



Deputy Rick Jowers is weighing a small package of methamphetamines on a set of Sheriff's Department Scales. He had just made an arrest in the Cross Plains area. Also in the picture is a small package of hypodermic needles.

Chief Deputy Jowers had to wrestle the suspect to the ground and handcuff him because he was resisting

It is believed that just before the arrest he had used a needle and injected meth into his bloodstream.

This would explains his negative reactions and hostility and not acting in a normal manner. He was given suicide prevention jail clothes to wear, placed in the maximum security cell, and put him on suicide watch, which means being closely monitored by the iailer/dispatcher and checked on his cell every 30 miniutes.

This subject had a history of drug abuse and had been in our jail before. Using meth causes people to do bad things. Meth is bad for one's health; it will shorten a persons' life and will



As the name implies, the Trans-Pecos Copperhead (Agkistrodon contortrix pictigaster) is the most western-dwelling race of the three varieties of copperheads that reside in Texas. It can be observed in eight of the southwestern Texas counties including Val Verde, Crockett, Upton, Pecos, Terrell, Jeff Davis, Brewster, and Presidio. It is in these counties that this western race is found primarily in wooded canyons and moist spring areas of the higher elevation mountains, although it also occurs in high population densities along the mesas and dry arroyos of the Stockton plateau.

She could not attend the University of Texas, her first choice, because segregation was still in effect. However, she went to Texas Southern University political science on her way to becoming a lawyer. She became a champion debater, easily beating contenders from the most prestigious universities in the nation. After graduating with high honors in 1956, she entered Boston University School of Law, gaining a law degree by 1959.

After serving as a professor of political science for a year at Tuskegee Institute in Alabama, Jordan returned to Houston to practice law. She dove into politics, but lost two races to the state legislature in the early 1960s. In 1966, she was elected to the State Senate, the first black woman to receive such an honor in Texas. She was widely respected by her colleagues and rose to the position of president

In 1972, she was elected to Congress, again the first black woman ever elected from Texas. She sponsored or co-sponsored hundreds of laws during her six years in Congress.

Jordan was given a place on the House Judiciary Committee, and the committee undertook the grave task of considering impeachment for President Richard Nixon for his activities during the Watergate scandal. Jordan quickly became a leader in the debate. In one famous speech in 1974, in a steady, careful voice, Jordan expressed her belief in
