TO TALK SWAMP DRAINAGE
A Drainage Conference at Nashville,
Tenn., April 8 to 10.
Washington, D.C., Jan. 24.—The
owners of wet lands are interested in
the fact that A. W. McKeand, secre-
tary of the Chamber of Commerce of
Charleston, South Carolina, and Car-
roll C. Johnson, secretary of the Cham-
ber of Commerce of Oklahoma City, after
a lengthy discussion with managing
director Dawe, of the Southern Com-
mercial Congress recently convened
at Nashville during the session of the
Southern Commercial Congress, April
8-10, Mr. McKeand and members of
the Charleston Chamber of Commerce
have put into operation methods of
drainage and selling wet lands around
Charleston. This conference will in-
clude, as far as possible, the owners of
wet lands in the South, engineers and
state officials. The question before the
conference are as to whether the
South desires anything more than a
federal survey of wet lands, or whether
the South desires federal co-oper-
ation in the expenditures necessary to
reclaim wet lands.

Tulsa, Okla., Jan. 24.—That prairie chickens, which only a few years ago were so plentiful in Oklahoma, are rapidly diminishing in numbers.

The recent heavy snowdrifts over the Panhandle district, the heaviest in nine years, have driven the prairie chickens, as well as other wild game, into the towns in that locality.

In some sections of Western Oklahoma only five years ago prairie chickens were so numerous that it was not uncommon to see from 200 to 300 chickens flying over the prairie.
