state unemployment benefits, federal Emergency Unemployment Compensation, and Extended Benefits. Claimants who currently receive unemployment insurance (UI) benefits may find updated information on their claims by logging on to ui.texasworkforce.org, or by calling the Texas Workforce Commission (TWC) Tele-Serv at 800-558-8321 and selecting Option 2 (Claim Status). There is no need to call TWC to qualify for this extension unless claimants receive a letter telling them to do so.

Emergency unemployment benefits provide temporary income for those individuals who have lost their jobs through no fault of their own. Benefits are federally funded, and Texas employers will not be charged for any claims paid on this extension.

TWC and the 28 local Workforce Development Boards are committed to providing work search assistance, training and other services to unemployed Texans. Thousands of job postings are available on WorkInTexas.com, TWC's online job-matching website.






