A Lubbock Grand Jury decided not to file criminal charges in a death case of Juan Nunez III.

Nunez died April 16 after being electrocuted with a Taser weapon by a Lubbock police officer. 



# **OUICK HITS** Israel OKs call up of 30,000 soldiers

JERUSALEM (AP) — Israel's government decided Thursday not to expand its battle with Hezbollah guerrillas in southern Lebanon for now, but authorized the army to call up 30,000 reserve soldiers in case the fighting intensified. The Lebanese health minister said up to 600 civilians have been killed in the campaign, including as many as 200 still buried in the rubble of destroyed buildings. Secretary of State Condoleezza Rice, meanwhile, said she was "willing and ready" to return to the region to work for a sustainable peace agreement. But President Bush suggested he would support the offensive for as long as it would take to cripple Hezbollah.

### Exxon Mobil earns nearly \$10.4B last quarter

DALLAS (AP) — Exxon Mobil Corp. said Thursday it earned \$10.36 billion in the April-June period, the second largest quarterly profit ever recorded by a publicly traded U.S. company. The earnings figure was 36 percent above the profit it reported a year ago. High oil prices and the growing global appetite for fuel helped boost the company's revenue by 12 percent to a level just short of a quarterly record. Its shares briefly rose to a new high.


### Tour de France winner Landis flunks drug test

LONDON (AP) — Floyd Landis' stunning Tour de France victory just four days earlier was thrown into question Thursday when his team said he tested positive for high levels of testosterone during the race. The Phonak team suspended Landis, pending results of the backup "B" sample of his drug test. If Landis is found guilty of doping, he could be stripped of the Tour title, and Spain's Oscar Pereiro would become champion.

The bike lanes on campus were a good start, but there is a lot of room for improvement. Several areas on campus are left naked of bike lines. Ironically, none considering that, what with the multitude of bicycles on campus, cyclists would most likely be entering the campus via bicycle.

This absence of a comprehensive network of bike lane makes biking around through the spokes of my bicycle at a young Texas Tech unnecessarily dangerous.

Similarly, a more complete set of bike lanes will increase awareness about the presence of bicycles on campus. Bikers would feel safer on the road, and would be less tempted to use pedestrian sidewalks in an attempt to skirt any potential vehicular conflict that might arise. In sum, the campus would be safer and generally more pleasant to travel for all.

I've heard that there are plans to "phase in" more bike lanes, but where's the white paint? Bikers are important to Texas Tech. We assuage the ever-worsening parking problem, and decrease the amount of vehicle traffic on campus. We deserve our own lane — throughout the entire campus.





# U.S. may send more troops to Baghdad

WASHINGTON (AP) — Military commanders in Iraq are developing a plan to move as many as 5,000 U.S. troops with armored vehicles and tanks into the country's capital in an effort to quell escalating violence, defense officials said Thursday.

Part of the plan includes delaying the departure of a sizable portion of the 172nd Brigade Combat Team — a lighter, more mobile Army unit. That requires approval by Defense Secretary Donald H. Rumsfeld.

The additional Americans would be teamed with Iraqi police and army units and make virtually every operation in the city a joint effort, one military official said. Another military official said some troops movements into Baghdad had already begun.

All flights out for soldiers currently at the end of their deployment were canceled as of Tuesday, as commanders wrestle with the plan and how to supply troops needed for it, a third official said.

### Rocket and mortar bombardment kills 31

BAGHDAD, Iraq (AP) — Rockets and mortars rained down Thursday on an upscale, mostly Shiite area of Baghdad, collapsing an apartment house, shattering shops and killing at least 31 people — part of the rising sectarian violence President Bush has vowed to stop.

A car bomb also exploded during the attack in the commercial-residential district of Karradah, an area that is home to several prominent Shiite politicians.

More than 150 people were wounded in the blasts, police said.

Horrified survivors milled about the street hours later, surveying the damage and blaming Sunnis from neighborhoods across the Tigris River.

"We are not infidels. It seems that we are not even safe in our homes," said one man, who, like others on the street, refused to give his name because he was afraid.

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# Bush says world must confront danger presented by terrorists

WASHINGTON (AP) — President ate cease-fire during a Rome summit, gave Bush declined Thursday to criticize Israel's tactics in its continuing offensive against Hezbollah guerrillas in southern Lebanon, and gave a sharp condemnation of Iran's role in the bloody fighting.

"Hezbollah attacked Israel. I know Hezbollah is connected to Iran," Bush said tersely at the end of Oval Office meetings takes to eliminate Hezbollah's influence in with Romanian President Traian Basescu. "Now is the time for the world to confront this danger," Bush said.

The president was responding to statements from top Israeli officials that fighting the problem is terrorist groups trying to stop could continue for several weeks more. Israeli Justice Minister Haim Ramon said world leaders, in failing to call for an immediterrorist tactics are not rewarded."

# 600 civilians killed in Israeli offensive

600 civilians are believed to have been killed in the Israeli offensive in Lebanon, including as many as 200 buried

BEIRUT, Lebanon (AP) — Up to in the rubble of destroyed buildings, the health minister said Thursday.

The toll was a large jump over previous Health Ministry reports of, around 400 killed, which is based on the number of bodies received at Lebanese hospitals.

Lebanon state radio quoted Health Minister Muhammed Jawad Khalifeh as saying up to 600 were killed, and that between 150 and 200 of them were believed to be buried in rubble

The Health Ministry count does not include 20 soldiers the Lebanese army has confirmed dead or 35 guerrillas whose deaths Hezbollah has acknowledged.

DMX, 35, spent a night behind bars last month after a judge issued an arrest warrant when he failed to appear in court to answer the charges. He walked out after posting \$25,000 bail.




