A heart for the community

Roland settling into new role as Head Chaplain with Emergency Services Chaplain Corps

In March, Joel Miller, longtime Head Chaplain with the local Emergency Services Chaplain Corps, retired, and left Chaplain Jacqueline Roland in charge of the non-profit organization.

Since then, she's stayed the course while bringing her own

touch to the role, but said her biggest need right now is more chaplains to serve the people of Howard County.

"Other than needing chaplains, everything seems to be settling in. After Chaplain Miller retired – he was here 17 years – so for someone to try to step into his shoes is almost like trying to turn an aircraft carrier. People are just so used to him, and I'm not him," Roland said. "I am who I am. I'm doing everything according to the Chaplaincy, just trying to reach out."

Helping the local community, and especially first responders, is all part of the job for Roland, she said.

"My heart is for communities, and my heart is for our she said. "I don't think people realize what they go through. So my heart has really kind of grown an extra leg, so to speak, for them. Trying to communicate with them and meet their

needs, as well as the community." In fact, Roland said she's taken supporting first responders

as a big part of her job.

"We did lunch for our police officers. I've been a chaplain for eight years, and this is the first time I stepped into this

role. I've always wanted to feed our fire department. That would be an understatement," she said. "We served each station once a week. We went and we took a meal, and it was big enough for all three shifts, and everyone got their portion. From Station 1 all the way to Station 5 for five weeks, we got to see our fire department and spend time with them, and that was a blessing for us. Of course, then we also did our law officers. We did a fundraiser and an auction raise funds, and it raised funds for the United Way. We're connected with

help the Salvation Army out with its Angel Tree program this holiday season, she said.

Of course, the biggest part of the Chaplain job is supporting those who need a spiritual hand in times of crisis.

"Just trying to reach out and be there for people. We've had several calls to the ER and several calls to ICU," she said. "That's where it comes in, being present and being on the spiritual side of things. You can listen with your heart and be able to help people, even without saying anything. It's pretty intense sometimes, but it's so rewarding."

So are you interested in becoming a chaplain? There are a few job requirements for the position, Roland said.

"Basically, of course, have a relationship with the Lord Jesus. There's a lot of spiritual counseling and prayer that goes into what we do, and if you don't have any idea how to do that, then we may have a problem," she said. "Besides that, a heart for the community, a heart for law forcement. That's first and foremost."

Having time to perform the unpaid, volunteer duty - and the training - is required as well.

"Semi-retired. Or, they have a business of their own that they can leave if they are called out. Or retired," Roland said. "If you're not available, it's kind of hard. And be available for the 32 hours of training. That's set up in the morning time between 9 and 11:30. They can come in one day, two days, up to five days a week. It depends on how fast they want to become a chaplain. It doesn't matter, male or female, yellow, black or white."

Roland has lived in the Big Spring area since 1990, she said.

"I moved here in 1990 from Sweetwater, then I moved to Tulsa, Okla., and went to Bible School for three years," she said. "On the fourth year, I moved back and that was from 2000-2004. I am a member, have been a member for 25+ years, to Life Church. It used to be the Miracle Revival Center."

The Emergency Services Chaplain Corps is a local non-profit organization made up of ordained

cnaplains, licensed clergy, and laity who train to be available to serve Public Service Departments, such as law enforcement and first responders. It was created in 2004 by the recently retired Chaplain Joel Miller. Since then, the organization has grown to also serve county employees, Victim Services, Scenic Mountain Medical Center personnel, and families and citizens of Big Spring and Howard County. They also offer their services to stranded

motorists passing through the area.

players show a lack of respect for safety plays. What is particularly annoying about this attitude is that their casual disrespect usually doesn't cost them a blessed farthing because the remote situation that they should be trying to protect against seldom occurs.

However, lightning sometimes does strike, and when that happens, these players often wind up bemoaning their fate. For example, consider this deal where South gets to six spades and sees — or should

can be lost is if he loses two trump

So, instead of dismissing this "remote" possibility, South should instead concentrate all his thoughts on how to overcome a 4-0 trump division, if that unlikely distribution happens to exist.

Accordingly, he should win the diamond lead in dummy and return a low trump. When East follows with the six, South should play the seven, being perfectly willing to lose the trick to the nine, ten or queen in order to assure the slam beyond the shadow of a doubt.

In the actual deal, the safety play pays off, and South avoids going down one. Playing the ace on the first trump lead would be correct if East produced the nine, ten or queen at trick two, or if East showed out on the first trump lead. In all of these cases, South could then limit himself to either one trump loser or none with proper play. (In the actual case, if East played the nine or ten, South would next lead a spade to the jack and later finesse against East to hold himself to one trump loser.)

This frame of mind — where declarer hopes for the best but prepares for the worst — is often crucial to achieving a favorable result. There is no good reason to incur an unfavorable outcome that could have been avoided.

In 1976, Spain's parliar the 322nd day of 2021. There are 43 days left in the year.

Today's Highlight in History:

On Nov. 18, 1991, Shiite (SHEE'-eyet) Muslim kidnappers in Lebanon freed Anglican Church envoy Terry Waite and Thomas Sutherland, the American dean of agriculture at the American University of Beirut.

On this date:

In 1883, the United States and Canada adopted a system of Standard Time zones.

In 1963, the Bell System introduced the first commercial touch-tone telephone system in Carnegie and Greensburg, Pennsylvania.

In 1966, U.S. Roman Catholic bishops did away with the rule against eating meat on Fridays outside of Lent.

In 1976, Spain's parliament approved a bill to establish a democracy after 37 years of dictatorship.

In 1978, U.S. Rep. Leo J. Ryan, D-Calif., and four others were killed in Jonestown, Guyana, by members of the Peoples Temple; the killings were followed by a night of mass murder and suicide by more than 900 cult members. In 1987, the congressional

Iran-Contra committees issued their final report, saying President Ronald Reagan bore "ultimate responsibility" for wrongdoing by his aides. A fire at London King's Cross reilway tottion ching's Cross railway station claimed 31

In 1999, 12 people were killed when a bonfire under construction at Texas A-and-M University collapsed. A jury in Jasper, Texas, convicted Shawn Allen Berry of murder for his role in the dragging

death of James Byrd Jr., but spared him the death penalty.

In 2003, the Massachusetts Supreme Judicial Court ruled 4-to-3 that the state constitution guaranteed gay couples the right to marry.

In 2004, Former President

Bill Clinton's library opened in Little Rock, Arkansas; in attendance were President George W. Bush, former President George H.W. Bush and former President Jimmy Carter. Former Ku Klux Klansman Bobby Frank Cherry, convicted of killing four black girls in the racially motivated bombing of a Birmingham, Alabama, church in 1963, died in prison at age

In 2005, eight months after Robert Blake was acquitted at a criminal trial of murdering his wife, a civil jury decided the actor was behind the slaying and ordered him to pay Bonny Lee Bakley's children \$30 million.

<u>In 2009, two days before</u>

turning 92, Sen. Robert C. Byrd, D-W.Va., set a record for longest-serving lawmaker in congressional history at 56 years, 320 days. (That record was broken in 2013 by U.S Rep. John Dingell, D-Mich.)

In 2013, Toronto's city council voted to strip scandalplagued Mayor Rob Ford of many of his powers following a heated debate in which he knocked over a city councilor.

Ten years ago: In an incident that prompted national outrage, campus police at the University of California, Davis used pepper spray on nonviolent Occupy protesters. (The school later agreed to pay \$1 million to settle a lawsuit filed by the demonstrators.) Selfhelp author James Arthur Ray was sentenced to two years in prison for leading an Arizona sweat lodge ceremony that was supposed to offer spiritual enlightenment but instead resulted in three deaths.

Five years ago: President-elect Donald Trump signaled a


sharp policy shift to the right by picking Alabama Sen. Jeff Sessions as attorney general, Kansas Rep. Mike Pompeo to head the CIA and Michael Flynn as his national security

One year ago: President Donald Trump filed for a recount of Wisconsin's two largest Democratic counties paying the required \$3 million cost and alleging that they were the sites of the "worst irregularities" although no evidence of illegal activity had been presented. (The recounts resulted in a slightly larger lead for Democrat Joe Biden.) House Democrats nominated Nancy Pelosi to be the speaker who would guide them in the new Congress with Joe Biden in the White House. Pfizer said new test results showed its coronavirus vaccine was safe and 95% effective, and that it protected older people most at risk of dying. The Federal Aviation Administration cleared Boeing's 737 Max for flight; regulators around the world had grounded the Max

in March 2019 after a pair of deadly crashes. The Minnesota Timberwolves selected Georgia freshman guard Anthony Edwards with the No. 1 pick in the delayed NBA draft.



The Howard College Hawks snapped a two game losing streak in fine form Wednesday night by whipping the Loyalty Prep Mustangs 94-26 at Dorothy Garrett Coliseum.

The Hawks, 7-2 for the season, returned the the confines of home after going 1-2 on a three game road trip, dropping a 67-59 decision to Panola and losing to Weatherford College 66-54. This night however belonged to Hawks. Using a tight man-to-man defense coupled with occasional full court pressure, Howard simply overwhelmed Loyalty Tech, who appeared fatigued from the start. Tech had dropped a 79-60 decision to Western Texas Tuesday night.

Mustangs coach Enriue Juarez said he was totally disgusted with his team's effort. "What you saw tonight was a team not willing to play," he said. "These kids didn't want to play tonight and it showed. These kids now days want everything handed to them on a plate. They have to learn to work for it."

The Howard defense was relentless forcing 25 Tech turnovers, resulting in 37 Howard points. Howard scored the first 13 points of the game, Tech's first basket came with 14;40 left in the half. By halftime Howard held a commanding 47-8 lead.

After those three road games Howard coach Scott Raines said he was glad his team had some pep in its step. "We played really flat last night (against Weatherford) and we didn't get back home until 2 a.m. We played well tonight, really good defense and I loved the way we shared the ball. We had 24 assists and that's always good. We made this team look worse than they are. They played Western Texas a pretty good game Tuesday night."

The Hawks placed five people in double figures, led by Rahkiem Patterson with 15 points. Jacoby Bishop was next with 14. Guards Blaize Sagna and D'Mari Wiltz each dished seven assists in the

The Hawks will be on the road Sunday in Levelland against Monroe College at 1 p.m. Their next home game will be Tuesday at 7 p.m. against Ranger, the second game of a doubleheader. The Lady Hawks play Ranger in the opening game.
