Bake Sale slated for Monday

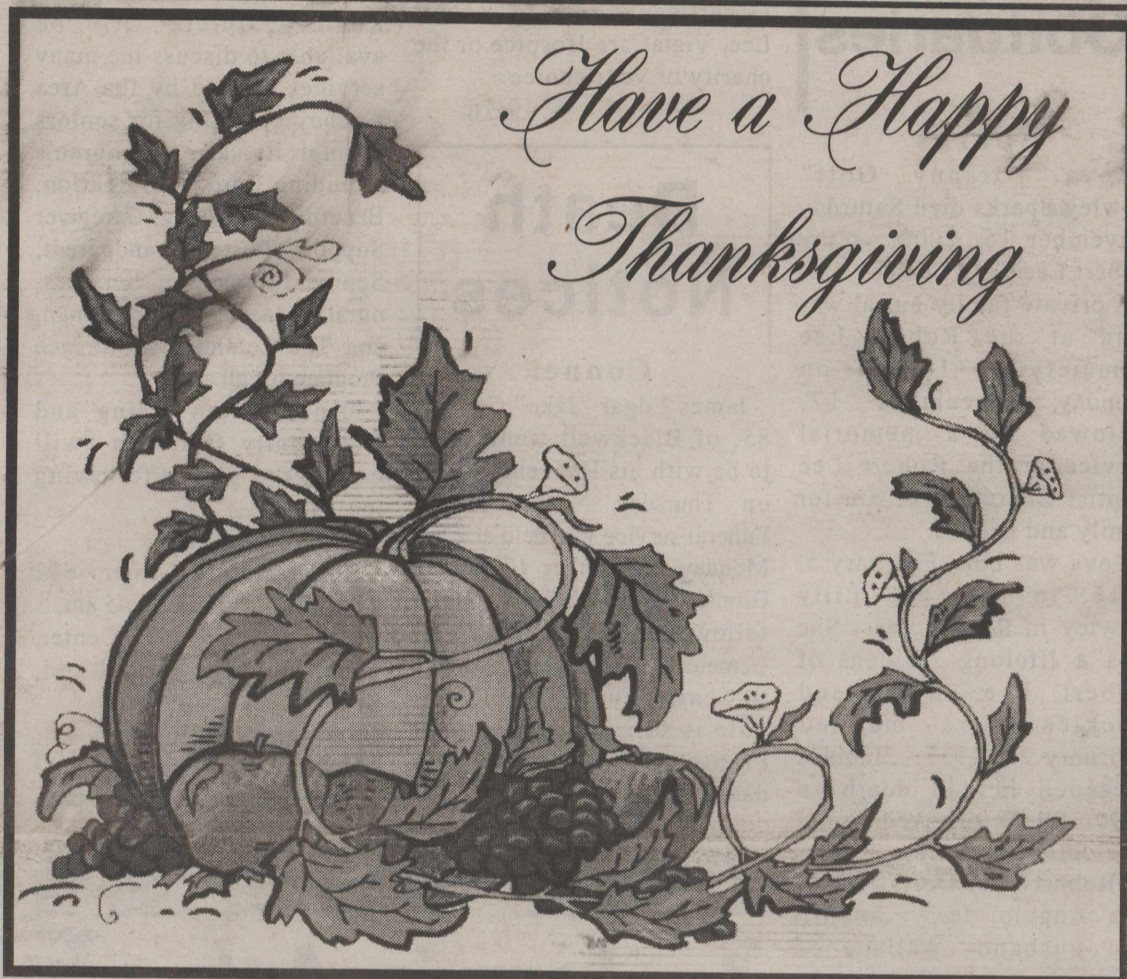

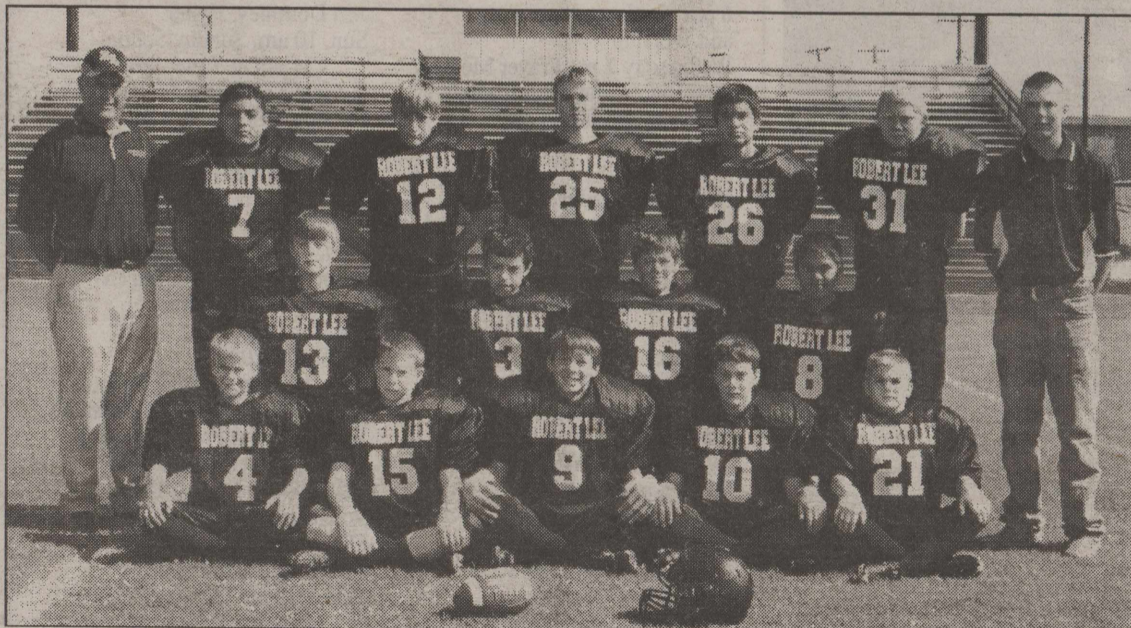

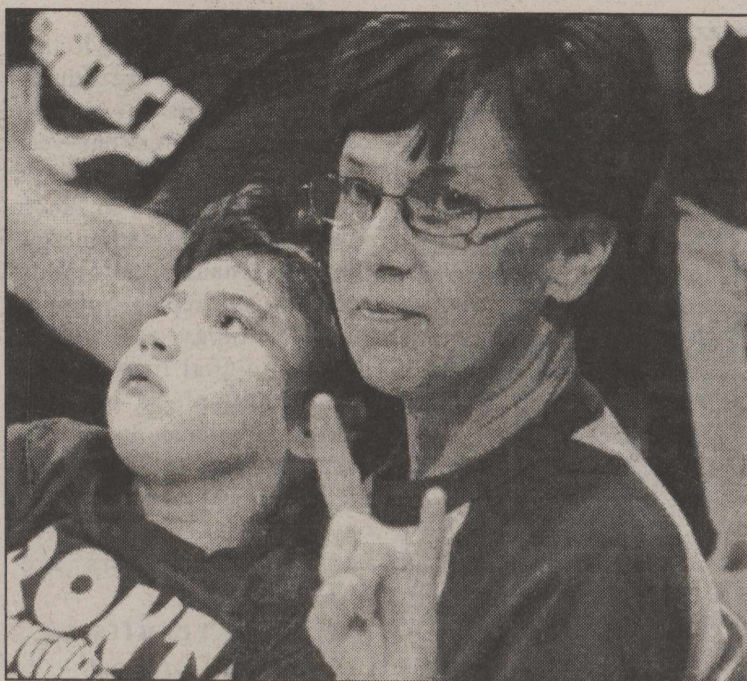
'64 Study Club has Thanksgiving

holidays.

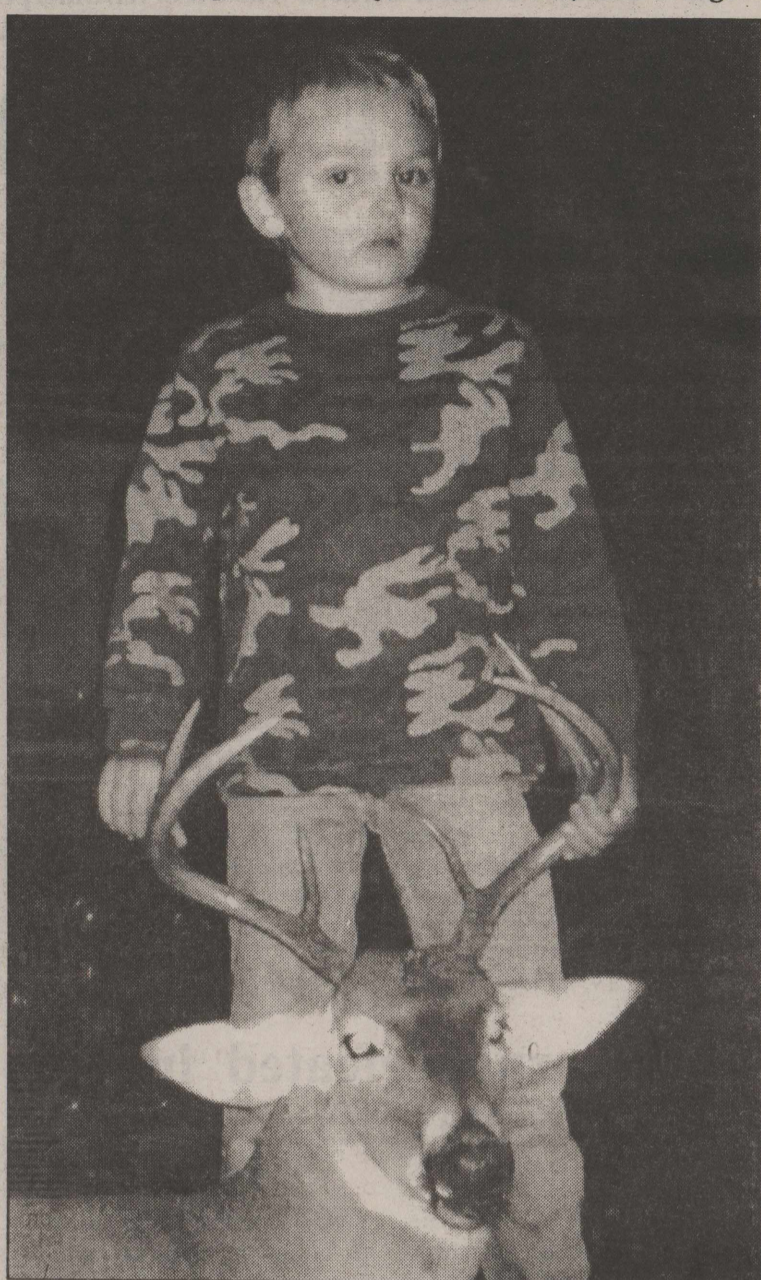
The auxiliary voted to purchase Fold-up Portable Digital Wheelchair Scales and an ad in the 2008-2009 Bronte ISD yearbooks.

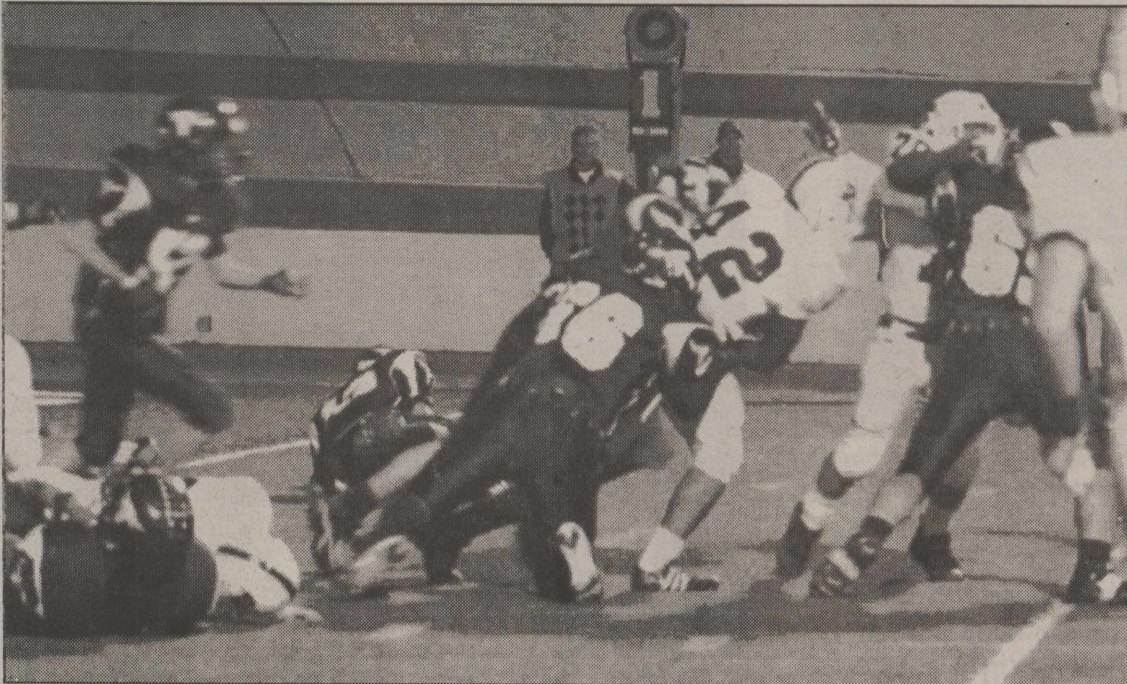

Longhorn Football! The Longhorns season came to a close this past Friday night, November 14, as the Horns took on the Roscoe Plowboys in the first round of the post season.

Longhorns defeated in first round of playoffs

The Bronte Longhorns, runner-up in district 12-A were defeated by 11-A Champion Roscoe Plowboys pretty handily last Friday by a score of 55-14. Although the spread of points is pretty high, it was due to short fielding ourselves and turnovers. The Horns were not able to capitalize in the first quarter and retain momentum.

Roscoe took the opening kickoff and promptly marched down and scored. The Longhorns responded with a nice 65 yard drive of their own. Dakota

Rawls completed a 30 yard pass to Louie Martinez to give the Horns good field position at the Plowboy 30 yard line. The Horns drove to the 14 where the drive stalled. Ernesto Casillas field goal attempt was just wide of the goal post. The six minute drive closed out the first quarter which was great because all week long we talked about scoring opportunities, controlling the clock, limiting their offensive plays with our offense. Although we didn't score, it was still fruitful.

With 8 minutes left until halftime, and facing 3rd and 15, the Plowboys connected on a 38 yard pass from Jacob Villanueva to his twin brother in the left corner of the end zone to increase their lead to 14-0. The Plowboys would take a 21-0 lead into the half as they found the end zone once again with :50 seconds remaining in the second quarter.

We talked at halftime about regrouping and changing the game plan a little. We knew we had the ball to start the second half and what we needed to do to get back in to the game. The third quarter was our worst of the season. Things started out bad and simply got worse. We turned the ball over to the Plowboys on our next five pos-

sessions and they turned those into 27 points and that blew the game wide open. Five turnovers in a game is not a stat you want, but to do that in a span of 8 offensive plays and one quarter put the game out of reach for the Horns.

Bronte was able to get on the board late in the contest as Louie Martinez scored on a one yard run and a six yard run. Ernesto Casillas booted both PAT's and the final score was 55-14. We ended up on the short side of the stick in this one. We didn't play error free football against a veteran team like Roscoe, and it cost us our worst defeat of the year.

I am very proud of the way the kids played all season. I thought the guys were very coach-able and that as the season progressed we were improving little by little. As all teams do, we had to overcome adversity week to week and we were able to string 8 wins together in a row. The big test was last week and I thought our kids responded well giving Albany a run for the money in the District Championship game. Special thanks to our Senior class for leading this year's team. Although few in numbers, they were big in heart and will be missed.

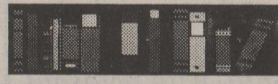

PROJECT BUDGET: TXCDBG-\$200,000.00

TOTAL PROJECT BUDGET \$210,009.75

PROJECT DESCRIPTION: Construction shall consist of the installation of approximately 3,600 linear feet of six-inch and eight-inch water lines, seven fire hydrants, service reconstructions, two distribution system pumps, and two check valves, and associated appurtenances.

PROJECT LOCATION: The construction activities will take place on Jackson Street, Jefferson Street, West Railroad Street, East Railroad Street, McDowell Street, Trammel Avenue and Washington Street. The line to be replaced at the creek crossing is 1.5 miles north of town. The distribution pumps and valves will be installed at the pump station located at the intersection of Jackson and Washington Streets.

Finding of No Significant Impact
It has been determined that such a request of release of funds will not constitute an action significantly affecting the quality of the human environment and accordingly the City of Bronte has decided not to prepare an Environmental Impact Statement under the National Environmental Policy Act of 1969 (P.L. 91-190). The reason for such a decision not to prepare such a Statement is based upon the fact that all environmental concerns could either be minimized or mitigated. An Environmental Review Record for the proposed project has been made by the City of Bronte which documents the environmental review of the project and more fully sets forth the reasons why such a statement is not required. The Environmental Review Record is on file at the Office of Rural Community Affairs and the Bronte City Hall and is available for public examination and copying upon request, at the City Hall office during normal business hours.

Public Comments on Findings
All interested agencies, groups and persons, disagreeing with this decision are invited to submit written comments to the Bronte City Secretary for consideration by the City to the address as set forth above. Such written comments must be received at the address specified within sixteen (16) days after this publication. All such comments so received will be considered and the City will not request the release of funds or take administrative action on the project prior to the date specified in the preceding sentence.

Release of Funds
The City of Bronte will undertake the activities described above with Community Development Block Grant funds under Title 1 from its Program Year 2008 under grant numbered 728020 from the Housing and Community Development Act of 1974. The City of Bronte is certifying to ORCA that Gerald Sandusky in his official capacity as Mayor consents to accept the jurisdiction of the Federal Courts if an action is brought to enforce responsibilities in relation to environmental reviews, decision-making and action; and that these

responsibilities have been satisfied. The legal effect of the certification is that upon its approval, the City of Bronte may use the Block Grant funds and it will have satisfied its responsibilities under the National Environmental Policy Act of 1969. ORCA will accept an objection to its approval only on one or more of the bases and the procedures described in 24 CFR Part 58.75. Objections are to be addressed to the Office of Rural Community Affairs, P.O. Box 12877, Austin, Texas 78711.

Objections to the release of funds on bases other than those stated above will not be considered by the ORCA. No objections received later than thirty-three (33) days after this publication will be considered by ORCA.
