Time To Treat Grubby Cattle

There is still time to do good in cattle grub control. Many cattlemen in Bailey county are "grubby" but the grubs can be killed if cattle are treated in this month, J. M. Hancock, county agent, says.

Save meat, milk, leather, feed and profits:

1. Texas cattle slaughtered annually 2,000,000 head.
2. Slaughtered cattle grubby each year 800,000.
3. Grubby cattle discounted one half to one and one half cents per pound or an average of \$3.80 per animal.
4. Average of 2 pounds meat per grubby animal destroyed.
5. Total meat lost each year enough to feed 4,600 soldiers for one year.
6. Leather lost each year enough to furnish shoes for 1,000,000 soldiers.
7. Approximately 15 per cent more feed required for grubby cattle.
8. Reduction in milk flow approximately 25 per cent.
9. Total loss to Texas farmers each year approximately \$ million dollars.

Army Answers Your Personal Problems

Your questions on allotments, insurance, legal problems or other matters as they relate to Army personnel and their dependents will be answered in this column or by letter. Write Headquarters, District Clerk, of Bailey County, Texas, at its Regular Eighth Service Command, Dallas House, in Muleshoe, Texas, Monday, the 12th day of February, A. D. 1945 at 10:00 o'clock A. M. Depository Bonds covering County funds are separate and apart from those covering School funds. The Court reserves the right to reject any and all bids.

Q. Is the Purple Heart received for wounds in action the same as the Purple Heart received in case of death in action?
A. Yes. The Purple Heart given to those who receive in action against the enemy a wound which necessitates treatment by a medical officer and is honored as such information to the Adjutant General, Washington 25, D. C.

Q. My son was killed in action last August and I have not received any information regarding his death or burial. Where can I write to receive this information?
A. If you have received a letter from either your son's organization or the Adjutant General regarding the circumstances of your son's death, you may write for such information to the Adjutant General, Washington 25, D. C.

Q. My son wrote me he had his insurance and was bonded changed to me. Has he been notified that change in the insurance has been made, but no such notice has come to me. In addition, I have received one of the three bonds he says he has bought. How can I get these matters straightened out?
A. If your son has been notified that changes have been entered by the Veterans Administration on his insurance record, naming you as beneficiary, no notice to you is necessary. You should wait three months after a bond is actually bought before inquiring as to its whereabouts. If more than three months have passed since your son bought his bonds, write the Army War Bond Office, 366 West Adams street, Chicago, Ill.

Q. Can a bank charge me and others a service charge to cash our family allowance checks from our men in the Service?
A. There is no regulation prohibiting a bank from charging a nominal sum for cashing a government allowance check.
