Shelly, was trained by her husband, Josh, who is a professional horse trainer. Amy never had a chance not to learn to ride. Her father is a former PRCA Champion Bronc Rider, and now a ranch manager. Her grandfather is the world famous Hall of Fame Cutting Horse Trainer, "Buster Welch." Riding was as natural to her as walking. Amy started riding horses as a very young girl. She began competing in Virginia where her dad was the ranch manager for Helen Groves, a descendant of the famous King Ranch of South Texas. Mrs. Groves wanted to relocate, so Amy's dad, Ken Welch, came to Texas looking for a ranch. He found a ranch south of Baird, which they now call Silverbrook Ranch. Amy, her two sisters, mom and dad all moved back to Texas in

Amy's riding has gained her great accolades in the cutting horse circles throughout the United States, but her greatest achievement, besides raising her two beautiful daughters, was being inducted into the National Cutting Horse Association Hall of Fame, December 14, 2008. 



Individuality vs. Meaningful Fulfillment

Rugged individuality is often an admired trait and associated with strength and mental health. While it makes a good story line in a western novel or movie, in reality it is an enemy of both strength and mental health. There is a core to our personal life which craves to be loved and to love. Every emotional problem of human beings can be traced to our core existence. When husbands and wives, for whatever reason from their past, can not freely love and receive love, they usually deprive their children of this basic necessity.

The most wonderful revelation is that God is love. He does not try to love us; love is His very nature. Adults choose to accept God by faith, and are healed at their core, because Love IS their greatest need. Children either see God in us and connect with Him or they remain disconnected. 




