

New equipment at Three Way helps students learn high technology first hand

With the help of new equipment the school recently received, students at Three Way Schools are learning about high technology using computers.

After researching fiber optics, students borrowed equipment from the Region 7 Service Center in Lubbock and put together a presentation similar to those made by a movie projection, using computers. They used this technology to put together a visual show when Texas Speaker of the House Pete Laney visited their school last year.

This was done by students storing photographs and information into a computer through a liquid crystal display (LCD) and with a scanner.

The images were stored in the computer and when displayed on the computer screen, projected very large on a wall of screen without losing any quality or details.

Three Way technology teacher Mary Ferguson said that Hubert Kidd, manager of Five Area Telephone Cooperative in Muleshoe saw their presentation and liked it. He said he wanted them to do one

for Five Area for its annual meeting and Five Area purchased the LCD and scanner the school needed to do it.

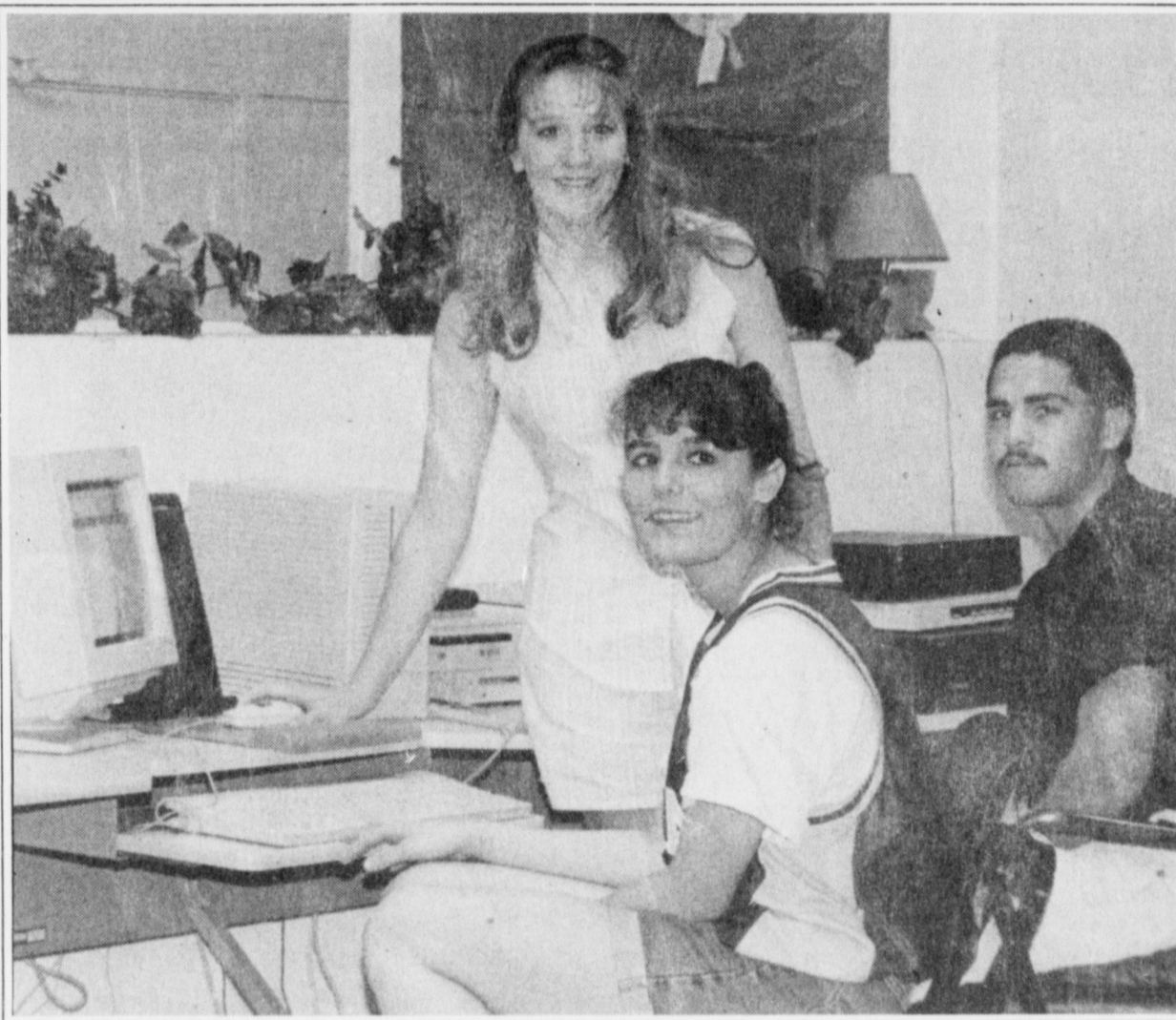
Three Way school students Octavio Perez, Jessica Hood and Melanie McCaul, along with the supervision of Ferguson, took on the task which required them to spend a lot of long hours at the school. But it also allowed them to put their knowledge to work and expand their knowledge in the area of computers and technology.

The students put together a show for Five Area's annual meeting in February, showing photos of the history of Five Area and its employees. The show was also presented along with music.

Kidd said, "Three Way is a good little school and they did a good job. Five Area has been working with them on their computer network and we paid for the cost of this equipment for them."

Kidd said Three Way schools also received donations from other sources.

The Five Area presentation made by the Three Way students was such a success, that

Ferguson said that these students have gone through material and photos all the way back to 1945 to put together the show on the history of the Three Way School.

County approves funding for women's services

The Bailey County Commissioner's Court approved a \$500 fund request by the Women's Protective Services (WPS) office of Lubbock on Monday in order that the office may continue to provide needed services in the Muleshoe area.

During a meeting of the commissioner's court, Cheryl Cates, a representative of the Lubbock WPS office explained that the \$500 would be used to allow the office to continue coming to Muleshoe

once a week to provide services for battered women and children. Cates said that a local hotel also assists in housing victims when necessary. WPS representatives have a caseworker who visits Muleshoe Area Medical Center hospital once a week.

Cates said that it costs WPS more than \$500 to provide services to Muleshoe but the funding will at least help with mileage. WPS is among one of several organizations that

has seen its funds cut by the state over the past few years. They also receive funding from the United Way of Lubbock and other organizations.

Bailey County Judge Marilyn Cox expressed support for WPS saying, "This is the only service we have here in Muleshoe to help battered women and children. We see a lot here and I do appreciate this program."

WPS provides services to 12 counties and is asking the coun-

ties it services to help with funding due to a decrease in their budget. Funding requests are based on the population of the city and number of people it provides services to in an area.

Cates said the \$500 funding from the county will also be used to help provide legal assistance to those in need as well as food and clothing when needed.

Cates said that WPS served 15 clients in Muleshoe last year. But she stated, "The Muleshoe Police Department and Sheriff's Department responded to 50

calls last year (of domestic violence), so we are not serving all of the people that we could be."

She said services may also be provided to battered men but they seldom see instances in which such victims come forward.

Bailey County Commissioner Bennie Clauch asked if WPS is working on efforts to get laws past for tougher penalties for people who commit acts of domestic violence.

Ferguson said the Three Way School computer lab currently has seven computers and they hope to expand it by next school year.

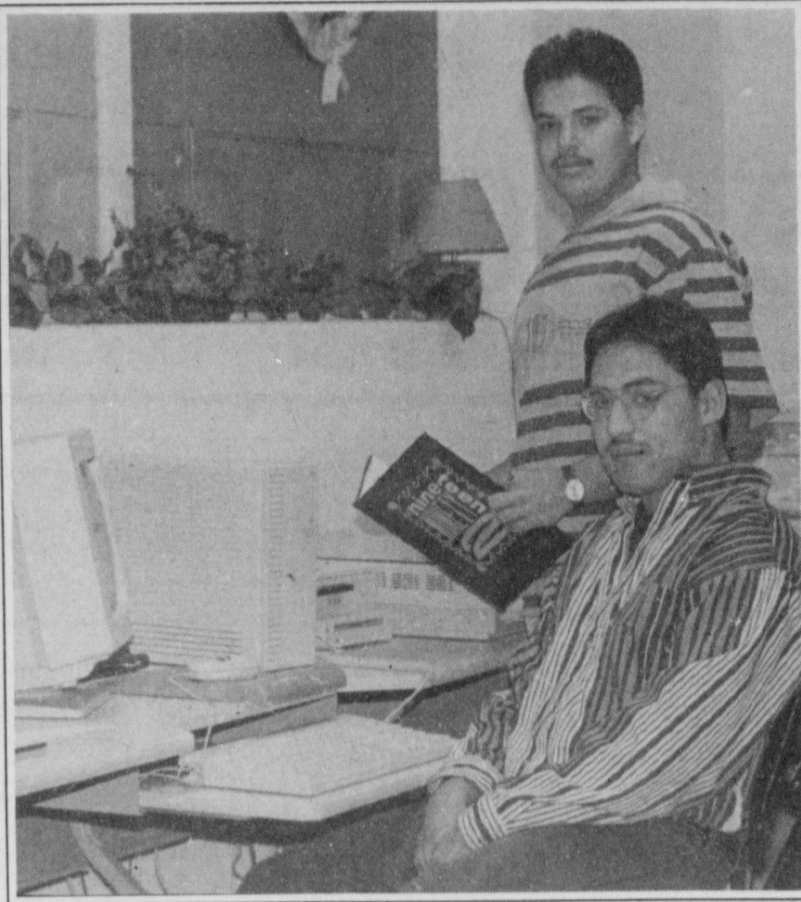
She said, "Students these days seem more at ease with computers and more adapted to them because they are using them now at an earlier age."

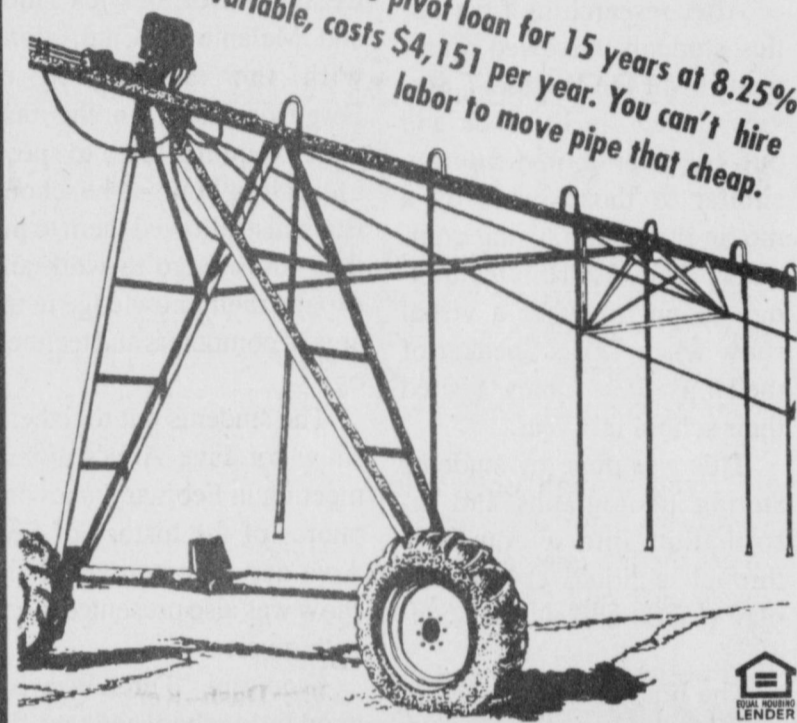

Mules take 5th at track meet with only 4 members

Imagine going to work and only a few employees show up. That is what it seemed like for the Varsity Boys Track team last Saturday in Denver City.

"Even though only four were there, they worked as hard to get the job done as anyone I've seen," said Coach Johnson.

Twelve teams attended the meet and the Mules finish 5th over all with 52 points.

Chad Johnson had his best meet of the year by placing first in both the shot put and discus. "I think Chad was a little more determined this week and I was glad to see that," said Johnson.

Charles Acosta finished 3rd in the 3200 meter run and 2nd in the 1600 meter run. "Charles looked as strong in the mile as I have ever seen him. He ran a great race and gained lots of confidence for district" said Coach Johnson.

Jesus Flores won the 800 and finished second in the 400 meter run. Going into district, Jesus has not been beaten this year in the 800. That's a big plus for him because he will be going up against the defending state champion.

Riley Byers ran the 110 High Hurdles, 100 and 200 meter dashes. He competed well in those events and represented Muleshoe both on and off the field.

The Varsity Girls Track team placed third in Denver City this past weekend. "Everyone competed very well and this is a good sign going into the district meet," said Coach Langen, head coach for the Muleshoe girls track teams.

The district meet is Thursday and Friday, April 13th and 14th in Littlefield. "The girls have a great chance of being in the running for the district title again this year," said Langen. Dimmitt and Friona will be the teams the girls will have to hold off this year in trying to defend last years championship title.

There should also be several individuals to qualify for the regional meet that will be held in Odessa. Cari Faver is currently an area leader in three different events including the 1600 and 3200 meter runs. La Tonya Payne is taking firsts in the shot put event and Jo Beth Gilleland is shaving off seconds in the 300 meter hurdles.

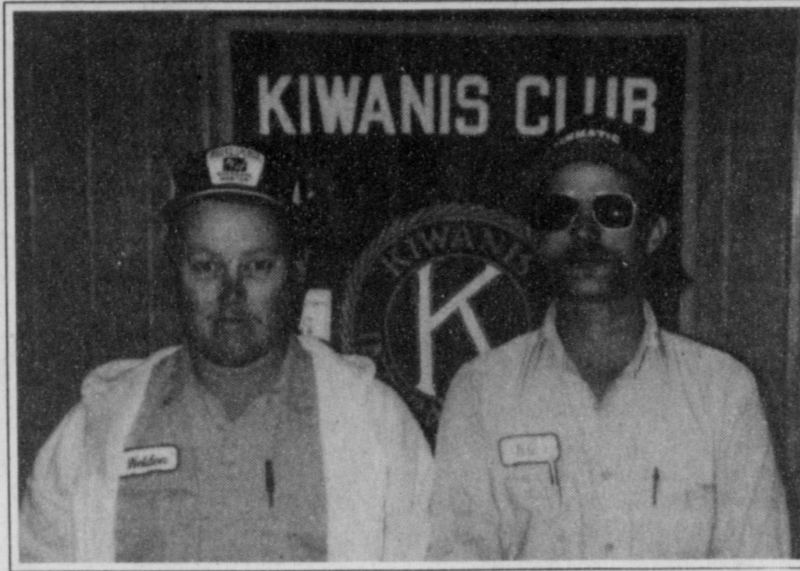
Guests recognized Friday morning included Ryan Marricle and Sonny Bennett. Bennett was installed as the Muleshoe Kiwanis Club's newest member.
