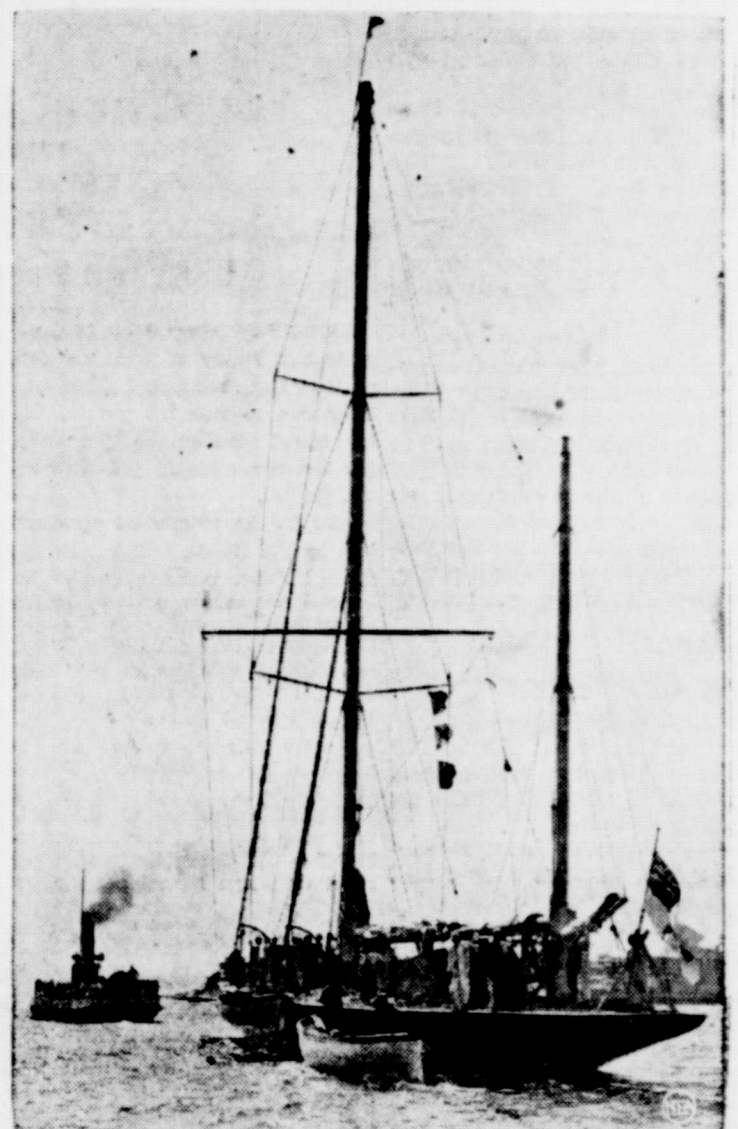

BEARMAN TOWNSITE DUE FOR SHOWING

MIGHT STRIKE OIL FLOW ANY HOUR TODAY

Sails in Quest of America's Cup



The Endeavor II, T. O. M. Sopwith's newest challenger for the America's Cup, is towed out of harbor at Gosport, England, to start its trip to the United States for another attempt to win the most famous of all yachting trophies. The Endeavor's towering racing mast has been replaced by rigging for the ocean crossing, which it is required to complete under its own power.

Excitement is tense this afternoon among local oil men and citizens interested in the Bearman town-site now in the Caddo lime found at 3,250 feet today, and which has already made several feet into the hard structure that may show oil any minute now, it was announced this afternoon.

The Caddo lime structure is about 175 feet in thickness and may show oil at any time. The drilling of this hard substance is rather slow, said Richard Bearman this afternoon, and will not make as good progress as has been made during the last few days. When this strata has been pierced the well will be right on the sand which was the destination sought at 3,400 feet depth.

The center of this structure is in the heart of the townsite of Cisco and trends northwestward. Some leases in that direction have already been placed but Mr. Bearman states there is much unleased townsite property not under contract, and which may be had if owners wish to turn loose. He says a number of people owning lots in that section of Cisco want to let their land go now rather than risk something better if the well should prove a good one.

The well will be watched with interest tonight and until the sand is reached, should the Caddo lime not prove valuable.

RANGER RODEO MOTORCADE IS ENTERTAINER

About 47 members of the Ranger band ate lunch today at the Mobley hotel after more than 75 members of the Ranger Chamber of Commerce, citizens and members of the rodeo which is to be held in Ranger, Wednesday night, had stopped over and entertained on Seventh street at the noon hour today.

Shorly Ricker, world champion steer bulldogger and trick roper, was with the group and gave some exhibitions of trick roping while the band played several numbers under the direction of Bandmaster J. N. Crawford. The party was in charge of T. J. Anderson and J. E. Meroney, president and secretary of the Chamber of Commerce of Ranger.

The motorcade, consisting of fifteen cars, a school bus containing the Ranger band, a truck with four rodeo horses, arrived about 12:30 from a tour which started at Ranger this morning and included Ereckenridge, Albany and Moran before coming to Cisco. The caravan will continue through Eastland, Carbon, De Leon, Gorman and back to Ranger.

Court Decisions Okeh Social Security Act

'WINDFALL TAX' FOR REVENUES IS APPROVED

WASHINGTON, May 17, (AP)—The supreme court today virtually assured decisions on constitutionality of the unemployment insurance and old age pension phases of the new deal social security act by June 1, when it announced that date as the end of its present term. Decisions of the court today included:

An opinion in which the court declined to strike down the "windfall tax" provision of the 1936 revenue act in which the court approved the procedure set up by congress for bringing suit to recover taxes paid under the invalidated AAA.

A decision upholding the far-reaching tax provisions of the Louisiana chain store act.

CLASSIFIED DEVICE MAY AID BONES TO MEND

CLASSIFIED DEVICE MAY AID BONES TO MEND

SAN FRANCISCO (UP)—August Kern, brace-maker in the University of California Medical School, uses old airplane parts to fashion useful hospital gadgets.

Kern's most recent invention is a fracture-setting apparatus that not only holds the limb in place but lengthens it as the same time, if lengthening is necessary.

The new apparatus, constructed entirely of airplane tubing, is being tested at the University Hospital. If it is successful, it promises to do away with the overhead rods, pulleys and other gear that must be used to hold fracture-treated limbs in proper position.

Kern reports that airplane tubing, because of its light weight and its high tensile strength makes particularly satisfactory braces. He shapes his unusual devices in working quarters that are an odd assortment of vices, punching machines and many fine tools that Kern can handle with the skill of a watch-maker.

Kern is a graduate physician who has had a regular practice. But he found that the demand for his skill in making surgical appliances was in such great demand that he applied himself solely to the mechanical side of medical development.

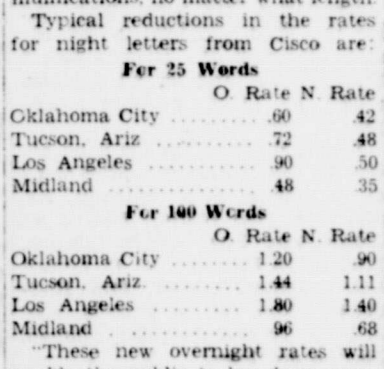
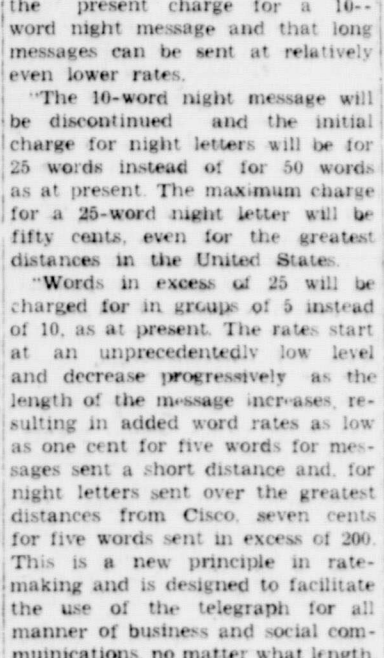
