### New Weapons For Farmers in Bout Against Weevil

Farmers have available in 1948 more weapons to fight the boll weevil and other cotton insects than ever before.

Long and careful studies by state experiments and the federal government have now proved conclusively the values of benzene hexachloride, chlorinated camphene, and DDT. Chlordane is in the final experimental stages. Calcium arsenate continues to be recommended in most areas.

Unquestionably the cotton farmer has poisons available which will help him cut to a new low the portion of his crop eaten by the boll weevil and his buddies.

The National Cotton Council recommends that farmers in areas where severe infestation seems likely keep on hand sufficient poison for at least one application.

The proper poison for local use will vary with the different sections of the Belt and with the particular insect damaging the crop. Complete information on recommended insecticides is available from every county agent and vocational agriculture teacher in the cotton states.

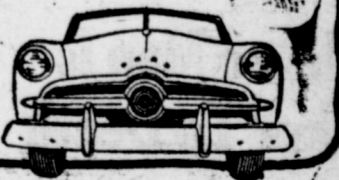

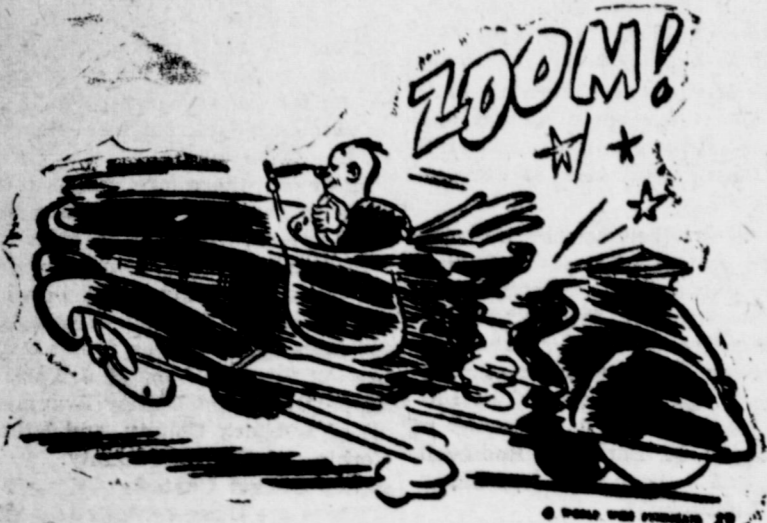

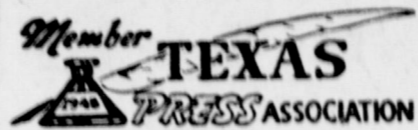

**Soil Saving By Compulsion**

Enthusiasm for the value of soil and recognition of the dangers of soil erosion has led Commissioner J. E. McDonald of the Texas Department of Agriculture into strange doctrine.

Addressing the Texas Dirt Farmers Congress at Austin May 18, Mr. McDonald said that the time is near for compulsory soil conservation, and stated:

"It is time for us to think about compulsory soil conservation, handled cooperatively by the state and federal governments and paid for out of tax funds, just as schools and police.

Then he went on to suggest that state and federal governments purchase equipment necessary for terracing watersheds as single projects and said:

It would be the government's duty to terrace farms and the farmer's duty to maintain them. If they weren't maintained, the government could do the work and charge it against the farmers, like delinquent taxes."

Texas will not relish the idea of either state or federal control of land use and penalties for neglecting to carry out any state or federal program for such use.

Vital as is the need of soil conservation, compulsion is not the right approach to it.

Commissioner McDonald is old enough to remember when the pro-

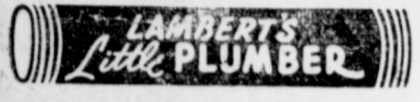

**Canning Time**

Beans are at their best right now. Logan, Refusee and Blue Lake may be strangers on strange names as far as bean varieties go. They are free from stringiness and are tops for canning or freezing.  
If you are harvesting green beans especially for quick freezing, Mrs. Laurette A. Williamson, county home demonstration agent advises to select only those beans which have a very small seed and a dark color. When the seeds have begun to de-

velop to a point in green beans where there are slight bulges in the beans there is enough wood fiber in the hull to give the canned or frozen food product a low eating quality and poor flavor.  
Corn may be another of your crops that is ready for harvesting and canning. If so, here is a point to remember: Pick the ears early in the morning, and get the corn in the can or freezer as soon as possible. Sweet corn begins to lose its sweetness and quality in a very short time after the ears are taken from the stalk. The same goes for fresh roasting ears on the table. For best taste and quality, harvest the corn at 11 o'clock for a meal at 12.

As for tomatoes, Mrs. Williamson suggests that they be pulled from the vine as soon as they are pink. Bring them into the house and put them in a cool, shady place where they will ripen to a deep red color. You will find that the inside of the tomatoes are juicy and meaty instead of fibrous. This is for fresh tomatoes.  
Now, if you want tomatoes for canning, pick them pink and let them ripen in the house, or leave them on the vine until they are fully ripe. A little mental arithmetic will give you an estimate on your tomato crop. A bushel of tomatoes will give you about 25 No. 2 cans. On a larger scale, 150 bushels to the acres is a good estimate. This gives about 3,750 No. 2 cans of tomatoes from an acre.  
Careful handling of the crop will mean less loss on the yield, so han-

dle with care and keep your profits up.

**Stop Mr. Weevil Before He Eats '48 Cotton Crop**

Be on guard against the weevil. Prevent him and other cotton pests from getting a head start in your cotton fields.  
Regular infestation comes throughout the season and prompt application of insecticides which need not wipe out long arm worms holding cotton losses to a minimum in infested areas, the National Cotton Council says.  
When should insecticides be applied?  
Many state entomologists agree that dusting for boll weevil should be begun when infestation reaches 25 per cent—that is, when 25 of each 100 squares are punctured. On land whose cotton yield usually is low, however, dusting may be advisable when 10 to 15 per cent infestation is reached.  
Once dusting is begun it should be continued at intervals of about five days until control is achieved.  
Since conditions vary from state and area to area, the Cotton Council recommends to cotton farmers that they consult local county agents and vocational agriculture instructors on proper dusting practices for their individual farms.

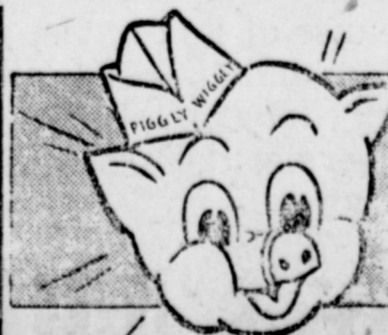

MORE EATERS THAN STEAKS

College Station.—Agricultural economists estimate that today there are some four thousand less beef cattle in the United States than on hand at the close of World War I in 1919. Dairy bulls are included in the beef cattle total because the separate figure are not available, says T. R. Timm, extension economist in farm management of Texas A. and M. College. But when total figures are used in this case, the real story is covered.

Although total beef numbers are lower between the two periods, cow numbers are up. There are nearly 50 thousand more cows of two years and over, and about four hundred thousand more heifers one to two years old. Calves and steers, in about equal numbers, account mainly for the general decrease. Estimates are

made as of the first of the year, says Timm. "Compare to World War I, we now have in supply fewer beef cattle but we can increase our beef production quicker in view of a higher percentage of cows and heifers," Timm points out.

Right after the first World War, there were 400 head of cattle for every 1,000 persons in America. Today this picture is a little different. At the present count there are only head for the same number of people. Even the number of beef cows, lost ground instead of gaining, as the total number of cows and heifers.
