## Family killed, home burns; 3 to be charged

ALBA (AP) — A mother and two children were killed in a pre-dawn attack at their remote East Texas ranch, which burned to the ground, and three high school students who knew the family will be among those charged with murder, authorities said Saturday.

The father was in critical condition with a gunshot wound, Rains County Sheriff David Traylor said at a news conference.

Three high school students, including one juvenile, and an adult were arrested and booked into the Rains County jail. The two males and two females will be charged with three counts each of capital murder, Traylor said.

#### Feds search Utah home in ricin case

LAS VEGAS (AP) — FBL agents on Sunday searched a Utah house linked to a man whose hospitalization led to the discovery of deadly ricin in a motel room he had occupied on the Las Vegas Strip.

The search of the home outside Salt Lake City began about 8 a.m. and was expected to continue for several hours, FBI spokesman Juan Becerra said. A news conference was scheduled for late morning to discuss the probe.

## Putin protege cruising to victory

MOSCOW (AP) — Early returns from Russia's presidential election showed Dmitry Medvedev cruising to an easy victory.

The Central Election Commission said returns from 15 percent of Russia's electoral districts showed Medvedev with about 65 percent.

Russia's voters had been expected to endorse Vladimir Medvedev, allowing the outgoing president to retain significant power.

# Olmert vows to continue with Gaza offensive

JERUSALEM (AP) — Prime Minister Ehud Olmert on Sunday rejected international criticism of an Israeli offensive in the Gaza Strip and vowed to press forward with the operation.

His comments came the day after some 54 Palestinians were killed in the highest single-day death toll since fighting erupted in 2000.

Israel has stepped up its activity in Gaza in response to heavy rocket fire launched from the Hamas-ruled strip, including several barrages that reached the major city of Ashkelon, some 11 miles north of Gaza.

"If anyone is under the illusion that by increasing the range (of the rocket fire) they'll get us to scale back our operations, he is making a serious mistake," Olmert told his Cabinet. "With all due respect, nothing will prevent us from continuing operations to protect our citizens."

Two Israeli soldiers were killed and seven were wounded

in the clashes, the military said.

The violence took a heavy toll on Gaza civilians. Moder-

ate Palestinian leaders called the killings a "genocide" and threatened to call off peace talks.

"The response to these rockets can't be that harsh and heinous," said Palestinian President Mahmoud Abbas. "It is nowadays described as a holocaust."

# Voting twice, super delegates elements of Texas primary

When former President Bill Clinton visited Lubbock last month, he reminded Texas Democrats they have the privilege — or obligation, as some may see it — to vote twice for the presidential candidate of their choice during the Texas primary election Tuesday.

Dorothy Kennedy, Lubbock County elections administrator, said after the former president informed Lubbock residents they could vote twice, the elections office has been swarmed with calls from curious or confused voters asking for an explanation.

Kennedy said while Texas is a winner-take-all race for Republicans, Democratic delegates in Texas are split between the primary election and caucus-style precinct conventions organized by each county's party in the evening of the primary election, after polls close.

"That's why you see the Democrat race so close, because it's done by percentages," she said. "Two-thirds comes from the direct vote and the other third is conducted and received from the precinct convention."

Texas has 193 delegates up for grabs for the Democrats Tuesday, with 126 pledged delegates awarded proportionately based on primary voting in 31 state senatorial districts, while 67 will come from the caucus, according to the Associated Press. An additional 42 at-large pledged delegates

## Huckabee visits Lubbock, Chuck Norris tells 'how it is going to be'

As a rally of about 300 people chanted "we want Mike," Republican presidential candidate Mike Huckabee took the stage in Lubbock Friday outside the Silent Wings Museum.

Huckabee, a former governor of Arkansas, was quick to address his critics, who he said had questioned the purpose of his trip to Texas.

"I don't believe that the people of Texas are going to sit back and allow the people of New

"I don't believe that the people of Texas are going to sit back and allow the people of New York, New Jersey, Delaware, Connecticut and California tell them who they're going to have as a Republican nominee for president," Huckabee said. "It ain't over until Texas says it's over." Before Huckabee dived into his issues, celebrity and supporter Chuck Norris gave his thoughts on the candidate.

At first disappointed with the choice in candidates, Norris said after researching Huckabee's issues, he believes the choice in the next president is clear.

"Once you hear the message Mike Huckabee has to say, you can't help but believe that he is the man to lead the United States," Norris said. "Critics said he'd never make it. But he did; here he is, right here. They said he wouldn't win any states, but he did. They said he wouldn't make it in the finals, but he's one of the last two standing here."

A pro-life candidate, Huckabee said protecting every human life is very important to him and as president, he would attempt to add a human rights amendment to the Constitution. "So that once and for all, we say what we have always believed to our country, and that is, life

In addition, Huckabee said he is the only candidate wanting to secure the borders.

"We're not against people coming," he said to the crowd, "we just want to make sure that our own government makes it so that people that do come at least have as much documentation to walk across the border as you do to get on an airplane.'

As president, Huckabee said he

would support the Fair Tax plan. According to the Web site www. fairtax.org, "the FairTax plan is a comprehensive proposal that replaces all federal income and payroll based taxes with an integrated approach including a progressive national retail sales tax, a prebate to ensure no American pays federal taxes on spending up to the poverty level, dollar-for-dollar federal revenue neutrality, and, through companion legislation, the repeal of the 16th Amendment."

Huckabee said he believes the current tax system often hurts smallbusiness owners and penalizes hard workers.

"When we have the Fair Tax, guess who's going to be paying," he said, "all the people in the underground economy who, right now, don't pay the taxes





Groups including the National Weather Service, Tech's student chapter of the American Meteorological Society, Tech's Wind Science and Engineering Research Center and the Tech Police Department distributed information about the dangers of severe weather as do to reduce those risks.

'We've been giving out lots of brochures telling people what to do," said Jennifer Huckabee, vice president of Tech's chapter of the American Meteorological Society. "People understand the risks to a certain extent, but a lot of people also see severe weather for its coolness; they think it's exciting. We're just trying to get the word out of how to be safe and what to do to be safe."

While the National Weather Service offered storm spotter certification training at the event, Steven Cobb, a meteorologist with the National Weather Service in Lubbock, said being able to identify storms was not the main goal of Severe Weather Awareness Day.

"How to take precautions, that's the big part," Cobb said. "No matter how early you get the alert, if you don't know what to do, you're still in danger."



Turney said Victoria's Secret wants to increase its level of sophistication.


"We will also reinvent the sleepwear business and focus on product quality," she said. "Our assortment will return to an ultra feminine lingerie brand to meet her needs and expectation."

## Britain's Prince Harry hopes to return to combat zone as soon as possible

LONDON (AP) — Prince Harry, is some way off in the future," he said, to return to combat zones as soon as

The prince's mission had previously gone unreported as part of an agreement, designed to protect the 23year-old prince and his fellow soldiers, between the Ministry of Defense and major news organizations.

"'Angry' would be the wrong word to use but I am slightly disappointed. I thought I could see it through to the end and come back with our guys," Harry said after landing at an air force base where he was met by his father, Prince Charles, and brother, Prince

"I would love to go back out, and I've already mentioned it to him that I want to go out very, very soon," he

Air Chief Marshal Sir Jock Stirrup, head of Britain's armed forces, said Sunday that any future deployment would depend on whether Harry poses a risk to his colleagues.

"I would have to be clear that the risks to the operation, in the widest sense of the people deployed on that operation, would be no higher than they would normally be," Stirrup told Britain's Sky News television.

Gen. Sir Richard Dannatt, head of Britain's army, said there is no immediate prospect of the prince returning to the front line for 12 to 18 months.







## Tech soccer finds time for improvements during spring

Tom Stone felt a little hurried at the beginning of his first season as the Texas Tech women's soccer coach.

He had two weeks in the preseason to figure out what type of team he controlled, and now, with the spring season under way, he can work on preparing for next fall.

"Every player has elements of their game," Stone said. "Even professional players have technical aspects of their game that they have to improve, and college players are no different. They all have different technical assignments that they're trying to work on."

Stone said his players try to improve their technical skills such as heading, shooting and passing, while the functional skills pertain to their roles at each respective position.

With a 2-0 win against UCF (2-1) in the opening spring match, it seems the Red Raiders have done a stellar job thus far.

UCF, who went 15-4-4 a year ago, advanced to the second round of the NCAA Tournament last season, while Tech's season ended in a double-overtime loss to Missouri in the Big 12 Conference Tournament.

It was the first time Tech reached the Big 12 Tournament since 1999.

Tech junior Maegan Wilber scored a goal in the second half against UCF, and she said her teammates have responded to Stone's expectations in the spring season.

"At each position there are seven main things that the players should have, and we all have a list of that," she said. "If there's something we need to work on, on the list, then we go on and work on that on our own and at practice, too. So just every practice is intense; we just have to work hard and do our best." With the expired eligibility of

Tech senior forward Priscilla Es-

quivel, Stone said his team lost an integral piece to the puzzle, and hopes the spring season will help him find a player that can hold the ball as well as Esquivel.

He said senior Chessa Purser and sophomore Katie Hinds performed well in that regard against UCF.

"We've spent a ton of time this spring of keeping the ball and having a little more indirect play to our team," Stone said. "In the fall, we were kind of slanted toward being fairly direct, and in the spring, we've tried to balance that out, because, when there's room to play, we want to keep it on the ground and link up."

Along with developing his team, Stone said continuing to chalk up wins goes a long way in the players' mentality.

He said the win against a top team like UCF was an example of building that mentality.

"We're trying to build a winning culture, and you can't do that if you don't care about results," Stone said. "For us to act like we didn't care that we won would have been untrue. Sure we cared about winning that game, and that's how we're gonna approach every game."

Tech sophomore Halie Cdebaca, who grabbed the assist on Wilber's goal against UCF, said she believes the game showed where the Red Raiders stand as a team.

"That game just made us not only see that we can play at the top, but we're not there yet either," she said. "We still have to push ourselves, and we still have to work hard and train hard every week, it doesn't matter."

With Tech's next match against West Texas A&M at 1 p.m. Saturday in Canyon, Stone said he hopes the wins keep


