SHOULD YOU BE - a Korean veteran who was discharged before July 16, 1951, and failed to apply for mustering-out pay before the original deadline of July 16, 1956, you have been granted a new opportunity to file, but it must be done now. For Korea veterans who served overseas the payment is \$300.

Those with sixty days or more of domestic service receive \$200, while the Korea vet with less than sixty days is entitled to only \$100.

A GI insurance policy holder who has married, divorced, or had births or deaths in the family since taking out your policy, you should check your designated beneficiary list, as the law requires that a vet's insurance be paid to the beneficiary of record despite all contrary provisions in the veteran's will.

A veteran and lack of a high school diploma is penalizing you in job competition, you may find a remedy in the General Educational Development Test. This is available to any veteran who has attended high school. Passing scores must be supplemented by satisfactory completion of courses in American history and American government, which may be taken in adult school classes either before or following the test.

Dear President Eisenhower:

As you know, Judge E. D. Salinas has been mentioned prominently as a possible appointee to the position of Federal Judge of the Southern District of Texas. We the undersigned strongly urge that you appoint him to his important position.

Judge Salinas has had a long and distinguished legal career. His abilities, qualifications, and integrity are of the highest order. It seems clear that no one in South Texas is as well qualified for the appointment as this brilliant jurist.

In addition to Judge Salinas' own merits, an urgent reason for his appointment is the fact that South Texas, though populated dominantly by citizens with Spanish names, has never had a federal judge with such a name. Judge Salinas' appointment would inject new vigor into the struggle of the majority of South Texans for first-class citizen ship.

Finally, the appointment of Judge Salinas would result in an enormous increase of prestige for the United States in Latin America. On the eve of your good will mission to South America, you could make no wiser, juster, or more appropriate appointment to the bench than that of Judge E. D. Salinas as Federal Judge of the Southern District of Texas.




