# **Auditor revisits issues** concerning assessor office cash accounts

**By Larry Thornton** Managing Editor

**Bailey County received** a "clean" unqualified audit during Monday's regular commissioners' court, however, questions were raised once more about the tax assessor/ collector's office and the way the cash accounts in the office were being handled.

"The records need to be timely and accurate," auditor Becky Roberts, CPA, of Abilene said, a situation she indicated just isn't happening.

While funds aren't missing, Roberts said, the assessor's office \$4,358,820. inability to provide a monthly reconciliation of its accounts hinders the county's ability to maintain proper internal controls over its cash, and needs to be addressed.
