

Police Chief resigns amid allegations

Muleshoe Police Chief Julian Dominguez resigned Friday amid allegations that he assaulted his wife.

Muleshoe City Manager Dave Marr Jr. said Monday that Dominguez resigned for undisclosed personal reasons. He declined to elaborate further.

Julian Dominguez politely declined comment when contacted Monday morning.

Connie Dominguez walked into the Bailey County Sheriff's office at 2:30 a.m. Thursday and reported she had been assaulted by her husband.

The couple was estranged at the time.

Connie Dominguez, who has since filed for divorce, could not be reached for comment Monday. Her attorney, Criss Cleavinger, declined to comment on the case or the divorce citing "pending civil litigation."

Bailey County Sheriff Jerry Hicks said his department started the investigation Friday, adding that Dominguez' subsequent resignation does not affect the case.

Julian Dominguez has not been arrested and no charges have been filed against him according to Hicks.

"We're in the process of sorting out fact and fiction," Hicks said. "The investigation is just in the preliminary stages."

Hicks said that county offi-

cials have asked the Texas Rangers to take part in the investigation.

"Basically, we're just doing it to ensure objectivity," Hicks said. "In a small town, when one department investigates another, it invites the theory that something might be covered up. This way there is no question about it."

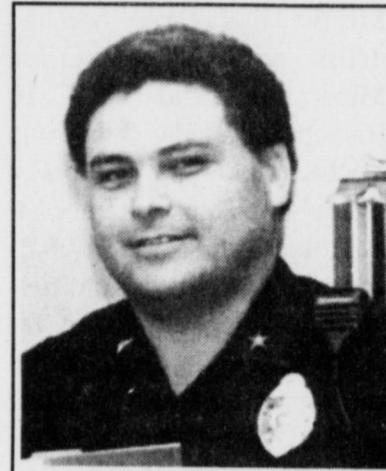
Although it's been reported that the investigation is for allegations of domestic violence concerning the police chief,

Hicks said Monday that his department is only investigating Thursday's alleged assault at this time.

"But we'll take it as far as it goes," Hicks said.

Muleshoe Police were first called to investigate an automobile accident in the Lowe's parking lot around midnight Wednesday. When the responding officer found out it involved Julian Dominguez,

While some Muleshoe citizens are celebrating Thanksgiving by eating in cafeterias and restaurants or going to the 50th Thanksgiving festival at Pep, others will be settling down to traditional family dinners.

For Terri Bohler, third-grade teacher at DeShazo Elementary School, Thanksgiving is a time for both families to get together for the traditional "dressing argument": Her family puts corn bread in their dressing; his family doesn't.

This year, she is "seriously thinking about leaving town" during the traditional family dinner and annual "food fight."

Kay Moncrief, DeShazo teaching assistant, plans to spend Thanksgiving with her sisters in San Angelo.

"It's called therapy," said Moncrief, one of five sisters. "I'm the youngest, and I don't know how to cook, so I'll get waited on—'cause I'll never grow up."

Jason Jones of Aramark food services will get to have three Thanksgiving dinners—one at his house, one at his grandmother's, and a third at his girlfriend's house in Dallas.

"I'll be clucking," he said, holding his stomach and rolling his eyes as he ate yet another Thanksgiving dinner at DeShazo Elementary School last week.

Judy Garcia and Cynthia Betz from Earth, employees at Muleshoe Area Medical Center, will celebrate Thanksgiving together, with a family of 40 in one house—the home of Aunt Mary Alvarez of Earth.

"Judy will make her famous fruit salad with apples, oranges, crushed pineapple, pecans, coconut, cherry pie filling, Eagle Brand milk—and strawberries," Betz said.

"It costs \$25 to make, and it will be gone before dinner," Garcia predicted.

The large family gathering is served in a traditional order, Betz explained: "All the men eat first, then the kids. Ladies get leftovers. That's why I always sit with the men."

Pressure 'D' lifts Lady Mules to second win

Muleshoe High School girls basketball coach Jim Gruhlkey fought the urge to slam on the brakes.

Muleshoe's full-court pressure was forcing turnover after turnover in Saturday's 47-44 win over Denver City, but Gruhlkey was concerned about the pace of the game.

Full-court pressure created an up-tempo game, which left the defensive-minded Gruhlkey in a quandary.

"We did well (on offense) early because we were aggressive," Gruhlkey said as the Lady Mules built a 26-13 lead with two minutes left in the first half. "I have to learn to let them go some as long as they stay aggressive. But I'll tighten down fast if we start getting out of control."

The second half was a different story. Muleshoe became tentative on offense and let Denver City back in the game.

Muleshoe (2-0) was still creating turnovers, but couldn't convert them into points and looked out of sync in its half-court set.

"We just started rushing it a bit," said senior guard Allyson Field. "We have to slow it down a little. We have to be more

disciplined."

The Lady Mules also missed senior all-district post Mandy Cleavinger (14 points), who sat out most of third quarter in foul trouble as Denver City used a 9-2 run at the start of the second half and pulled within 28-27.

But a basket by Carolyn Schuster and a huge 3-pointer by Field stopped the run — at least temporarily.

Denver City twice took the

lead in the fourth quarter, including 42-41 with 2:10 to go on Trisha Tucker's putback.

Muleshoe regained the lead for good on Cleavinger's jumper in the lane, and Field sealed the win by hitting both ends of a one-and-one with 19 seconds left.

"I love it," said Field when asked about being put in the pressure situation. "I have confidence in my free throws, al-

Lazbuddie selects students of month

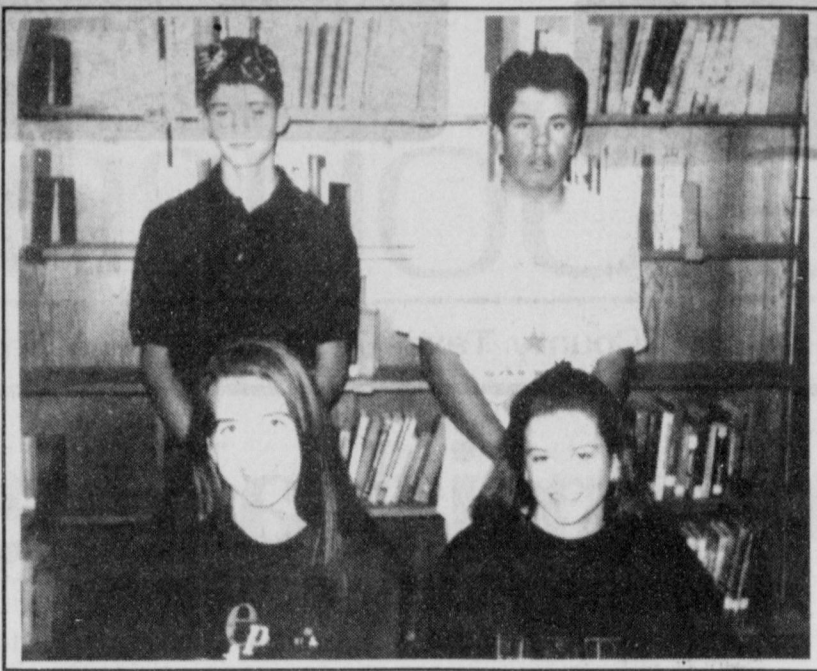
Lazbuddie High School has named the following students as "Students of the Month" for October:

"We could have laid down and quit," said Denver City coach Jamie (Farris) Leagan, who played at Texas Tech. "We showed a lot of character in the second half."

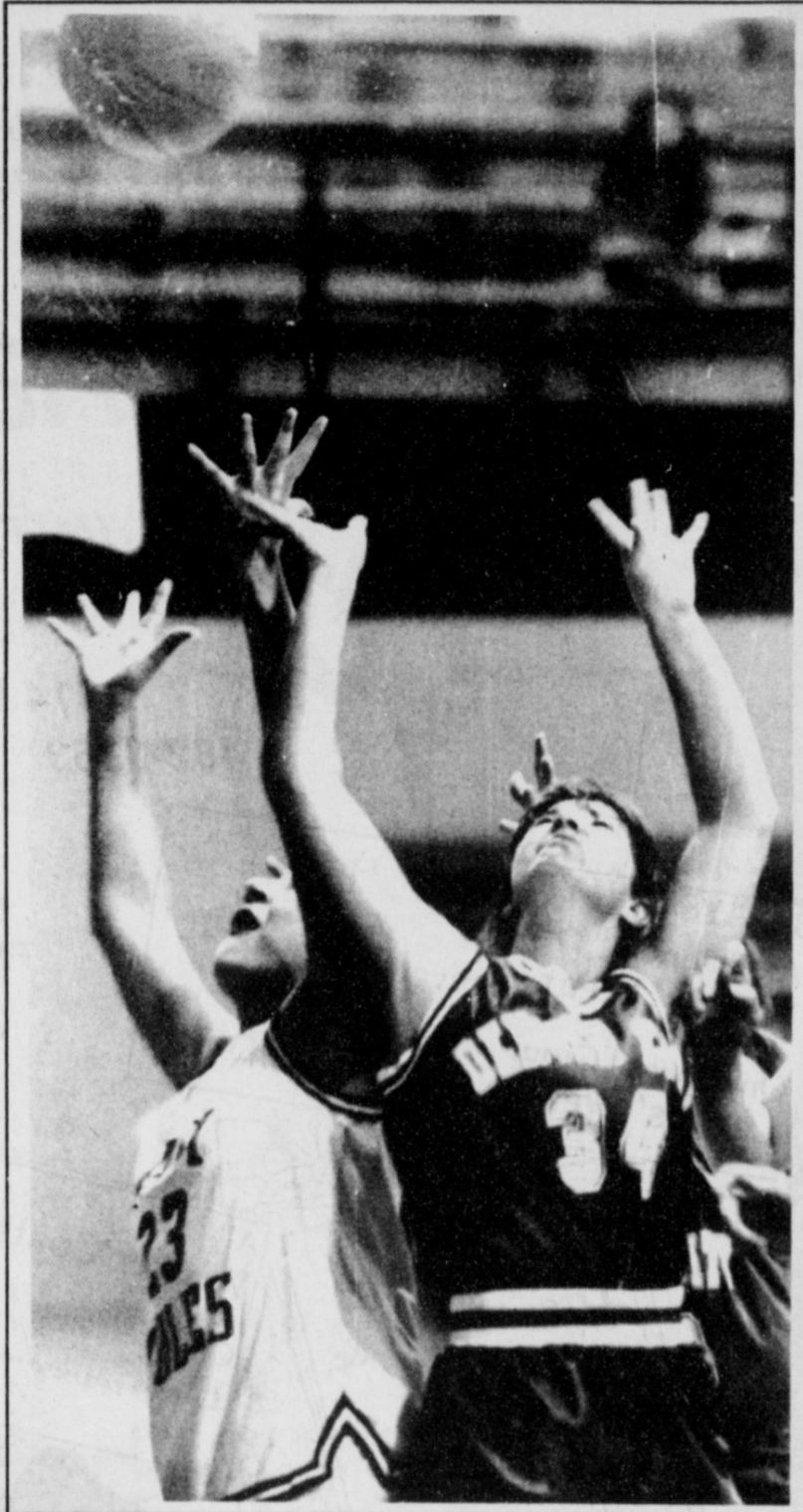
Tucker added 12 points for the Fillies.

the incident was transferred to the jurisdiction of the Texas Department of Public Safety, which is standard procedure when it involves another member of the department, Marr said.

DPS Trooper L.G. Kirk, the investigating officer in the case, said Monday that all he can determine at this time was that two vehicles were involved in a chase around the Lowe's parking lot when one of the vehicles struck an unattended Lowe's pickup truck in the parking lot.

One of the vehicles was being driven by Connie Dominguez, according to sources close to the investigation. The other vehicle belonged to a woman friend of Julian Dominguez. It was not

clear who was driving that vehicle.

Kirk said at this point in time it cannot be determined which vehicle struck the pickup truck.

He said he'll be taking statements from witnesses in the next few days.

Lt. Jay Livingston will serve as acting police chief until a replacement can be found, according to Marr.

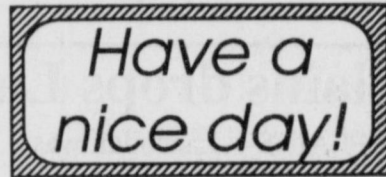

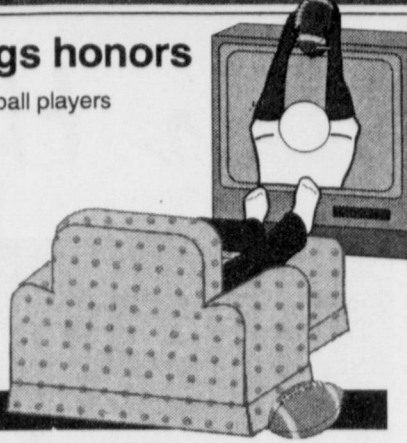

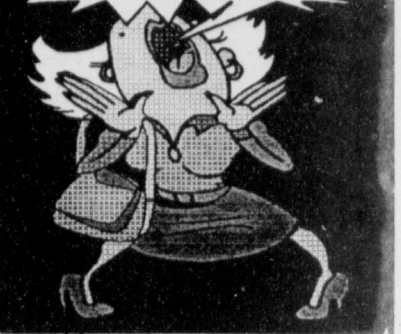

He challenged congregations to avoid "sibling rivalry" among the children in the family of God, pointing out that there are some 28 or 29 church groups in the Muleshoe area.
