



Wednesday Sports in Brief

OLYMPICS

GENEVA — The president of the International Olympic Committee did his best to stay neutral Wednesday as Canada, Britain and Australia followed the United States in announcing diplomatic boycotts of the Winter Games in Beijing.

Thomas Bach, who has led the body through a series of problematic Olympic preparations since taking over in 2013, tried to spin the diplomatic snub into a positive by noting each country is allowing its athletes and teams to compete in Beijing.

Tiger Woods is returning to some form of competition.

He says he will be playing next weekend in Orlando, Florida, at the PNC Championship with 12-year-old son Charlie.

The PNC Championship is a 36-hole event involving family members.

It will have been 298 days since Woods' right leg was badly damaged when his speeding car went through a median and rolled down a hill on a road in the Los Angeles suburbs.

Woods was hitting balls last weekend in the Bahamas during his Hero World Challenge. He said he might play the odd "hit-and-giggle" event. This would be one of them.

CHICAGO — Chicago Blackhawks forward Jujhar Khaira spent the night in a hospital after he was leveled by Jacob Trouba during a 6-2 loss to

MLEBOURNE, Australia — Not long after Serena Williams' name was absent from the entry list for the Australian Open, she confirmed the obvious: the seven-time champion won't play the 2022 edition of the season-opening major in January.

The 40-year-old Williams hasn't played since retiring from her first-round match at Wimbledon with a right hamstring injury and her ranking has slipped to No. 41. She won the last of her 23 Grand Slam singles titles at the 2017 Australian Open, and was beaten in the semifinals this year by Naomi Osaka in straight sets.

The Australian Open's website Wednesday said the seven-time women's singles champion would not compete in Melbourne "following advice from her medical team."

WHITE PLAINS, N.Y. — Michael Dowse is resigning as CEO of the U.S. Tennis Association after about two years in the position, during which the coronavirus pandemic led to a zero-spectators U.S. Open in 2020 and an increase in participation in the sport.

The USTA announced Wednesday that Dowse is stepping down effective March 1.

He was hired to lead the governing body of tennis in the United States in October 2019 and his tenure began the following January.



West cannot continue diamonds without allowing dummy's ten to become a trick, while if West switches to another suit, declarer has time to establish dummy's clubs for a diamond discard.

However, if West ducks the diamond return at trick two, South is helpless. Sooner or later East gains the lead with the king of clubs, and his diamond return allows West to score the A-J for down one.

All of which brings us back to the question of how West should know not to take South's king of diamonds with the ace at trick two. The solution lies in which diamond East returns at that point. In the given case, East's proper return is the nine, commonly known as a "top-of-nothing" lead. Since the nine is easy to read as East's highest diamond, West can place South with K-Q. He can then reason that, unless his partner has the king of clubs, the contract cannot be defeated. West therefore refuses to take the first diamond in the hope that East will eventually gain the lead for the killing diamond return. But, if East leads the diamond three at trick two — implying some strength in the suit - West would have no choice but to take his ace and return a diamond, thereby handing declarer the contract.

In 2006, a fire broke out at a Moscow drug treatment hospi tal, killing 46 women trapped by barred windows and a locked gate.

In 2013, scientists revealed that NASA's Curiosity rover had uncovered signs of an ancient freshwater lake on Mars.

Ten years ago: The European Union said 26 of its 27 member countries were open to joining a new treaty tying their finances together to solve the euro crisis; Britain remained opposed. A jury in

New Haven, Connecticut, con-demned Joshua Komisarjevsky (koh-mih-sahr-JEV'-skee) to death for killing a woman and her two daughters during a night of terror in their suburban Cheshire home. (The other defendant in the case, Steven Hayes, had also been condemned to death; both punishments were changed to life in prison after Connecticut abolished the death penalty in 2015.) A fire at a hospital in Kolkata, India, claimed the lives of at least 93 people.


Five years ago: The White House said President Barack Obama had ordered intelligence officials to conduct a broad review of election-season cyberattacks, including the email hacks that rattled the presidential campaign and raised fresh concerns about Russia's meddling in U.S. elections. South Korean lawmakers impeached President Park Geun-ĥye over an explosive corruption scandal, a stunning and swift fall for the country's first female leader.

Thursday, December 9, 2021 One year ago: The U.S. gov-ernment and 48 states and districts sued Facebook, accusing it of abusing its market power in social networking to crush smaller competitors. (A federal judge dismissed the lawsuits in June 2021; federal regulators filed a revised complaint in August.) Commercial flights with Boeing 737 Max jetliners resumed for the first time since they were grounded worldwide nearly two years earlier fol-lowing two deadly accidents; Brazil's Gol Airlines became the first in the world to return the planes to its active fleet. NASA named the 18 astronauts half of them women — who would train for its Artemis moon-landing program.




