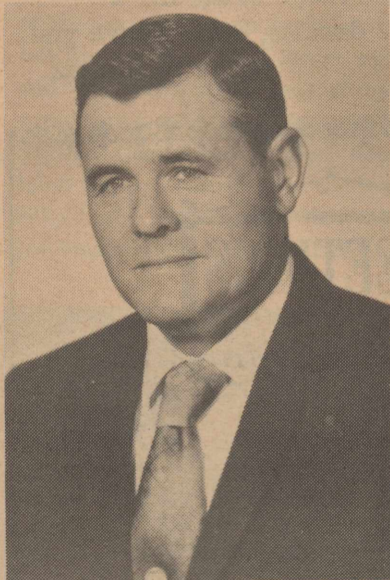

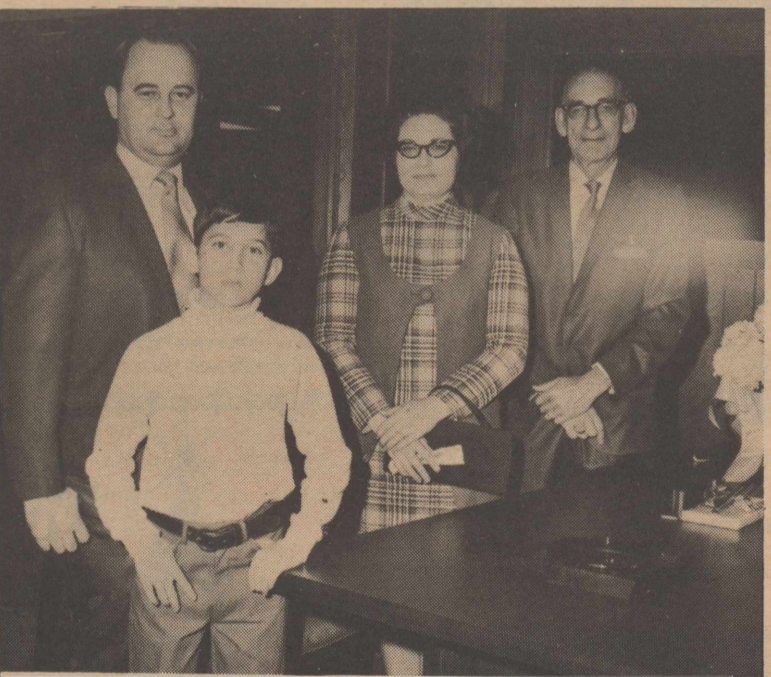

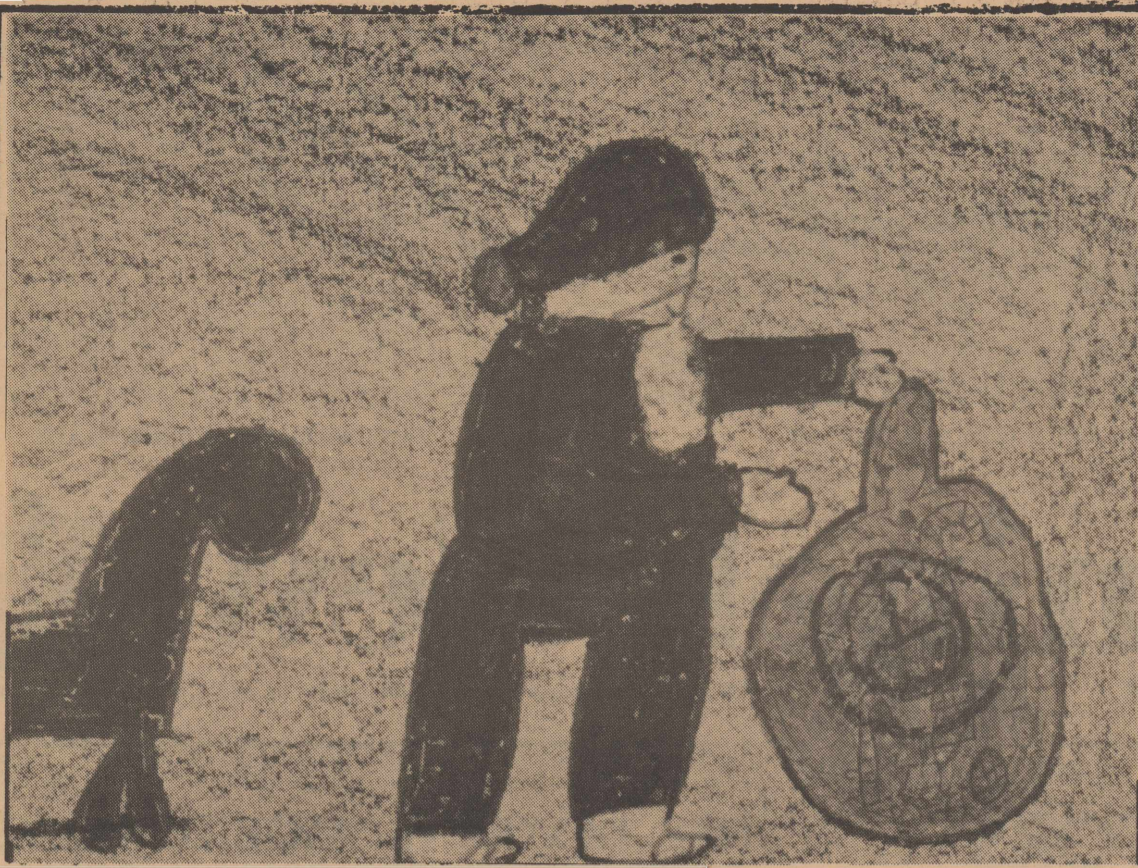
POLICE REPORT

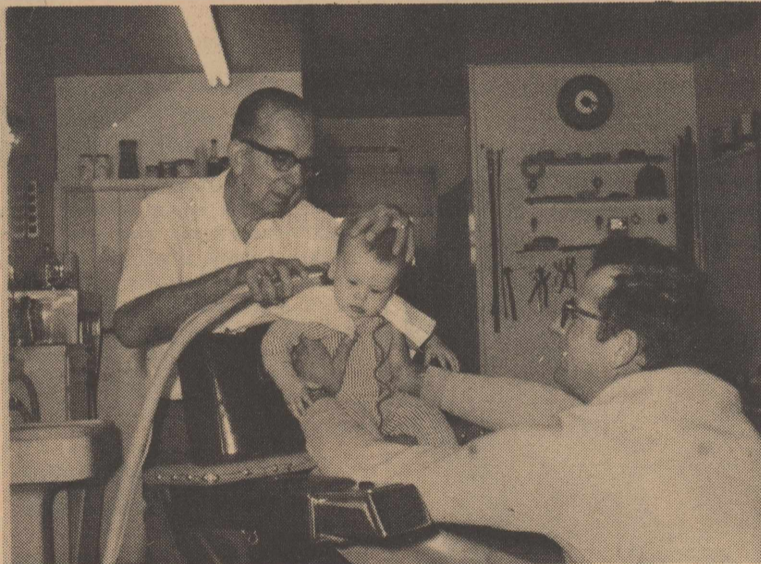

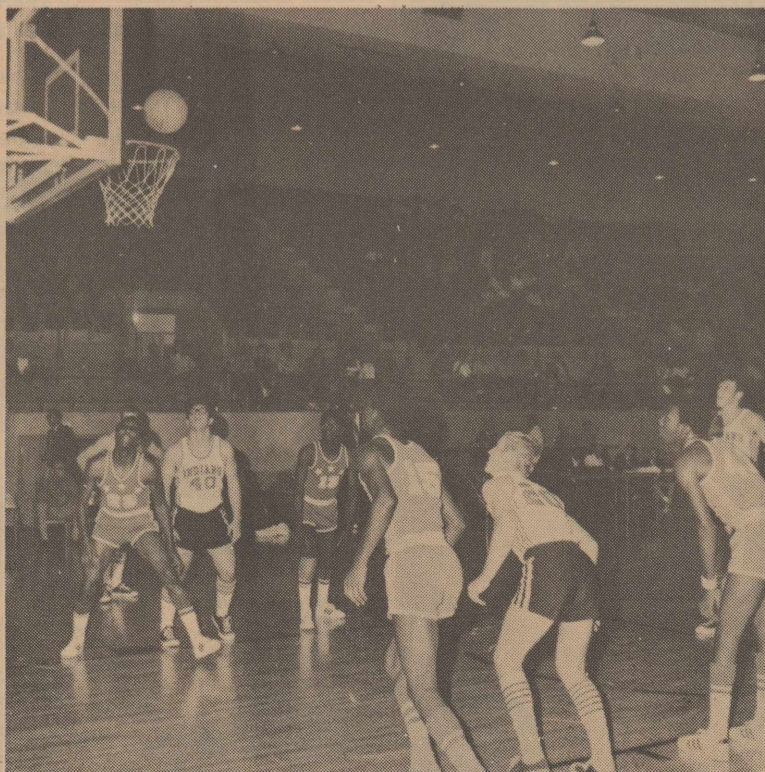
Dear Santa Claus,

From a very, very small beginning five years ago the Seminole Public Schools Federal Credit Union has grown to well over 100,000 shares. Presently the organization is growing between \$2000 and \$3000 per on month. As of November 26, 1969 the organization listed \$104,193.22 in total assets.

One hundred eleven loans have been made thus far this year and since its inception 504 loans have been made. The organization has 228 accounts.

ORDINANCE NO. 122

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY
OF SEMINOLE, TEXAS, DEFIN-
ING "JUNKED VEHICLES" DE-

PROVIDING FOR THE ASSES-
MENT OF COSTS OF ABATE-
MENT IN CERTAIN CIRCUM-
STANCES, PROVIDING FOR
THE FIXING OF A LIEN FOR
THE COSTS OF ABATEMENT,
AND PROVIDING FOR THE

Christmas 1920

Christmas 1919 or 1920. The above residence at 312 S. W. 2nd Street is the home of the A. L. Duffs. The Duffs moved to Seminole in 1918 and bought the house in 1923 from Andy Williams, a Gaines County rancher, the father of Monte and Jiggs Williams. The home was built in 1919 by Williams, the lumber being freighted in from Stanton, Texas. "I don't remember how much we paid for the house. I thought maybe as much as \$7000 but Son Duff (Arthur L., Albuquerque, New Mexico) and Joe Dennis (our foster son) said it was more like \$3000. Mr. Duff and I taught school in Benjamin for several years, then Paducah and then to Seminole in 1918. I taught the third and fourth grade. Mr. Duff taught in high school."

Mrs. Duff went on to tell that the oldest Chinese elm in the county was put out by a county agent. The elm can still be seen in the front yard. Seen also in the front yard are poplar trees put out by Mr. Williams. "There were arborvitae, two mulberry trees and some red honeysuckles. Also there was an orchard on the north side. The house had three bedrooms on the south, a living room, dining room, kitchen and bath. There were French glass doors between the living room and the dining room. Since that time we added another room on the north and took in a part of the porch for closets. We lived in a yellow house that was the old Presbyterian manse (parsonage), catty-cornered across the street before we bought the house."

When the Duffs bought the house water was piped into the kitchen. There was a small bathroom and a bath tub (water was not piped to the bathroom). "The bath tub had been moved from the ranch and some said it was the oldest tub in the country." The water system was from a well equipped with a storage tank and an eclipse mill. Notice other windmills in the picture, one behind the present Joe Dennis residence down the street and the other what is probably the old Carroll Cobb residence, seen in the picture behind the Duff house and one block west of the Dennis house. Of interest on the mill are the two tail fans, one large and one small. The big fan was to keep the mill headed into the wind, the smaller fan to help throw the mill out of the path of the wind in case of an extremely strong blowing gale. This picture is truly West Texas with the windmills. The third mill that's seen might be the one belonging to the school.

The story would not be complete without mentioning the automobile out front. No doubt the air conditioning was outstanding this time of the year. The fence had wire around the lower part of it with a board on top. "Oh yes, we kept a cow. We had chickens and a garden. The water from the mill ran through a cooler and we had such a nice place to keep our milk, butter and eggs."

The brick flues seen coming through the top of the house were not fireplaces but furnished an escape for coal burning stoves. Outstanding in the past years at the Duff home has been the rose garden in the back and Mrs. Duff's antique china collection.

COTTON TRANSFERS DEADLINE NEAR

APPLICATIONS FOR TRANSFER OF COTTON ALLOTMENTS FOR THE 1970 CROP MUST BE FILED NO LATER THAN DECEMBER 31, 1969, ACCORDING TO TROY MARTIN, CHAIRMAN OF THE GAINES COUNTY AGRICULTURAL STABILIZATION AND CONSERVATION (ASC) COMMITTEE. HE REPORTED THAT FARM ALLOTMENT AND PROJECTED YIELD NOTICES HAVE BEEN MAILED TO FARM OPERATORS SO THEY ARE NOW ABLE TO MAKE PRODUCTION PLANS FOR NEXT YEAR.

IN GAINES COUNTY, GROWERS VOTING IN A SPECIAL REFERENDUM LAST MAY APPROVED TRANSFER OF COTTON ACREAGE ALLOTMENTS, BY SALE OR LEASE, OUT OF THE COUNTY. SO TRANSFER ALLOTMENTS LOCALLY MAY BE MADE FROM ONE FARM TO ANOTHER WITHIN THE STATE. COTTON ALLOTMENTS MAY NOT BE TRANSFERRED ACROSS STATES LINES.

TRANSFERS OF ALLOTMENTS BETWEEN FARMS WITHIN THE COUNTY AND FROM A FARM OWNED OR OPERATED BY THE SAME INDIVIDUAL ARE NOT SUBJECT TO REFERENDUM APPROVAL, HOWEVER, SUCH ALLOTMENT TRANSFERS MUST BE FILED WITH THE COUNTY ASCS OFFICE BEFORE THE DECEMBER 31, DEADLINE.

THE DECEMBER 31 DEADLINE THEREFORE APPLIES TO ALL TRANSFERS OF 1970 COTTON ALLOTMENTS FOR GAINES COUNTY FARMS—WHETHER BY SALE, LEASE, OR BY THE OWNER.

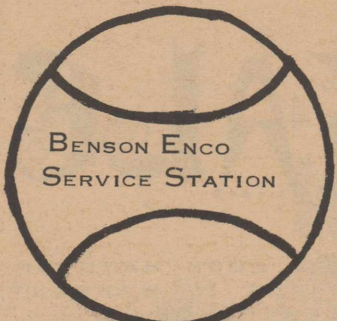
The Indians had 4 seconds to get the ball down for a last shot but never got a shot away. Final score Snyder 53-Seminole 52.

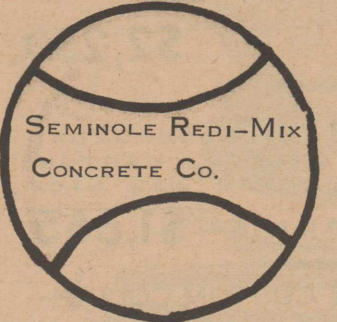
In the Hereford game he was followed by Livingston in the scoring column with 16, Donohoe with 5, Henderson and Whisenhunt 3 each and Walker 1.
