Violent weekend weather leaves mark on Oak Creek residence

This weekend's violent weather left its toll of damage to residence at Oak Creek Lake. A tornado was sighted at approximately 8:00 p.m. Sunday as several residents watched a funnel dip down, but actual damage came from a storm about 11:00 p.m. which first touched down in the vicinity of the WTU Oak Creek power station inflicting minor damage to the building and surrounding area. Siding was removed from the south side of the plant, windows were broken, a small tool shed

was completely destroyed, and other outbuildings were damaged.

A partial list of the reported damage was to the Kelly Beal home where the roof was removed; extensive roof and ceiling damage to the Pete Wood's house; porches blown away at several houses, and minor damage to the Mike and Teri Johnson home.

The storm demolished trees, outbuildings and lawn furniture in its path and caused minor to extensive damage to mobile homes in

the area.

The weekend storm system dumped around two inches of rain and some light hail throughout the county.

The Tennyson area received a heavy hail on Saturday afternoon ranging from large marble to baseball size stones, which caused damage to roofs, windows and vehicles. Farmers are now assessing crop damage, most are reporting considerable damage or loss of wheat and oats in the Tennyson and Norton area.

Golf twosome still playing, winning after thirty-three years of tournament play

Elsie, in playing in her largest tourney at Broadmoor Invitational in Colorado Springs, Colorado, was beaten out in the semi-finals. She has quite a collection of trophies, many of them fashioned in silver serving pieces.

Though the partners don't travel as great a distance to play as they once did, they remain active golfers and try to play at least once a week.

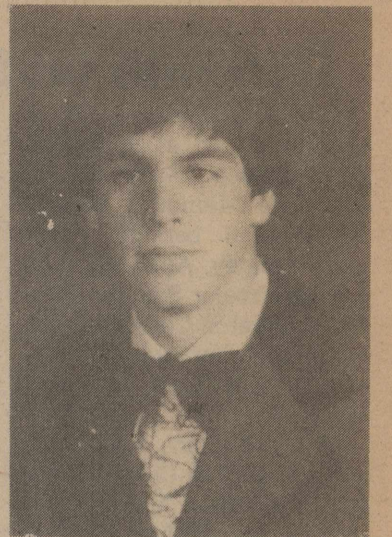

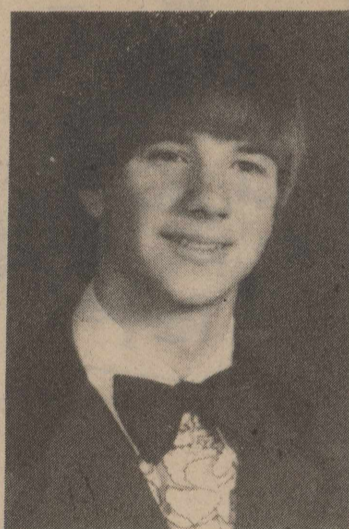


