sights, Texas offers myriad sights, sounds, and scenes. But in Austin that might interest you -- especially if you are wildlife oriented or have dreamed of going on an African hunting or photo safari. $\qquad$ museum. The specimens have been collected by a sportsmanconservationist and turned into a showplace venue where
viewers can see them in as close to their native habitat as is possible on this continent. Most of the critters are from Africa;
some are from other continents. There are at least 950 specimens. The taxidermy is life-like and life size - all full body mounts.
