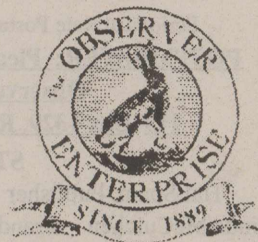

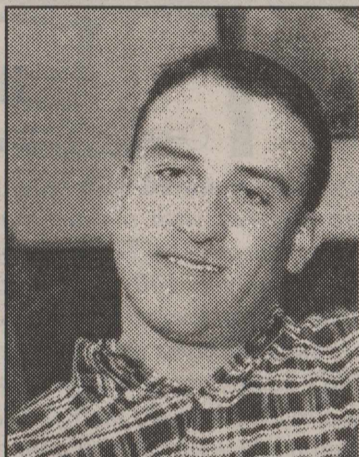

Search continues for missing Midland man

The search for Jon Paul Shadden, a missing Midland resident, continued this past Saturday, June 23, at Lake Spence. Shadden, 36, a father of four, was reported missing on June 12 by his wife after he failed to show up at work. He had spent the weekend at his trailer home at Wildcat Marina on Lake Spence. Officials reported that he was last seen on June 9.

The search began on Tuesday night, June 12, and continued throughout the day on Wednesday, June 13. The Coke County Sheriff's Department was assisted by search dogs from the Texas Department of Corrections Unit at Colorado City, along with a sonar-equipped boat supplied by Texas Parks and Wildlife, a DPS helicopter, and county CERT team members.

The DPS helicopter was called in again to assist in this latest effort.

The only positive aspect of the search so far involved a search dog that tracked Shadden's scent to the edge of the Lake Spence on June 13. However, the sonar-equipped boats found nothing to suggest that the man's body might be in the reservoir.

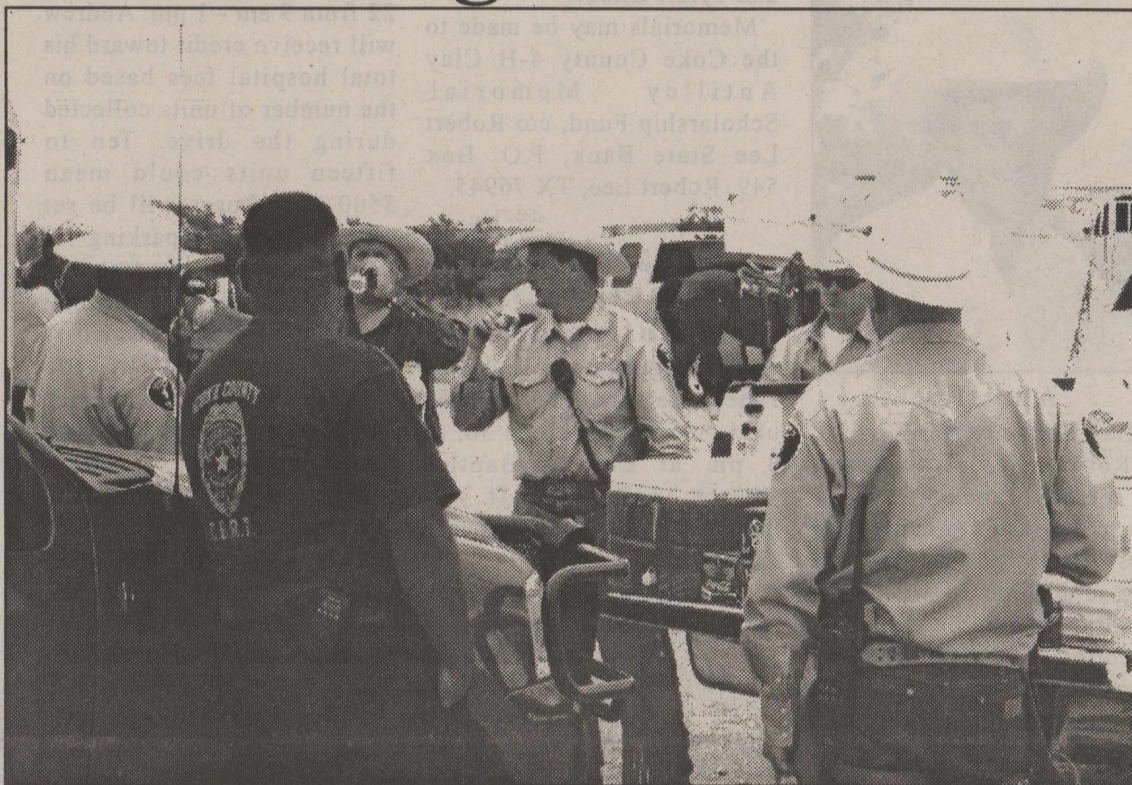
The latest combined effort was conducted this past Saturday, which involved a very extensive search of the land area around Wildcat Marina. Mounted patrol from the Midland County Sheriff's Office (19 officers), and the Howard County Sheriff's Office (2 officers), and other deputies from Ward County (2), and Winkler County (2), conducted an extensive search of the area around Wildcat for the missing man.

As of Monday, June 25, the Coke County Sheriff's Department has no plans for further investigation until some more leads surface. Anyone with information on the missing man is asked to contact the Coke County Sheriff's Office at 453-2717.

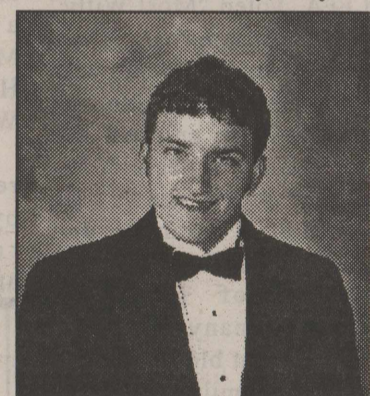
Holiday Closings

City Officials would like to remind residents that fireworks are banned within the city limits. Any person that violates this ban may be issued a citation and fined.

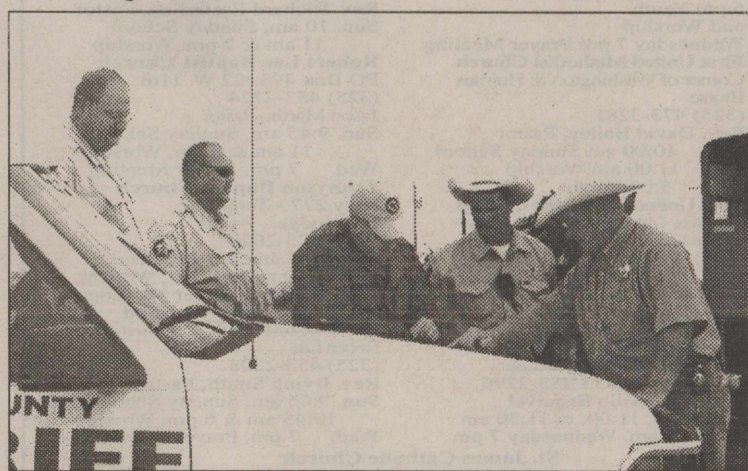
The Coke County Courthouse will also be closed on Wednesday, July 4.



Antilley killed in car wreck

Clay Antilley, 19, formerly of Robert Lee, died in a one-vehicle accident early Tuesday morning, June 26, 2007, according to the Bryan-College Station Eagle newspaper. Antilley was killed when the driver of the pickup in which they were riding failed to negotiate a curve and crashed into a tree. Antilley suffered extensive head injuries and was pronounced dead at the scene.

The driver, Carter Alan Airhart of Lubbock, also 19, and several other passengers were treated and released from St. Joseph Regional Health Center.

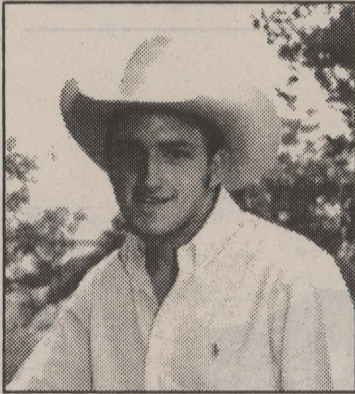

We have some early figures on rainfall totals for the second quarter, and the results are outstanding, depending on where you live

in the county. Wayne and Melinda McCutchen, who live three miles north of Bronte, have reported that they have measured over 28 inches of rainfall since the first of the year. It should be noted that these figures are as of Tuesday, June 26, before we go to press, and thunderstorms are predicted for the next several days.

The Bronte area has been the beneficiary of some abundant storms for the past two weeks that dumped up to six inches on the eastern half of the county, causing Elm Creek to flood the Ballinger area. That good fortune did not extend southward to the Tennyson area, or west to

Robert Lee. Reports from the Robert Lee area for the past two weeks range from just a trace to between one and two inches of rainfall. Marshall Millican, who lives two miles west of Robert Lee on Hwy 158, has reported sixteen inches for the year so far.

Wherever you live in the county, the rainfall numbers are way up from last year at this time, when our recorders throughout the county totaled from 6 to 9 1/2 inches for the first half of 2006. We are looking forward to the exact figures from throughout the county for the first half of 2007. We should be able to go to press with the new totals in a couple of weeks.
