As I have stated many times in past columns, my primary focus on selecting topics to write about are based upon a variety of factors including experience, relevance and requests. The overall winner will receive a Tablet with 2nd and 3rd place to receive gift cards.







Our members are very excited to continue this tradition and hope that we have a large crowd to enjoy the Christmas season with us. Merry Christmas, one and all!






