BRISCOE COUNTY

B RISCOE COUNTY is situated in the southern part of the Panhandle of Texas. Located as it is, partly on the Plains and partly in the "brakes," makes it one of the most, if not the most desirable counties in the state in which to get a home.

Schools.

Silverton, the county seat, is located on the Plains near the center of the county and is a thriving town of about 600 inhabitants. It has a good graded school, employing four teachers and has an enrollment of 215 pupils.

There are 8 other schools in the county. All these schools run from 6 to 10 months each year.

Churches.

There are five church organizations here, namely: Methodist, Missionary Baptist, Cumberland Presbyterian, Christian, and Primitive Baptist, the three first named have commodious church buildings.

Lodges.

I O O F, A F & A M, O E S and W O W lodges all have live organizations here.

Taxes, etc.

Our county is out of debt—never has been in debt—and has a handsome balance in the treasury. Our jail is empty. Crime is almost unknown. Taxes are at a minimum. Our people compare favorably with older communities in education and refinement.

Health.

The even temperature, altitude, pure air and an abundance of pure, freestone water makes this one of the healthiest spots in the United States. Vital statistics bear us out in this statement.

Soil.

The soil on the Plains is a deep chocolate loam and is delightful to cultivate. There is sufficient sand in the soil to make farming a delight, but not enough to cause the land to blow. Practically every foot

of plains land is tillable with the exception of the lakes or basins.

Water.

On the plains, an almost unlimited amount of the very best water can had at a depth of from 60 to 100 feet. This water is brought to the surface by numerous windmills. Some of the water in the brakes contains gypsum and

other minerals in solution, but this water is excellent for all kinds of stock.

Crops.

All crops usually grown in the temperate zone, do fairly well here. Corn, cotton, oats, wheat, millet, sorghum, kaffir corn, milo maize; alfalfa, red clover, timothy; potatoes, cabbage, turnips, in fact anything in the way garden vegetables;

grapes, apples, plums and cherries all do well. The above crops are successfully raised in this county.

Lands.

The South Plains embraces the largest body of good land in the United States. About half of this land is state school land owned by the actual settler, the other half is patented. Lands are worth from \$2 to \$10 an acre, owing to location and improvements. 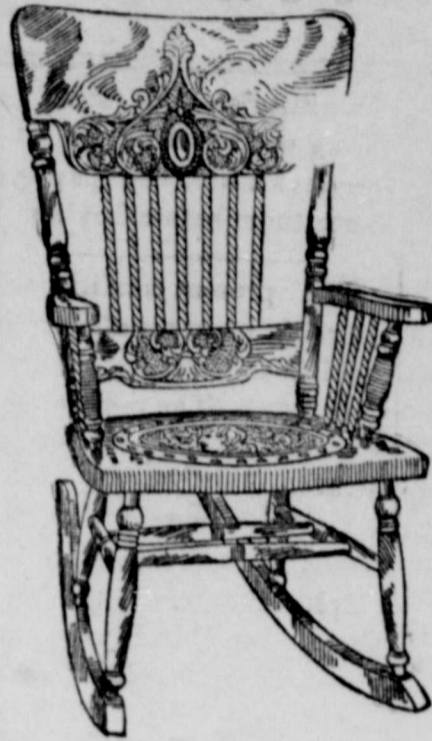

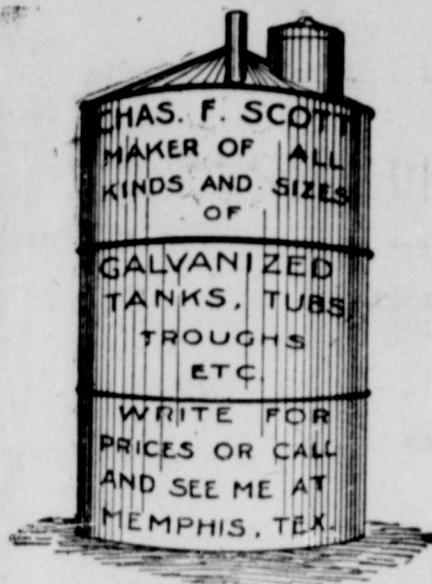
