

New windfall-profits tax not as tough as Carter's

WASHINGTON (AP) — The Senate Finance Committee approved an oil industry "windfall-profits" tax Friday that is less than half as tough as the one recommended by President Carter.

The measure, adopted on an 11-1 vote, would cost well owners and oil producers an estimated \$142 billion from 1980 through 1990. The bulk of the money would be used to finance Carter's long-range national energy plan and to help Americans earning under \$22,000 a year pay their fuel bills.

The windfall tax proposed by Carter would have produced an estimated \$292 billion in revenues during the 11 years, assuming oil prices rise each year as fast as inflation plus 2 percent. The House-passed plan would have yielded about \$273 billion.

The tax would take away some of the billions of dollars in extra money that will flow to the oil industry as a result of Carter's decision to phase out federal controls on U.S.-produced crude oil. The tax — which would be on revenues, not profits — would apply to 50 to 75 percent of price increases above current levels.

The committee defeated a Republican effort to tie a one-year freeze of Social Security taxes to the windfall profits tax. By holding the tax in 1981 to the same level that will take effect in 1980, the amendment would have

saved a worker and his employer up to \$387.

Sen. Russell B. Long, D-La., the committee chairman, insisted that the amendment by Sen. William V. Roth, R-Del., was too important to vote on without further study. Long vigorously tried to avoid a yes-or-no vote, attempting to spare some Democratic colleagues the task of opposing such a politically appealing measure.

Roth was able to force a vote, but lost on a 10-10 tie. Democrats David Boren of Oklahoma and Mike Gravel of Alaska joined the panel's eight Republicans in voting for the Social Security tax freeze.

Roth promised another effort when the committee takes a final review of the windfall bill next Wednesday.

The committee, even though it has approved the bill, has not filled in all the details on how the government should help lower-income Americans cope with ever-rising fuel costs. That decision also will be made Wednesday.

Here are basic elements of the spending plan:

—About \$70 billion would be spent through 1990 in direct payments of at least \$10 a month to welfare recipients (generally those with incomes up to about \$11,000 a year) and in tax credits of perhaps \$60 a year for those making up to \$22,000 a year.

—About \$8.3 billion worth of tax credits would be used to encourage homeowners and renters to weather-proof their homes and substitute solar and wind power for fuel oil.

—About \$13.2 billion worth of tax

credits would be designed as incentives for businesses to reduce the use of oil and to increase production of hydroelectric, solar, wind and geothermal power as well as oil from shale and other unconventional sources.

'Expedited licensing' requested

WASHINGTON (AP) — The Federal Trade Commission urged President Carter Friday to allow competition for financing among several proposals for a pipeline to move Alaskan oil to "northern tier" states from Washington to Ohio.

The FTC said granting expedited licensing for the pipeline to more than one proposal would encourage competition in the petroleum industry. The step could allow backers of the various proposals to "compete for support in the financial markets on an equal footing," the FTC said.

Although the FTC did not endorse any of the proposals, it said the current ownership of the Northwest Energy-Foothills Project aroused the least antitrust concern and said the Kitimat Pipeline Project caused the most concern.

Under a 1978 law, Carter has the power to grant expedited licensing to certain pipeline proposals.

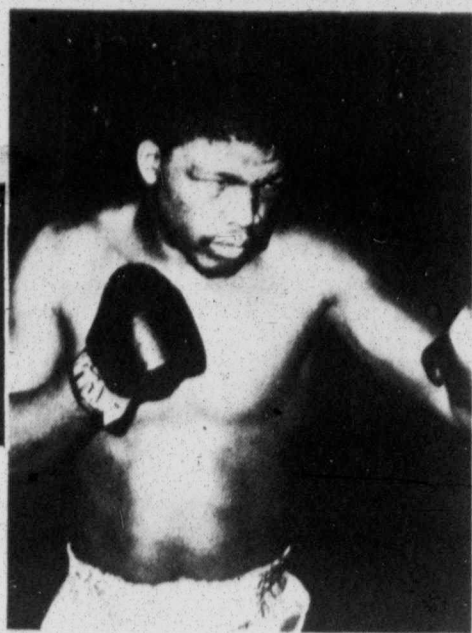

Tests identify decomposed torso as bear

NORTH WILDWOOD, N.J. (AP) — The evidence chilled the spine: An early-rising fisherman finds a badly decomposed torso floating near the North Wildwood beach.

Was it a murder? A hapless skin diver attacked by sharks? A mob rubout in Atlantic City? Or was it a dead bear?

Acting state medical examiner Dr. Robert Good told police this week that extensive tests on the remains, including attempts to match them with human body parts found throughout the state, proved that the torso that washed up on Oct. 6 is a bear.

Good said, "In a methodical sequence of investigation," he tried to match it with arms, legs and heads of humans re-

covered in New Jersey recently.

"After that, I had the feeling that it was not human, or at least a deformed human," he said.

The big break came from Shaw, who said Good's suspicions about the body led him to a Cape May County man who told police he had dumped a skinned bear into the ocean.

The North Wildwood detective said he asked no questions about where the bear came from or why it was dumped in the Atlantic. He refused to reveal the man's identity.

"Look, the guy did us a big favor," Shaw said.

WASHINGTON (AP) — The House wants the Energy Department to consider placing a nuclear waste dump on federal land where such wastes are already stored.

In a 208-197 vote Thursday, the House agreed to require the energy secretary to give "primary consideration" to such a federal site when selecting a permanent nuclear waste repository.

Russian cruise ship kills young whale, drags carcass into Baltimore harbor

BALTIMORE (AP) — A young female whale was decapitated then dragged unnoticed for more than a hundred miles by a Russian cruise ship heading for the Baltimore Harbor, the U.S. Coast Guard says.

The National Marine Fisheries Service and the Coast Guard were expected to dispose of the carcass Friday.

The 42-foot finback whale was apparently hit shortly after the ship, the Belorussiya, passed the Cape Henry Bay, Va., pilot station Wednesday

night, Michael A. Walter, a Coast Guard spokesman, said.

The whale was dragged 150 miles up the Chesapeake Bay to Baltimore by a Russian cruise ship heading for the Baltimore Harbor, the U.S. Coast Guard says.

It was finally discovered Thursday by Jim Demsek, a Chesapeake pilot who was in the area when the Soviet ship came up the channel.

The Coast Guard's Marine Safety Office dispatched a 32-foot patrol boat, which towed the whale in circles Thursday morning, keeping

her out of harbor navigation channels.

Eventually, the Coast Guard tied the whale up at the east side of the Atlantic Terminals in the Fairfield area of the harbor, pending a determination of how to dispose of the carcass.

Coast Guard Master Chief Petty Officer Charles Brenner said officials were reluctant to reveal the exact spot along the pier where the whale's corpse was moored "because we don't want people coming along and cutting it up."

German student finds the Tall City both flat and fun

For 16-year-old Annemarte Rubner, the past two months have been a real change.

An American Field Service exchange student, she left her home of Regensburg, Germany, to spend a year in Midland. That means a trip from a town near the Bavarian Alps celebrating its 1,800th anniversary this year to a city on the West-Texas flatlands which dates its growth all the way back to the early 1920s.

Regensburg was built by the Romans, Midland by the oilmen, and that could create a cultural shock for anyone.

But so far, she says, "It's different here, but I like it."

She is classified this year as a senior at Midland High School, but will face two more years of schooling before entering a university in Germany.

The education systems in the two countries are very different, she noted.

In Germany, she goes to school only from 8 a.m. to 1 p.m. The afternoons are spent doing homework, playing in an orchestra or with sports teams or visiting friends.

The school spirit at MHS is a new experience for her. "In Germany, that is not the custom," the new Pack-Backer noted. Cheerleaders, school football teams and school pride is not common.

Classes are "much harder" in Germany, she added, where 13 years of school are required. She studies 12 subjects per year there.

"There is more gossip in schools here," she noted. "People are always talking about who dates whom."

She finds Texans generally more friendly as well.

"Here, the teachers call you dear and honey," she said, something that seldom happens in Germany.

Students here, however, seem a little more responsible than her German classmates, she said.

Her favorite subjects are foreign languages, and she had studied English three years before coming here. But the Texas accents are a little different from the Oxford English she learned at home, which led to some early but easily overcome difficulties.

"Now I wish I could get a little bit of the Texas accent," she noted.

The young linguist also has studied French and Latin.

The dimpled teen-ager arrived Aug. 10 and will spend a year with Mr. and Mrs. Tom Scott before returning home.

So far she has enjoyed Midland, she said, but it is different from her home.

"In Midland, nobody walks. In Regensburg, you can go to the city and walk around to do things."

Her first impression of the city, flying in from El Paso, was common to many new Midlanders.

"It's so flat," she said.

Identifying body would be 'easy'

DALLAS (AP) — It would be "very easy to make a 100 percent identification" of the body in Lee Harvey Oswald's grave, assistant Dallas County Medical Examiner Linda Norton said Friday.

Ms. Norton and Dallas County Medical Examiner Charles Petty want to dig up the body in Oswald's grave because of discrepancies between Oswald's military records and the autopsy report.

The Warren Commission identified Oswald as the lone gunman who shot President John F. Kennedy in Dallas in 1963. Oswald was shot to death two days later by Jack Ruby, who died of cancer while in jail.

Oswald's grave is in Tarrant County, and the exhumation must be approved by Tarrant County Medical Examiner Nazimuddin Peerwani — and he has said he is reluctant to do so.

Oswald's Marine medical records show he had "a great number of fillings" that would remain intact over many years, said Ms. Norton.

Marine records indicate Oswald was 2 inches taller than stated in the autopsy report, she said. And she

will depend on factors such as embalming and the condition of the casket. "In all probability, the soft tissues... would be gone but the bony structure such as the mastoid bone should still be present," she said.

Tarrant County Medical Examiner Nizan Peerwani said the question of exhumation is a delicate one. "We have to tread very carefully," Peerwani said. He said support from the district attorney and from Oswald's mother in Fort Worth would be necessary before any exhumation.

Jerry Pittman said transcripts of an executive session of the Warren Commission indicate hiding or cremating Oswald's body was discussed.

He said the transcripts released under the Freedom of Information Act include an exchange in which Earl Warren says, "It has been suggested that to save expense, they exhume and then cremate him. ... I don't think we would want that body disposed of until our report has been made."

According to Pittman, Sen. Richard Russell of Georgia then said: "I thought we might get some mausoleum to take the body and seal it up and put it in a mausoleum unknown to anybody else."

In his book, "The Oswald Files," Eddowes contends Oswald, who defected to the Soviet Union, never returned. Instead, he says, a Russian agent took over Oswald's identity in the United States and killed Kennedy.

"I think there's a very high possibility the bone structure will be intact," Ms. Norton said of the body at a news conference Friday. "Assuming the teeth are intact, the comparison should be very easy."

All services fall short of recruiting goals

WASHINGTON (AP) — For the first time since the draft ended, all the armed services failed to make their recruiting goals for a full 12-month period.

This was indicated in preliminary figures provided by the Army, Navy, Marines and Air Force for the fiscal year that ended Sept. 30. The figures may be adjusted somewhat when final reports are received.

The Army suffered more than the other ser-

vices, falling about 16,000 men and women short of its objective of 158,700 volunteers.

The Navy reported signing up some 5,200 "non-prior service" volunteers fewer than its target total of about 81,830. The Navy expects that gap to be narrowed in the final tally.

The Marines were a little more than 1,200 below their objective of nearly 41,500 recruits.

The Air Force came within about 1,400 of its 68,000 recruit goal. Unlike the other services, this was the first year the Air Force missed since the draft expired in 1973.

Signs of trouble appeared about a year ago. But manpower officials hoped the traditionally productive summer months would overcome any recruiting deficit for fiscal 1979.

Gen. Edward C. Meyer, the Army's new chief of staff, said earlier this week that manpower is the foremost of "some very serious concerns" he faces for the future.

"My intent is to provide to the powers-that-be a comprehensive package of resource remedies by which we may solve the problem," Meyer told the Army Association's annual meeting.

Meyer did not say what elements would be in his package of proposals, but he said that "if the dollars we seek from Congress to attract and retain the force are forthcoming, we will

hopefully remedy today's situation."

The Army already is offering various kinds of bonuses, running into thousands of dollars, in an effort to entice personnel to enlist and reenlist.

Entrance standards have been lowered for both male and female recruits, and there is considerable doubt among Army officers as to whether such standards can be relaxed any further.

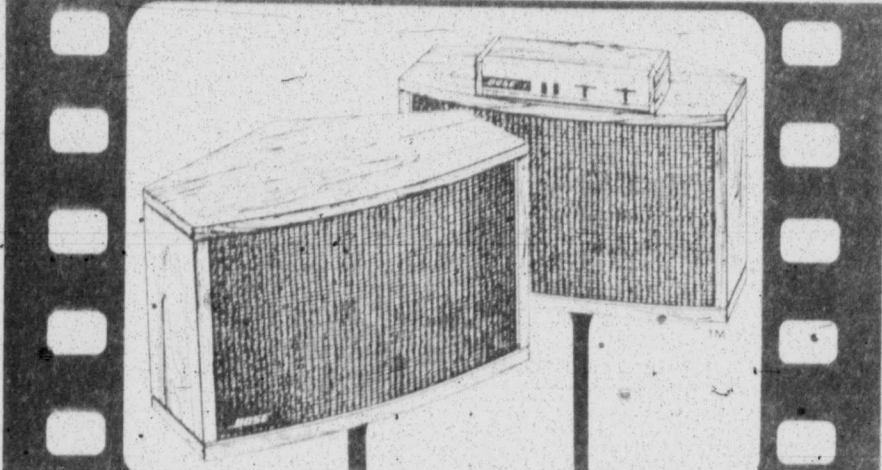

BIG SPRING — A draft of the proposed budget for the Colorado River Municipal Water District will be presented to district directors when they gather at 10 a.m. Thursday for their regular monthly meeting.

The board will also consider a request from the city of Sweetwater for water from Lake Spence.

Other items up for perusal include the replacement of interiors on three 120,000 gallon storage tanks and payment of stream gauging costs incurred in cooperation with the Texas Department of Water Resources.

Prior to Thursday's gathering, the budget committee for the water district's board of directors will meet to add finishing touches on a fiscal guide for the next year.

The water district is having some revenue problems because of the low level at Lake Thomas. Deliveries to oil companies have been curtailed, resulting in substantially less revenues for the district.

In addition, money must be expended to pump the water out of the lake, meaning greater expenditures for the district.

Midland Unitarian Church to celebrate anniversary

The Midland Unitarian Church, located at 3400 North A St., will celebrate its 25th anniversary with a

special commemorative service at 4 p.m. Sunday.

The event will draw visitors from Odessa and Lubbock in addition to members and friends of the congregation from the Midland area.

The Rev. Russell Lockwood of Tulsa, Okla., director of the Southwest Unitarian Universalist Conference, will give the commemorative address at the afternoon service. It will be followed by a reception. The public is invited to attend the service and the fellowship event.

The Midland Unitarian Church was chartered in 1954, with Midland physician Dr. Kurt Liekisch serving as first president of the congregation. The church building was erected in 1958 and the Rev. Gordon Crook served as first minister of the congregation.

Later ministers were the Rev. Bill Nichols and the Rev. Peter Richardson. The congregation has been without a fulltime minister for the last several years.

The Unitarian Universalist Association is based in Boston, Mass., and its Beacon Press has been a major developer and source of religious education materials used by several denominations.

The Unitarians and Universalists were separate organizations until they merged in 1961. Universalists played an active part in early Texas history but the denomination receded to New England and the far West in more recent years.

Unitarians were among the earliest colonial church groups and established the first legal precedent for freedom of religion a number of years before the American revolution. Unitarians to this day stress individual freedom of belief rather than prescribed dogma or doctrine.

LUBBOCK — The Baptist General Convention of Texas, the state Southern Baptist Association, will hold its annual meeting in Lubbock late this month.

The new Lubbock Civic Center in downtown Lubbock will be the site of the meeting, scheduled to begin Oct. 30 and continue through Nov. 1. Preceding the opening of the general convocation will be the annual meetings of the Women's Missionary Union and Texas Baptist Men.

Romanian Judaism dying out

BUCHAREST, Romania (AP) — Although decimated by Nazi deportations and executions during World War II and by postwar emigrations, Romania's aging Jews deny they are a "dying community."

In a message marking the Jewish new year, chief rabbi Moses Rosen told the Romanian Jews, officially estimated to total 38,000, that the year that had passed "was yet another one in which our ranks dwindled."

More than 60 percent of the remaining Jews were over 60 years old, said Rosen in a "spiritual balance sheet," adding that "one (thing) is to be old, and another to be described as dying."

The message was published in the latest issue of the Jewish community's bimonthly magazine in Romanian, Yiddish and Hebrew.

Rosen, who was elected chief rabbi in 1948, said the loss in quantity had been compensated for by a "growth" of quality in the life.

A history museum of Jewish life in Romania, which was inaugurated last winter, and a 220-bed home for the old and sick, built with assistance from the U.S.-based Joint Distribution Committee, were mentioned by Rosen as the year's accomplishments.

He said more than 10,000 old people, described as "Auschwitz remains," were getting assistance from the committee.

The 66-year-old leader, however, seemed to regret that those applying for emigration were young people, "while most of us (left here) grew old."

"Unorganized" emigration, according to reports, has stripped Romanian Judaism of its rabbis, teachers and intellectual leadership. Six hundred rabbis elected Rosen in 1948. Three are left, including himself, and the youngest is 63. Of 201 synagogues operating in 1948, there are 130 still functioning.

Sri Lanka's president threatened

COLOMBO, Sri Lanka (AP) — The government has uncovered a threat against the life of President Junius Richard Jayewardene, the state-controlled Ceylon Daily News said Friday.

The newspaper said police, acting after a probe by the Criminal Investigation Department, recovered three hand bombs from the trade union headquarters of the opposition Sri Lanka Freedom Party.

The premises were placed under police guard, but there was no word of arrests. Nor was there immediate reaction from the party.

The report said that "for some time" information had been received that "certain persons" at trade union headquarters had been discussing the most opportune time to "insult or assassinate" the president. The phrase was not explained.

It said the group had decided to go ahead with the plot when Jayewardene visited his dentist, who has

offices next door to the trade union offices.

Jayewardene had seen his dentist Wednesday and Thursday, and his secretary had requested another appointment Friday. The report did not say whether the president had visited the dentist again Friday.

The Daily News said that police had information that bombs had been brought to the trade union office last month and taken away. Further information was received today that bombs had been brought once again led to the raid.
