New Season Hunting, Fishing Licenses Go On Sale Aug. 15th

AUSTIN—Current year Texas hunting and fishing licenses (except year-to-date fishing licenses) expire Aug. 31st, and new licenses for 2010-2011 will go on sale Sunday, Aug. 15th.

The Texas Parks and Wildlife Department issues about 2.1 million hunting and fishing licenses annually through the agency's 28 field offices, more than 65 state parks and at over 1,500 retailers across Texas. For a \$5 administrative transaction fee, licenses may also be purchased online through the TPWD Web site or by phone (800-895-4248). Call center hours are 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. Monday - Friday. The online transaction system is available 24/7. A license confirmation number is issued at the time of purchase for online and phone orders, and the physical license is mailed separately. Confirmation numbers will verify that a license has been purchased, which is sufficient for dove hunting, but will not allow hunters to take fish or wildlife that require a tag.

Dove Hunting Requirements In addition to a hunting license, all wing shooters will need to purchase a game bird stamp. To hunt doves or teal in September, a Migratory Game Bird Stamp (\$7) is required. Duck hunters also need to purchase a Federal Duck Stamp and receive HIP (Harvest Information Program) certification. HIP certification involves a brief survey of previous year's hunting success and is conducted at the time licenses are purchased. Certification will be printed on the license. Lifetime license holders must also be HIP-certified and purchase the Federal Duck Stamp to hunt migratory birds. All other state stamp endorsements are included with a lifetime license.

There are other mandatory endorsements to consider at the time of purchase, too. An Upland Game Bird Stamp (\$7) is required to hunt all nonmigratory game birds, including turkey, quail, pheasant, chachalaca and lesser prairie chicken.

Of course, anyone who purchases the Super Combo license package, the best bang for the buck at \$68, automatically gets these needed stamps. Sportsmen ages 65 and older qualify for a discounted Senior Super Combo for \$32.

Lifetime License Drawing Hunters and anglers can also take care of their licensing requirements for life with the purchase of an \$1,800 Lifetime Super Combo, or you can enter for a chance at winning a lifetime license through a special drawing. Entries for the Lifetime License Drawing cost \$5 each and may be purchased wherever licenses are sold. There is no limit on the number of entries that may be purchased. Winners will be drawn on Dec. 30, 2010 and June 30, 2011. If you enter by Dec. 27, 2010, you will be eligible for both drawings.

Mandatory Hunter **Education Certification**

Education Hunter Certification is also required of any hunter born on or after Sept. 2, 1971 and who is at least 17 years old. For hunters who are unable to work in a hunter education course before hunting season for whatever reason, TPWD does offer a deferral option that allows people 17 years of age or older a one-time only extension to complete the state's hunter education requirements. The individual must first purchase a hunting license and then may purchase the deferral option #166.

someone 17 years old or older also licensed to hunt in Texas. The accompanying individual must have completed hunter education or be exempt from the requirements (born before Sept. 2, 1971). The extension is good for one license year, by which time the person with the deferred option needs to complete a hunter education

course. This option is not available to those who have ever received a conviction or deferred adjudication for lack of hunter education certification. They still must take the course before going afield.

The Big Time Texas Hunts program offers the opportunity to win one or more premium guided hunts with food and lodging provided, as well as taxidermy in some cases. The crown jewel of the program is the Texas Grand Slam hunt package, which includes four separate hunts for Texas' most prized big game animals the desert bighorn sheep, white-tailed deer, mule deer and pronghorn antelope. There are several quality whitetail hunt packages available, as well as opportunities to pursue alligator, exotic big game, waterfowl and upland game

Entries for the Big Time Texas Hunt drawings are \$10 each and are available wherever hunting licenses are sold. They may also be purchased online at a discounted price of \$9 each. 

Were you stop Lossed??? The 2009 War Supplemental Appropriations established "Retroactive Stop Loss Special Pay" (RSLSP), providing \$500 for each month/partial month served in stop loss status. Service members, Veterans, and beneficiaries of service members whose service was involuntarily extended under Stop Loss BETWEEN September 11, 2001 and September 30, 2009 are eligible for RSLSP.



In certain emergency situations, the district will maintain and administer to a student nonprescription medication, but only: *In accordance with the guidelines developed with the district's medical advisor; and *When the parent has previously provided written

consent to emergency treatment on the district's form. A student with asthma or severe

allergic reaction (anaphylaxis) may be permitted to possess and use prescribed asthma or anaphylaxis medication at school or school-related events only if he or she has written authorization form his or her parent and a physician or other licensed health -care provider. The student must also demonstrate to his or her physician or health-care provider and to the campus office secretary and/or principal the ability to use the prescribed medication, including any device required to administer the medication.

If the student has been prescribed asthma or anaphylaxis medication for use during the school day, the student and parents should discuss this with the campus office secretary or principal.

State increases communication on bridge weight limits

The Texas Department of Transportation and the Department of Public Safety are working more closely to ensure that bridges in Texas

Communications between the two agencies will improve as TxDOT recently implemented a procedure to immediately notify DPS whenever there is a change to a bridge's maximum weight allowance.

Once bridge load posting signs have been installed or removed, an electronic notification is sent from TxDOT to DPS notifying them of the change.

"This new communication tool is another effort launched to improve the safety of Texas bridges," said Steve Simmons, TxDOT Deputy Executive Director. "Partnering in this effort fortifies the focus on safety by both agencies."

TxDOT engineers make recommendations to the Texas Transportation Commission to restrict the weight limits allowed on certain bridges.

If the Commission approves a recommendation, signs are posted on each side of a bridge warning drivers of the maximum weight allowed. Oftentimes, these signs are ignored and disregarded by motorists.

DPS is tasked with the enforcement of posted bridge weight restrictions through its commercial vehicle enforcement operations.

This new procedure makes DPS immediately aware of changes in the maximum weight allowed on loadrestricted bridges and improves compliance monitoring by DPS troopers.

Drivers ignoring signs endanger themselves, other motorists and infrastructure and will be subject to the Brigades, two Bobwhite appropriate enforcement action.








Conserving Texas Natural Resources Training Course set to begin August 26th

If you are interested in native provides a background in plants, rain water harvesting, native birds, animals, insects, lizards, weather and a host of other topics about the natural resources and environment unique to Texas, then the Conserving Texas Natural Resources program is for you. The training program begins on August 26th and then runs on Monday evenings and some Saturdays through November

August 12th is the deadline to register for the 2010 Conserving Texas Natural Resources program, sponsored by the Big Country Master Naturalist Chapter. The mission of Big Country Master Naturalist Chapter is to develop a corps of wellinformed volunteers to provide education, outreach, and service dedicated to the beneficial management of natural resources and natural areas within the Big Country. The fee for the class is \$90.00 per person and includes resource books and material. Student scholarships are available. The class is limited to 40, so please call the Taylor County Extension office at 672-6048 for registration information.

The Conserving Texas Natural Resources training is based upon Texas Master Naturalists state guidelines and has been developed to fit our area of the state. Teachers, ag producers, conservationists and people just interested in our natural environment, have taken the course.

Topics will include geology, hydrology, meteorology, and entomology. The class also
