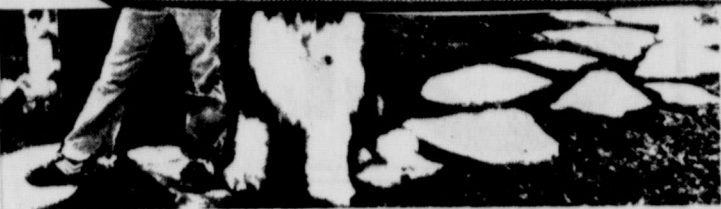

Cisco ISD Homeowners To Get Exemptions

Homeowners in the Cisco ISD have until July 16th to take advantage of new exemptions passed recently by the state legislature. All homeowners, regardless of age, are eligible for an exemption of \$5,000 from the full market value of their home.

In addition, all persons who are 65 years old or older, or under a disability for purposes of payment of disability benefits under Federal Old Age, Survivors, and Disability Insurance are also entitled to an additional exemption of \$10,000 from the market value of their residence homesteads for the purpose of school taxes.

To qualify for these exemptions for 1979, an application must be filed with the school district tax office on or before July 16th, 1979. The exemptions cannot be granted for 1979 if filed for after this date. The school tax office is located at 610 Avenue D. If you have any questions about the exemptions please contact this office before the July 16th deadline.

Mr. Fletcher requested all members of the club to attend with their families. The weekly luncheon was not held on Wednesday of this week due to the Friday night event.

A number of items were discussed at Tuesday night's regular City Council meeting; however, four items on the agenda were not discussed because Mayor Hugh (Chief) Brown closed the meeting at approximately ten minutes before midnight. Those items not being discussed were: Designation of Bank Depository for City Funds; Request to Know Status of Tax Equalization Board; Request for Appointment of Civil Defense and Disaster Coordinator; and Monthly Bills.

Under this agreement TAC offers the city \$136,129 for airport improvement if Cisco can provide \$68,230 of the total. City manager John Boland explained the city will be reimbursed \$31,770 by TAC for the land owned by the airport. He also explained that the airport committee has said it can raise \$15,000 in private donations; therefore, the actual cash outlay being looked at by the city is \$21,460. Boland went further by saying there might be a possibility of getting assistance from the Texas National Guard. If so, the city's actual cash outlay could be lowered to \$6,460.

The general consensus of the citizens present at the meeting seemed to be that the city should accept the offer, since it would show a progressive attitude of the city and could result in additional businesses locating in Cisco.

Council member Grady also made a motion for the city to make a pre-application for a 1980 Airport Grant of \$25,000. Council member Eudy seconded the

cedars located along the rock wall on the east side of the cemetery. He also asked that the city show him where all of the water shut-off valves are located in the cemetery. Council member Louise Allison made a motion that both of his requests be approved. The motion was seconded by council member Lucy Collier and all members voted in its favor.

Council member Morgan Fleming made a motion to nominate Raymond Whitley as Mayor Pro-Tem. Council member Lonnie Grady seconded the motion with all voting in its favor.

A request was made to the council, for the opening of Hartman Avenue in the College Heights Addition, by Mr. Arlie Whitley so he would have access to property he owns. Several other property owners in the area were present at the meeting to voice their disapproval of the request, since there is some controversy about which of three differing surveys should be used for determining property lines. City Attorney Billy Wright advised that the property owners take their dispute to the district court and get it established which survey is to be followed. Council member Allison made a motion that the road not be opened at the present time and the council wait for a legal opinion on the surveys. Council member Bill Eudy seconded the motion. Council members Allison, Eudy and Collier voted for the motion while council members Grady, Fleming and Whitley abstained from voting. Mayor Brown stated he was halfway for and halfway against the motion. Since at least four votes are required to pass a motion, it neither passed nor failed. Council member Collier suggested the complete council get together with the property owners and look at the area in question before making a decision.

Council member Grady made a motion to accept the 1979 Airport Grant offer from the Texas Aeronautics Commission (TAC), following a lengthy discussion by those present. Council member Whitley seconded the motion and all present voted for the motion. (Council member Collier left the meeting before this matter was brought into discussion and remained absent for the remainder of the meeting.)

motion with all voting in its favor except Allison, who stated she would like to see something in writing from TAC.

Council member Whitley made a motion the city make a payment of \$4,882 to the City Engineer for his work on the Front Street project. Council member Grady seconded the motion and all voted in its favor.

Council member Whitley also made a motion to give Mayor Brown permission to sign the final plans and specifications for the Front Street project. Council member Allison seconded the motion and all voted in its favor.

City Manager Boland gave his monthly report to the council, which included the following items: Front Street paving—Start of construction seen as of June 15th, specifically curb and gutter work; Wastewater Treatment Grant—Yeatts and Decker expected to complete Environmental Assessment, Facility Plan sometime near end of summer (late August, early September); Water Filtration—Contacted West Central Texas Council of Governments in regards to preliminary discussion with Farmers Home Administration; Cisco Municipal Airport—Fence is going up slowly. As soon as that job is completed TAC representatives will set survey stakes.

The report continued: Sewer plant—The plant is working efficiently at present. Average readings for May are 23.66 B.O.D. and 15 T.S.S. The sewer effluent totalled 9,576,000 gallons with a high of 613,000 gallons and a low of 353,000 gallons. The centrifugal blower is running better after a slight adjustment in the angle of the pump-motor; Water Supply—A total of 26,126,800 gallons was supplied to the system. The daily average was 842,800 gallons. The maximum was 1,176,000 gallons and 504,000 gallons was the low pumped. Turbidity readings ran 2.0 NTU average with 3.5 NTU high and 1.2 NTU low; Water-Sewer Work—There was a total of five gas inspections, 29 work orders (water), 16 turn ons, eight turn offs, 21 changed meters, and 28 sewer problems corrected; Street-Shop—Worked on bulldozer; lined up air compressor at sewer plant; hauled eight loads of dirt to alley between 10th and 11th on east side and graded (drainage problem); hauled four loads to 10th on eastside; hauled 12 loads to alley between Bullard and Primrose and graded (drainage problem); picked up brush with two trucks one day of week, still picking up brush on Fridays with one truck; replaced 20 foot of sewage along 12th and 11th on Avenue L; repaired and replaced sewer line between 13th and 14th on Avenue L; repaired and replaced sewer line on Mancill Drive; put down 45 tons of blacktop; Battle Creek—The City of Cisco realized 10.5 per cent increase in area of water and .4 per cent in capacity of water due to the Battle Creek pump being on ten days and pumping 36,000,000 gallons of water into Lake Cisco; Water-Sewer Pump Inspection—Pumps no. 1 and 2 at Williamson Dam inspected (o.k.); pumps no. 1 and 2 at College Hill inspected (o.k.); both sewage pumps at Housing Authority inspected (o.k.); pump at

White Elephant inspected, slight problem repaired. Is alright now; repaired lift station at Humbletown; Fire Calls—There was a total of 17 for May: five rural, one city (grass), five structure, two false, three car and one trash; Municipal Court—Judge Killian was in his office for a total of 52 hours; there were 73 tickets given with a total collection of \$1,524.50, a total of four were dismissed totalling \$74.00 (1 expired MVI; 3 blocking street); there were three complaints coming up to \$157.00, one case was continued family trouble; there were three warrants issued for \$111.00; one case was appealed to Eastland County. The court took in a total of \$1,792.50 from its business.

The report summed up with: Police Department—For May, 1979, the Police Department had 57 complaints; 11 reported offenses, two arrests held (2 transferred to county); 72 traffic citations issued; 110 parking tickets; and eight accidents worked. There were three false alarms; Personnel—Mrs. Ona Coats has submitted her resignation, effective July 1, 1979. After screening several good applicants, Boland hired a Mrs. Carol Jones, who began work Monday, June 11, 1979, as bookkeeper. Mrs. Jones has several years experience with banks both in Texas and Colorado; the city's total interest income for the month of May was \$3,798.67.

The Youth Conservation Corps (Y.C.C.) program has been delayed from starting until next week because the contract has not been received from Austin. Council member Allison made a motion that the program be started on Monday, even if the contract is not here, but the program will be cut off if the contract is not forthcoming soon. Council member Eudy seconded the motion and all voted in its favor.

City manager Boland briefed the council on the Tax Assessor School which he attended in Corpus Christi for three days.

The city received an insurance reimbursement check for hail damage to the roofs of City Hall and the Fire Department. Damage to City Hall was \$1,616.80 while the Fire Department damage was \$2,025.16, bringing a total of \$3,641.96.

Council member Allison made a motion to leave the swimming pool fees the same as they were last year. Council member Grady seconded the motion and all voted in its favor.

During a discussion of the minutes from the last regular city council meeting, council member Allison stated she was not quoted correctly and asked that the minutes be amended as she had rewritten the part in question.

Mayor Brown closed the meeting, before any further action was taken, due to its length.

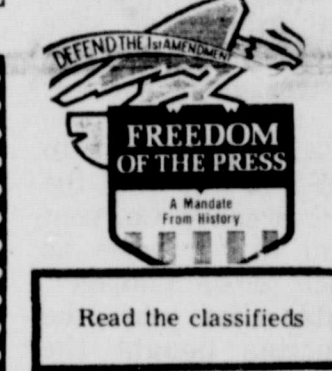
Furthermore, the flag can be only what we make it. It is the dream of what people can become. It can become only what we believe it to be, and all that the people of this country believe it can be.
