Irunning a miter saw in your kitchen
Yep, I got just such saw Yep, I got just such a saw for Christmas. Think glo-
rified chop saw. It creates sawdust with each cut. Buzz.
 Those little bags don't quite work floor sweep.
There you have it. Two terms you don't hear There you have it. Two terms you don't
that often: cook stove and floor sweep The reason I said "cook stove" was because HANABA didn't want to say "Kitchen range" and thereby MUNN use the word "kitchen" twice in one sentence, WELCH days because "range" sounds classier. When I was a child, the word "range" confused me,
My mother lovingly referred to our cook stove as the Chambers range, proud to have such a fine brand-name cook stove. I knew the song "Home on the Range." Even-
tually I decided "range" had a range of meanings, two of which I knew. As for floor sweep, in case you dont know, it's trashy
stuff you toss on a floor to make it easier to sweep up the real trash and dirt. I'm not a professional floor sweeper,
but I grew up hearing about floor sweep from my parents, who were also not professional floor sweepers, but they
knew some.
Back in the day, meaning the 1930s, my mother and father
