### Romeros found not guilty

Fernando Romero Sr., David Romero and Rosa Romero were all found not guilty of intentionally, knowingly, or recklessly causing bodily injury to Muleshoe Police Officer Rodney Stevens in District Court last week in Muleshoe.

Stevens had arrested the three family members for assault after he had followed Fernando to the family home for a traffic stop.

After the evidence was presented and the defense rebuttal, defense attorney David Martinez moved for a directed verdict. Judge Gordon Green granted the verdict of not guilty to Fernando and David. The jury found Rosa not guilty.

## Judge explains reasons for new jail location

County Judge Marilyn Cox told the *Journal* Monday the reasons why the Bailey County Commissioners Court decided to purchase the west half-block of the 400 block of Second Street for a total of \$140,000 to build the new 96 bed jail complex.

Cox told the *Journal* that the Court had originally looked at tearing down the present jail complex behind the courthouse to build

a new jail. However, after further study, the Court decided to look for a new location.

The county would have to house the county prisoners for over a year during demolition of the present facility and while the new jail is being constructed. Cox estimated a low average of 15 county prisoners a day would cost about a total of \$207,900 for a year. This would not include the transportation cost to and from another facility.

Cox explained to the *Journal* the county would need to rent space to house the

Sheriff's department for a year which would be at least \$6,000.

The cost of tear-down and disposal of the present jail has been estimated by architects to be over \$100,000.

For the above reasons plus being able to use the present jail complex for offices and storage, Cox said the Court decided to move the new jail location.

The Court believes the new jail complex will pay for itself by housing federal and other outside prisoners.

## Muleshoe athletes gearing up for spring sports

The calendar may indicate it's the first of March but spring sports are already in full swing. Sounds of tennis balls banging on the practice boards and the plink of aluminum baseball bats fill the air.

Mats and standards stand ready for the pole-vaulters and high jumpers and the newly resurfaced track provides the fastest venue possible for runners.

The golf teams are on the practice tee every day the West Texas weather permits until it's too dark to play.

The baseball team is four games deep into its 19-game pre-district schedule and will travel to Lubbock Roosevelt for a tournament March 6-8. They return home to face the Shallowater Mustangs on Tuesday, March 11 and then host a tournament March 13-15.

Muleshoe golf teams hosted a tournament February 24 but it was shortened to only nine holes because of adverse weather. The girl's team travels to Olton March 11 and will open district competition in Brownfield March 27.

The Lady Mules will host a district tournament April 3 and will complete the regular season in Littlefield April 9.

The boys travel to Olton March 12 and open district with a trip to Slaton on March 24th. Lubbock Cooper will host the second round at Elm Grove in Lubbock, and Dimmitt is the final stop of the regular season.

"This year we have competition for the varsity boy's golf team and we may see the varsity change personnel from week

to week," said Muleshoe golf coach Kodi Crane. "We have no seniors on the team and currently the varsity is made up of two freshman, two sophomores and a junior."

Crane continued, "Our district is very strong this year with Slaton coming in. Lubbock Cooper has won the district the last two years and is returning all five of their players. But our kids have played a lot of golf and love the game and they will be very competitive."

"We have seven girls out and they are learning the game and working hard to get better every day," added Crane. "The girls are having a good time and evaluate themselves after every tournament and set higher goals."

"Muleshoe Country Club really helps us out by allowing the school to pay them a reasonable fee so that our kids can use their facilities to practice. The Club allows the team members to play year-round for that fee and that is a great help to our golf teams. We really appreciate the generosity of the Muleshoe Country Club," Crane said.

The district tennis tournament is scheduled for April 4th in Lubbock with practice meets scheduled periodically.

"Brownfield and Slaton play team tennis, so they play year-round and have kids that take lessons from tennis pros," said Muleshoe tennis coach Shana Simms. "The addition of those two teams has really raised the level of competition."

"Our kids are working hard and having fun. The district tournament is April 4, so it is a very short season and there is a lot going on in the spring. The competition

for the kids' time is really fierce in the spring," Simms added.

The Lady Mules track team has won four consecutive district championships and have their eyes set on a fifth.

The girls track team travels to Hereford on March 14 and 15 while the boys are in Shallowater. On March 28, the teams will host the Muleshoe Relays and then travel to Canyon for the Eagle Relays April 4th.

The District 2-3A meet is scheduled April 10 in Littlefield to qualify for the Region 1 meet in Odessa April 25-26. The Texas State Track Meet will be held in Austin May 9-10.

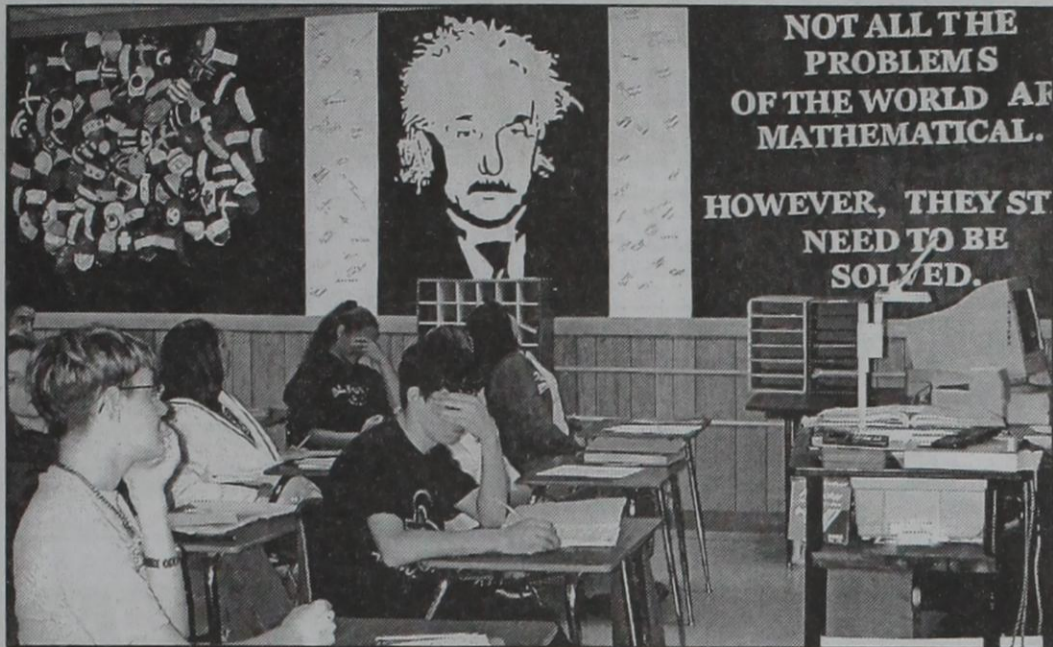

## Are All Religions Created Equal?

I've been listening to some lectures on CD in which a good friend discusses the origin of the religion of Islam and then goes on to compare and contrast Islam and Christianity. It's interesting stuff.

On the first night of the study, my friend began by gazing at the crowd, smiling, and saying, "Good. You look like a relatively safe group." That is an odd way to begin a speech. But what he meant was that he didn't see anyone there who seemed too likely to misquote him or take his comments out of context.

He's been burned that way before. A few years ago, he made an innocent comment to a reporter at a domestic violence conference, something to the effect that, "Some

very politically correct. Why not?

Well, I'm glad you asked.

You see, it is fashionable, and never moreso than since the 9/11 attack, to believe that all religions are created equal, that all are equally valid but different, and that all ultimately lead to the same end. That belief seems all warm and fuzzy. It's nice and polite, sanitary and tolerant. It has all sorts of virtues and only one major fault—it just isn't true.

Still, superficially and politically, it plays very well indeed, particularly to those who think that any faith at all flies in the face of reason, that all religion is mist and moonshine anyway, and that all religious people are equally simple-minded and self-deluded by "blind faith."

Tolerance. That's the ticket! It seems like the highest virtue, particularly to those who don't believe in anything much bigger than themselves and pity those who do. So pick a religion. You like Quarter Pounders; I like Big Macs. You like Islam; I like Christianity. Does it matter?

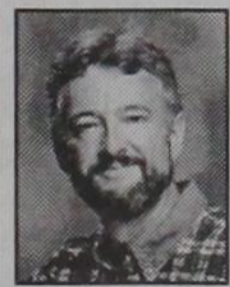
I think so. And thinking so is politically incorrect. And that's what my friend was saying.

Of course, he explained, we should love all people and respect the worth of all people. Of course, we should be polite and considerate and kind to all. Of course! And can some truth be found in all religions? Certainly. But are all religions equally true? Certainly not. How can they be? Consequently, this truth seems as inescapable to me as it is politically incorrect: All religions are NOT equally worthy of adherence.

It just seems to me that a faith based on a Lord who chose to bless even his enemies and lay down his life in love is intrinsically superior to a religion launched by a man who began his "religion" by killing 700 Jewish men who refused to follow him and by selling their families as slaves.

But I could be wrong.

New business included a discussion about the upcoming annual bake auction that will take place on April 5 with the

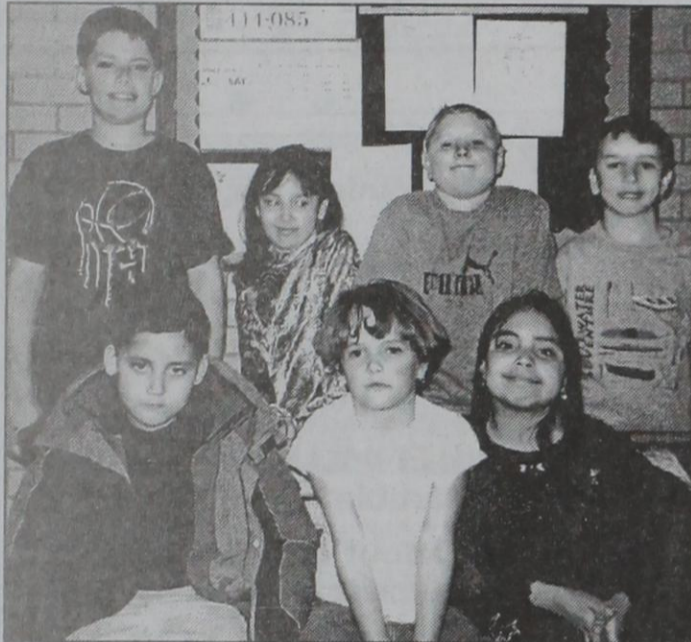

speaker.

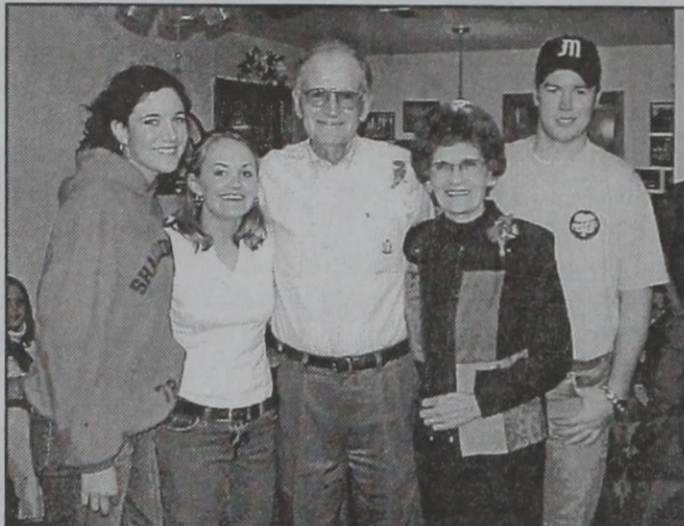
