Local Residents Travel to China on Mission Trip

Taryn and I would like to thank everyone for their love, support and prayers as we prepared for our trip to China. We had an amazing and life changing experience. We boarded the plane in Dallas and headed towards Seattle. Taryn had not flown since she was a baby. She had a window seat and was able to look down and enjoy the snow covered Rocky Mountains. We landed in Seattle and had just enough time to make it through customs and arrive at our gate. The flight to Beijing was pretty rough, but we finally made it safe and sound. We had a 3 hour layover that turned into a 5 hour layover. We finally arrived in Kunming at 3:00 in the morning. The next day we took a 4 hour bus ride to the high school. Once we unpacked we ate our first "Chinese Meal" with chopsticks. The food was really good and we all were able to use the chopsticks well enough to get really full. Later that evening, our students met the Chinese students that they would be shadowing for the week. It was a little awkward at first because the Chinese students had heavy accents and their English was not very strong. The following morning we were all out on the basketball court at 6:45 a.m. for introductions and a

flag raising ceremony. We had a huge bowl of noodles for breakfast and then our students started their school day. My brother-in-law Nick, our team leader and I went to the teacher's lounge to talk to the staff. We saw our students several times during the day and some of them seemed really stressed. It was hard for them to be the center of attention, and all of them stood out in the crowd. Our students were still trying to understand the Chinese students and the English speaking Chinese teachers. Everything was new and very different. That evening in our devotional time they talked about the difficulties, but they all agreed it wasn't about them and they had a really good attitude going into the next day. Over the course of the next two days, each of our students taught 6 English classes. I was able to sit in on some of the classes and our students did a great job of explaining their life in the United States, and answering all of the Chinese student's questions. On Thursday, we traveled up the mountain to the village school. We worked on craft projects with the kids and the boys played basketball with them. After lunch, part of our team passed out the water filters that we brought to the school and explained how to use them. They also gave each student their own water bottle. Taryn and I went down into the village and visited with a man that was in a wheelchair. He had been injured 6 years ago and has not been able to leave his house. We talked with him while another part of our team measured his house for a ramp and took measurements for an outdoor shower. This will

enable him to leave his house and go outside, while also providing his family with a solar heated outdoor shower. The homes in the village are built into the side of the mountain almost like a cave. The people are very kind and hard working. When we visited their homes they wanted to give us everything that they had on hand. The children were so beautiful. Their clothes and their bodies were dirty, but their eyes shined when you spent time with them. The people in the village have a very hard life. It shows on their bodies and their faces. They really appreciated anything that the team did to show them that we care about them. We had taken a few of the Chinese students with us when we went to the Village school. On the way back down the mountain one of the girls was very quiet. I asked her if she was doing alright. She said, "Yes, I just feel much. I hope that I can help these kids in the future." Friday morning we left and travelled by bus to Kunming. We spent the afternoon walking around town and going through a huge flea market. We spent our last night in a Hostel and left early the next morning for the airport. Taryn and I are so thankful for the experience. I was really proud of the way our kids represented their country. I hope to be able to go back again and take more kids from this area with me. They really need to see and understand how blessed we are here in America and the reality and living conditions in the rest of the world. Taryn and I would like to thank you again for all of your love, support and prayers.

Missouri Man killed in One Vehicle Rollover in Callahan County

One person died in a one vehicle crash, Saturday, April 13, 2013 in Callahan County. The crash occurred at 9:00 P.M. on County Road 100, east of County Road 105. This crash is in the northwest corner of Callahan County, south of Texas Highway 351. The posted speed limit for this road is 35 mph. Gregory Russell Cope, 55 years of age from Mt. Vernon, MO., was driving a 2001 Chevrolet Suburban westbound on County Road 100. The driver failed to negotiate a curve, causing the vehicle to leave the roadway, travel through a ditch, striking a fence and overturn. The driver was not wearing a seat belt and was ejected. Gregory Russell Cope was pronounced dead at the scene at 10:00 P.M. by Judge Roy Chapman. The body was taken to Abilene Professional Services. The crash is being investigated by Trooper William Smith.

Baird woman killed in vehicle accident Wednesday on FM 2228

ABILENE — One person was killed and two were injured in a two vehicle crash occurring at 1:18 P.M. Wednesday, April 10th in Callahan County. The crash was located on Farm Road 2228, about ten miles south of Interstate 20. Joshua David Hernandez, 23 years of age from Rising Star, Texas was driving a 2007 Toyota southbound on Farm Road 2228. Freddy Lee Thomas, 40 years of age from Baird, Texas was driving a 1967 Chevrolet Camaro northbound on Farm road 2228. The Hernandez' Toyota drifted into the northbound lane. The Thomas' Chevrolet took evasive action, entering the southbound lane. Hernandez re-entered the southbound lane and the vehicles hit head-on. Amber Michelle Thomas, 40 years of age from Baird, Texas

was a passenger in the 1967 Chevrolet Camaro. She was pronounced dead at the scene at 2:37 P.M., by Judge Taylor. The body was taken to Abilene Professional Services. The seat belt was not worn. Freddy Lee Thomas, Jr., 40 years of age from Baird, Texas was the driver of the 1967 Chevrolet Camaro. He was taken to Hendrick Medical Center in Abilene, Texas with internal injuries. The seat belt was not worn. Joshua David Hernandez, 23 years of age from Rising Star, Texas was the driver of the 2007 Toyota. He was taken to Hendrick Medical Center in Abilene, Texas with back injuries. The seat belt was worn. The weather was clear and the roadway was dry. Trooper Lance Parker is investigating the crash.

Editor's Note: Amber Thomas will be remembered as the former Director of the Cross Plains Senior Citizens Center. She was instrumental in the transformation of the center for preparing meals on site. The seniors loved Amber

The top four finishers in each event will advance to the Area round which will be held in May on Thursday, April 18, 2013.


The Buffs and Lady Buffs competed very well and brought home team titles in all three divisions.

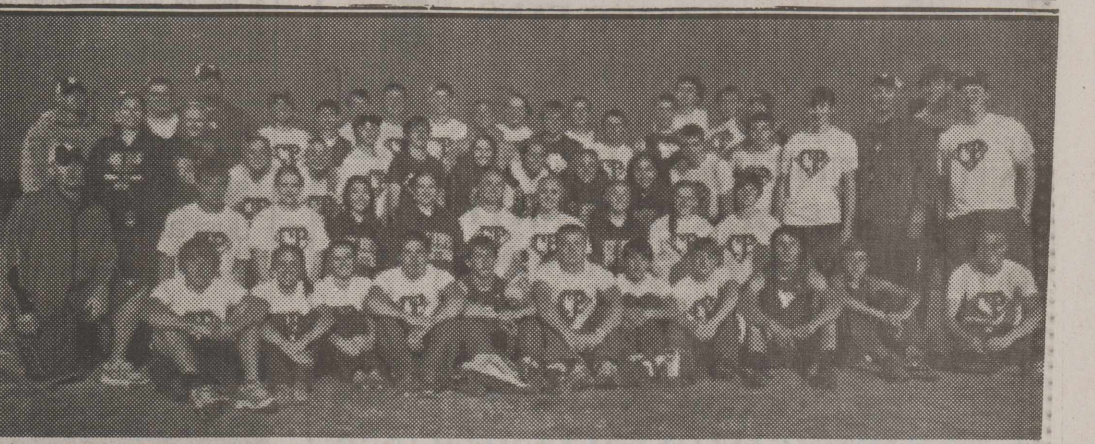

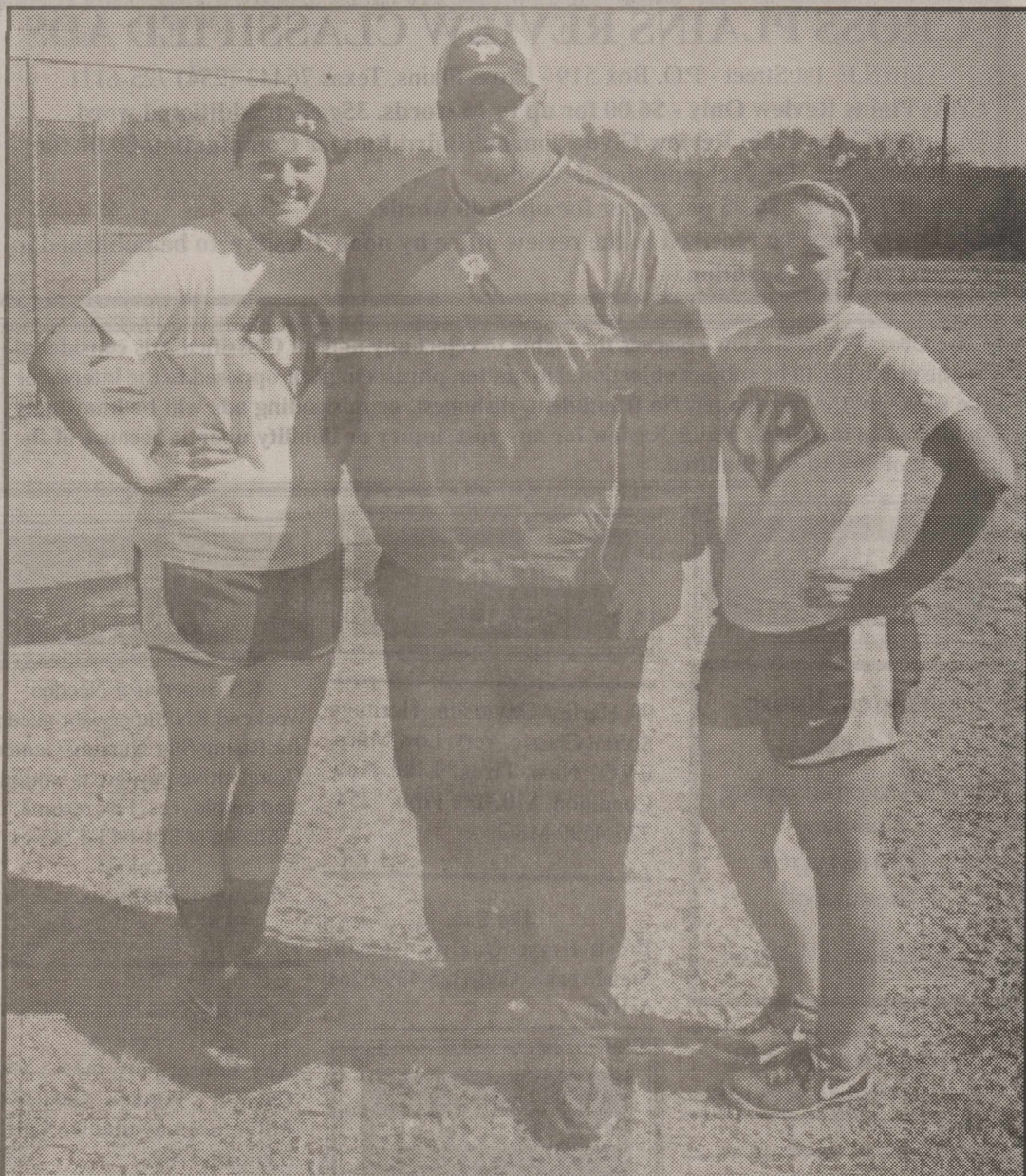

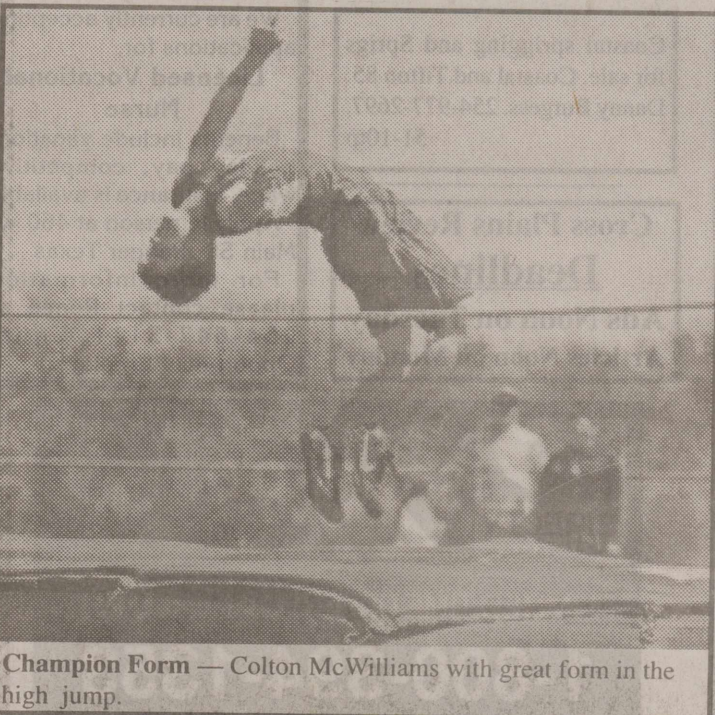

Extension Agent's quarterly report includes report on Hog Out Program

Callahan County Extension Agent Jerry Warren presented the Extension Agent's quarterly report on the activities of the County Extension Office during the Callahan County Commissioners' Court regular monthly meeting held Thursday, April 4th at the County Courthouse in Baird.

The report included information on the 4-H and Youth, Agriculture and Natural Resources, and on the Hog Out Program in Callahan County.

On a motion by Commissioner Harold Hicks and a second from Commissioner Cliff Kirkham, the commissioners' court voted 5-0 to approve the report and to commend Mr. Warren on the job he and his administrator Rose Barcomb are doing.

The Extension Agent's quarterly impact report for April 2013 follows:

Agriculture Natural Resources

The County Extension office held a multi-county Forage Conference in Cross Plains on February 7th. Participating counties included Callahan, Brown, Eastland and Coleman. The Seminar focused on Soil, Water & Hay Testing, Forage Insect, Grasshopper Control, Winter Weed Management, Wheat Variety test, Forage Management & Labeling, Brush Control, Herbicide test & Labeling. Approximately 110 producers attended and received 5 CEU's.

4-H and Youth Development
In the months of January, February, & March Callahan County 4-H members participated in the Veterinary Science project. 4-H Members met once per month at the Callahan County Vet Clinic

with the help of Dr. Monty Ancinac. The 4-H vet science project is to teach 4-H members about animal health and behavior, and how modern veterinary practices increase animals, health, comfort, recreation and livestock values.

In the months of January, February, & March, Callahan County 4-H members who were involved in the animal projects competed at Major Livestock Shows throughout the state.

On January 12th Callahan County 4-H members who were involved in the animal projects competed at their local Livestock Shows.

On January 17th—January 19th Callahan County 4-H members who were involved in the animal projects competed at the Callahan County Jr. Livestock Show.

On January 26th the Callahan County 4-H Shooting Sports Program held their annual Shooting Sports orientation.

On February 26th Callahan County 4-H Members participated in the Photography Project kickoff meeting. The Photography project develops life skills in composition, light, story line, posing, awareness and encourages 4-H members to use photography as a meaningful communication tool in their lives.

On March 16th the Callahan County 4-H Horse Club held a horse clinic. Topics covered at the clinic were explanation of Horse show rules and show requirements, Basic horsemanship and they practiced show events.

On March 27th and March 29th Callahan County 4-H Members participated in the County Photography contest and the Best

of Show contest. The top 3 places advanced to the District 7 4-H Photography Contest.

February 21, 2013
Dear Judge Corn:

Thank you for your leadership in helping in the Texas Department of Agriculture's (TDA) effort to eradicate feral hogs. Because of your commitment and hard work, Callahan County will receive a grant in the amount of \$10,000 for having the third highest cumulative score among all participating counties during the 2013 Hog Out County Challenge.

Each year in Texas, destructive feral hogs cause an estimated \$500 million in property damage. Thanks to your efforts during the three-month 2013 Hog Out County Challenge, we were able to raise awareness of this costly problem while decreasing the wild hog population in the Lone Star State.

I appreciate your participation in this effort and congratulate Callahan County for this well-deserved grant. These funds can be used to further feral hog abatement and abatement outreach in your county. Coach Greenway is recognized as an expert black powder and pistol competitor and Callahan County kids are lucky to have him as a coach.

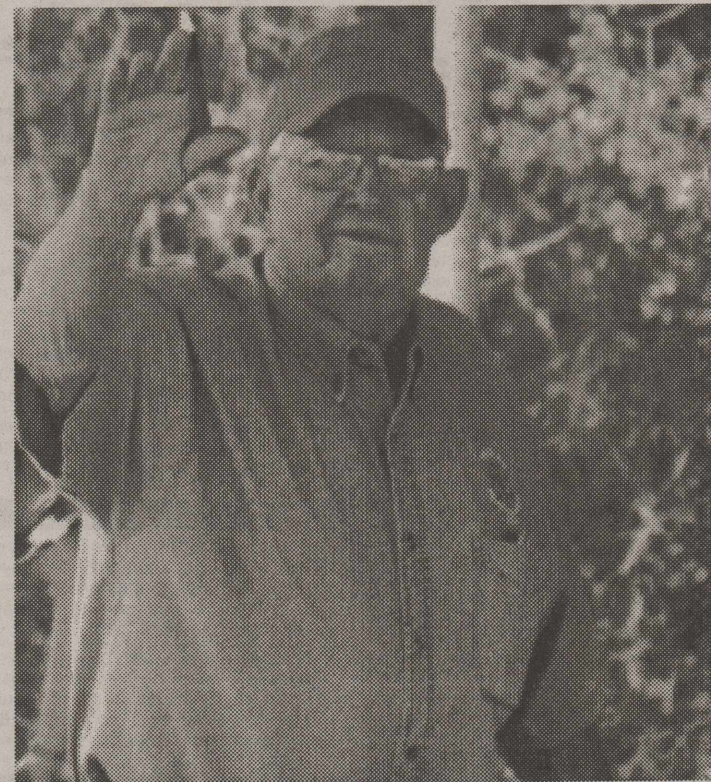
