





Texas lake and river swimmers reminded of potential health risks

WACO, Texas (June 4, 2012) - With summer starting to heat up, people across the Brazos River basin are heading to nearby rivers and lakes. However, the conditions that make the water temperature so delightful can also encourage the growth of a rare but dangerous microorgan-

The Brazos River Authority encourages visitors to enjoy the water, while being aware of health risks associated with swimming in or around stagnant or slow-moving water.

Primary amebic meningoencephalitis (PAM), which is most common during the summer, is a rare disease caused by naegleria fowleri, an amoeba found in almost all untreated, fresh surface water and in soil. The amoeba thrives in low levels of fresh water that is warmer than 80 degrees and stagnant or slow-moving. The PAM infection occurs when water containing the organism is forced into the nasal passages - usually from diving or jumping into water or from water skiing. The amoeba makes its way into the brain and spinal cord, destroy-

ing brain tissue. Symptoms of the almost always fatal infection include severe headache, high fever, stiff neck, nausea, vomiting, seizures and hallucinations as the condi-

rare - affecting about one to three people a year in Texas those infected usually succumb to the disease within a week.

There were 10 known cases of PAM in Texas between 2000 and 2010, according to state health officials. No cases have been diagnosed in Texas since the beginning of 2011. Worldwide, only a few hundred cases havè been reported over the last 30 years.

To prevent infection, it is recommended that those taking part in warm, fresh water-related activities use nose clips or hold their noses shut while jumping into water. With the amoeba often found in soil, it is best to avoid stirring up underwater sediment. The Texas Department of State Health Services recommends that people avoid stagnant or polluted water and take "No Swimming" signs seriously.

While the BRA tests for a variety of contaminants, such as E. coli at more than 100 sites, no testing is conducted for the PAM microbe.

PAM cannot be spread person to person nor by drinking water. Swimming pools and hot tubs that are properly cleaned, maintained and chlorinated are generally safe, as is salt water.

Traffic alert for June 18th on I-20 at the US 84 overpass

NOLAN COUNTY - Both main lanes of westbound I-20 at the US 84 overpass in Nolan County are scheduled for a one-day closure Tuesday, June 18th for ongoing work to replace the bridge that was damaged after a collision in September 2012.

Westbound I-20 will be closed early that morning to allow crews to place beams on the new structure. All interstate lanes are expected to be open by June 19th.

Traffic will be detoured to US 84 Business and routed around the overpass before being directed back to westbound I-20. Signs, cones and message boards will be in place to direct drivers.

TxDOT begins project to replace bridge east of Abilene

New structure at Rainy Creek will be wider

Abilene - The Texas Department of Transportation is set to begin a project next week to replace the bridge at Rainy Creek on I-20 Business (East Highway 80) just east of Loop 322.

Crews plan to begin work Monday to replace the fourlane structure with a new bridge featuring four wider lanes with shoulders and sidewalks. The project is expected to be completed by late spring 2014. The new bridge will be built to accommodate future improvements to the adjoining

highway, such as sidewalks or widening.

Work will take place on two lanes of the bridge at a time. Traffic will be routed through one lane in each direction. During construction, oversize loads will be limited to 8 feet, 6 inches. Drivers are urged to use extreme caution in the work zone and to remain alert for workers and equipment in the

Reece Construction Co., Inc. of Prosper, Texas was contracted to complete the work for \$2.4 million.

West Central Texas Council of Governments (WCTCOG) is proud to announce the continuance of the Safe Room/Storm Shelter Rebate Program

Last year, the WCTCOG submitted applications for Safe Room/Storm Shelter Rebate program funding to the Governor's Division of Emergency Management (GDEM). GDEM is responsible for administering the program in Texas but the funding actually originates with the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA). The Safe Room/Storm Shelter program is one of the grants available under FEMA's family of Mitigation Grant Programs.

WCTCOG has grant monies available for the Safe Room/ Storm Shelter Program will provide funding to singlefamily home owners to cover one-half the cost of installing tornado shelters/safe rooms in new or existing homes up to a maximum rebate amount of \$3,000 per unit installed. Other requirements are that each installed unit has been certified as meeting the standards set for tornado shelters by the American Tornado Shelter Association (ATSA) or National Storm Shelter Association (NSSA) before the rebate can be paid.

The WCTCOG has received enough funding to support the cost of installing approximately 100 shelters in homes throughout the 19-county region. These units are intended for homes within the West Central Texas region.




