THE PICNIC.

The picnic and railroad rally on last Saturday was a decided success. The people began to gather early and by the time that was set for the exercises to begin there were many more than could be assembled on all the ground floor of the public school building.

The speaking was enthusiastic, and the interest with which it was received by those present proved their willingness to lend a helping hand.

Messrs Jim Long and Morrow and Miss Berchie Jones furnished music for the occasion.

At the close of the speaking in a very short time, more than one hundred town lots were added to the bonus.

After all had enjoyed a bountiful dinner, the committee met Maj. Gordon in business session and submitted the bonus to him which he agrees to accept as soon as the list of town lots that are subscribed by the citizens aggregate 200. We are still some 50 or 60 lots short of that number, and we do not doubt but they will be subscribed within two weeks or at most in a very short time. Since this has been made known some who have lots have come to the committee and subscribed one fourth of their unimproved lots. If those who hold lots in the town desire the road this is what each one of them should do, and is what they will have to do if they get it. It will just take 200 lots in addition to the \$50,000 and other land bonuses which are up, to put a surveyor in the field and there are about 150 of them up. It is now up to those who have the lots, to come to the help of the proposition and finish it up, or stand back and defeat it. This, no man who has any holdings here can afford to do, considering it from a financial stand point.

COTTON GIN for SILVERTON.

That a cotton gin will be built in Silverton in time to gin the present crop is no longer speculation. The Gin Committee are in receipt of the contract already signed, and Mr. Geo. Seaman, who proposes to erect the gin, has given bond in the sum of \$1200 to insure a compliance with his part of the contract.

Mr. Seaman has written that he has purchased the machinery to erect a Model outfit and will be on the ground with the

machinery ready to install it as soon as a building can be erected. He will also operate a corn mill in connection with the gin.

The people should and no doubt will show their appreciation of the enterprise by lending it every encouragement that they can; and especially the farmers who are in reach of it should show their appreciation by their patronage. Make no other arrangements than to have your cotton ginned in Silverton this year.

A CITY PARK.

Every town or community that has gatherings for social pleasure and recreation needs a place of public entertainment. The cheapest and most comfortable place that can be provided for an occasions of this kind is a public park. The Enterprise has taken occasion to call the attention of the citizens and business men of Silverton to this much needed comfort and convenience in the town, and the embarrassing deficiency that is felt every time a public gathering is had. On last Saturday at the picnic this need was emphasized when the good ladies of the town and country had to spread such a nicely and carefully prepared dinner out on the grass under the burning rays of the noon hour sun.

They did their part nobly and fed the people bountifully; but what did we do for their comfort and enjoyment while being fed?

The Enterprise is now making a motion that the Commercial Club be called together at once by the chairman and that a committee of three be appointed to solicit funds to purchase a plot of ground and have it fenced and planted in trees as soon as practicable. Do we hear a second to the motion.

Briscoe county was visited by another fine rain Tuesday accompanied by a stiff breeze from the south. A few sheds and out houses were toppled over, no other damage was done.

Briscoe's small grain crop is still promising a bountiful yield.

HUMBUGS.

Just why the human anatomy and psychology is so constructed as to delight in being humbugged is a profound mystery to us, but such is the fact. The moments of men's most sanguine hopes of great achievements are under the hallucinations of some cheap John faker, or when listening to the deceptive prattle of some human shark, who says pert things to tickle their ears while he filches from their pockets the hard-earning of many days toil.

If you wish to see the people collect and come up in herds to be humbugged, just let a street faker come to town with some gilded brass trinkets, some chipped up and carefully wrapped Lenox soap, some cheap articles of dry goods that he has swiped from some Jew's 5 cent counter, a few vials of cure-alls; and while he vending his wares, crack a few jokes that would be appreciated in a camp of ruffians, and the price of jewelry will not be thought high at from 50 cts to \$2.50 a piece; medicated soap that will actually make a lather if you wet it, is cheap at 25 cts for a block as large

as a domino, and such bargains in dry goods that you can't afford to let them pass, so you will pay whatever price is asked and wonder how he can sell them at such bargains; and such a rush is made after the barrels that the crowd actually trample on each other to get to pay 25cts for a little bottle of chalk water. This condition of affairs does not often prevail on the streets of Silverton, but it did last Saturday. We were not surprised to see the youths and children collected about the wagon, but we were surprised when we saw gray headed men, men who hold prominent positions in the county and men who wear their piety on the outside of their clothes on Sunday, and who ought to have been soberly interested in the program of the day and lending assistance and counsel in fostering the enterprise for which the day was set apart, were instead hanging around and smiling blandly or splitting their sides with hilarity at the unseemly wit of a humbug who had no other motive than to extort from the people their loose change without giving them value received. Instead of it being encouraged by their presence, and for what we know their patronage, it should have been condemned as a public nuisance and an intrusion on the occasion, and refused recognition in the town.

If this sounds harsh to sensitive ears when spoken of, think how much worse it looked when it was being performed. If you will quit practicing it I will quit telling it on you.

Dear to my heart is the scenes of my childhood, when fond recollections presents them to view. The grindstone I turned for my father to grind his axe—and he threw all his weight on it too. The strength of a farm boy has no limitations; at least that's the way they impressed it on me; so when I turn back to the days of my boyhood, my father, his axe and that grindstone I see.

WILL MAKE 40 BUSHELS.

Star Ranch Wheat Field Promises Big Yield of Wheat This Year.

J. P. Hammett of Huntsville, Missouri, who has been in Hereford for a few days and who owns a few sections of Castro and Lamb county land, took a day off this week and went down to look over his holdings, passing the Star Ranch on his way. He and his friend, C. P. Summers, a Missouri farmer, but now living in Kansas inspected the 200 acre wheat field on the Star Ranch, as they have become very much interested in the wonderful reports of the enormous yields of this cereal on the Plains of Texas. Mr. Summers being a wheat raiser of many years and Mr. Hammett both alighted from their machines and waded out into the waving grain. A careful examination on the part of both of these men created both wonder and amazement; wonder because of the heavy stand and the long well-filled heads; amazement because of the small amount of straw, the wheat standing but little more than 30 inches high. Both of these gentlemen after making a careful examination of part of the field estimate that the yield will not fall short of 40 bushels per acre. The reporter for The Brand has made a note of this estimate

and will give the actual figures at threshing, if no unseen calamity befalls the crop before the harvest. In speaking of this crop as well as the growing of wheat on the Plains in general, these men and others in the presence of the Brand man said: We notice that the soil of the Plains does not grow a high and heavy stalk, but that whenever a head is produced at all, there will be found fully developed grains. This they say is in the nature of the soil and a wise provision of nature, providing a larger percent of grain food than fibre for the stalk. They consider that the Plains are destined to become the greatest wheat country in the world. The large percent of tillable land, the ease of cultivation, the freedom from pests and plant diseases and the certainty of a crop will induce thousands of successful farmers in other sections of the country to open up large wheat and grain farms.—Hereford Brand.

WHAT THE CANDIDATE MUST DO.

County candidates must notify the chairman of the county executive committee, in which they are candidates, in writing before the 14th day of June of their desire to have their names placed on the ticket of the party. This law has the effect of cutting out all candidates for county offices after the date named, and

no candidate can get his name on the official ballot after that date. If there are others in Runnels County who intend to cast their fortunes before the primary for office they will necessarily have to act promptly.—Runnels County Ledger.
