
















Another Christmas Story

The choir had arrived and was set to perform, They would sing all the carols and try to stay warm;


Vendors were there and all guests were soon fed, Even the big guy all decked out in red;







National average gas price down 2.9 cents

Texas gas prices rose 0.3 cents per gallon in the past week, averaging \$2.86 per gallon, according to GasBuddy's daily survey of 13,114 stations in Texas. Gas prices in Texas are 14.0 cents per gallon lower than a month ago and stand 95.9 cents per gallon higher than a year ago.

According to GasBuddy price reports, the cheapest station in Texas is priced at \$2.35 while the most expensive is \$3.89 per gallon.

The national average price of gasoline fell 2.9 cents in the last week, averaging \$3.30 per gallon. The national average is down 11.1 cents per gallon from a month ago and stands \$1.09 per gallon higher than a year ago.

"For yet another week, average gasoline prices continue to fall as omicron cases surge, leading oil demand, and thus oil prices, to stall. The decline in gas prices will likely continue until new Covid cases slow down," said Patrick De Haan, head of petroleum analysis for Gas-Buddy.

De Haan continued, "With gas prices very likely to continue declining this week in most states, we may see Christmas gas prices fall just under their all-time high on the holiday, which was \$3.26 in 2013. Beyond Christmas, with omicron cases likely to continue climbing, I do believe we'll see a more noticeable hit on gasoline demand once the holidays are over. There's a rising likelihood that we won't see gas prices rising for the rest of the year- with one caveat- gas prices in the Great Lakes states have plummeted by 30 to 50 cents in some areas, and stations in those areas may raise prices slightly should oil prices slow their decline. Aside from those areas, declines at the pump are likely to continue as we close out 2021."

Southwest Crock Pot Breakfast Casserole

Ingredients

2 tablespoons butter 1 pound bulk breakfast sausage (cooked and drained) 1 onion (chopped) 2 cloves garlic (minced) 1 green bell pepper (chopped) 1 (4-ounce) can chopped green chilies or jalapeño peppers (well drained) 2 1/2 cups Monterey Jack or Pepper Jack cheese (grated) 18 eggs 1 to 2 tablespoons chili powder 1/4 teaspoon cayenne pepper, if desired 1/2 teaspoon salt 1/4 teaspoon black pepper

Ingredients

- *For the Dough:* 1(1/4-ounce) package active dry yeast 1/2 cup warm water, between 110 and 115 F 1/2 cup warm heavy whipping cream, between 110 to 115 F $1/2 \operatorname{cup} \operatorname{sugar}$ 1/2 teaspoon salt 3 to 4 cups all-purpose flour 1 large room temperature egg, beaten 3 tablespoons (1 1/2 -ounces)unsalted butter, melted *For the Filling:* 1/4 cup (2-ounces) unsalted butter, softened 3/4 cup packed brown sugar 2 tablespoons ground cinnamon
- For the Frosting:

Steps to Make It

Grease inside of 5-quart crockpot with butter or spray it with nonstick cooking spray. Starting with sausage, layer the cooked and drained meat, onions, peppers, chilies, and cheese into the slow cooker, repeating the layering process until all of the ingredients are used. In a large mixer bowl, beat the eggs with a wire whisk or eggbeater until combined, then pour over mixture in the crockpot. Cover the slow cooker and cook on low 7 to 8 hours or until the temperature reaches at least 165oF. Serve this recipe immediately with sour cream or fresh salsa. If you have a newer, hotter cooking crockpot, check at 5 1/2 hours. To serve, scoop up portions and serve on warmed plates.

Cinnamon Roll Cake

Steps to Make It

Gather the ingredients. Dissolve the yeast in warm water and whipping cream until foamy. In another bowl, combine the sugar and salt, then add 3 cups of the flour, the yeast mixture, egg, and melted butter. Stir until moistened. Add just enough of the remaining flour to form a soft dough. Turn out the dough onto a lightly-floured surface and knead until smooth and elastic, about 3 or 4 minutes. Place in a greased bowl, turning once to grease top. Cover and let rise in a warm place until doubled, about 30 minutes. Turn out dough onto a lightly floured surface and roll into a 15 x 12-inch rectangle. Spread the softened butter over the dough. Sprinkle with brown sugar and cinnamon. Using a pizza cutter, cut into 2-inch wide strips. Roll up one strip and place in the center of a greased 9-inch round cake pan. Wrap the remaining strips around the center to form one giant roll. Cover with greased foil and let rise until doubled, about 1 hour. Meanwhile, preheat oven to 3500 F. Bake until golden brown, 30 to 40 minutes. If the dough starts browning too quickly, cover lightly with foil. Cool on a wire rack. For the frosting, beat butter, cream cheese, vanilla, and salt until blended. Gradually beat in the confectioners' sugar. Spread over the top of the cooled cinnamon roll cake. Cut into wedges to serve. Enjoy!



Steps to Make It

Gather the ingredients. In a tall glass half-filled with ice cubes, pour the cranberry, orange, and lemon juices. Top with the ginger ale. Garnish with orange and lemon slices. Serve and enjoy. How to Make a Pitcher or Punch Bowl

The cardinal punch is an easy recipe to increase as needed. Simply retain the proportions of 2 parts cranberry, 1/2 part lemon, 1 part orange, and 2 parts ginger ale. When preparing it ahead of time, hold the soda until it's time to serve so your guests can enjoy a fully carbonated drink. To make 1 quart for a pitcher: Combine 12 ounces $(1 \ 1/2 \ cups)$ of cranberry juice, 3 ounces (about 1/3 cup) of lemon juice, 6 ounces (3/4 cup) of orange juice, and 12 ounces of ginger ale. To make 1 gallon for a punch bowl: Measure out 6 cups of cranberry juice, 11/2 cups lemon juice, 3 cups of orange juice, and 6 cups of ginger ale.

State Capital Highlights

State's workforce surpasses pre-pandemic high

The Texas labor market exceeded the previous pre-pandemic high in February 2020 by hitting just under 13 million nonagricultural jobs in November, the Texas Workforce Commission reported last Friday. The adjusted jobless rate was 5.2% last month, down slightly from the previous month.

"Reaching this milestone for job creation in Texas shows the strength of our economy," TWC Chairman Bryan Daniel said.

The Amarillo area had the lowest unemployment rate among Texas Metropolitan Statistical Areas at 3.1%, followed by the Austin-Round Rock MSA at 3.2% and College Station-Bryan at 3.5%.

"Texas continues to reach unprecedented milestones thanks to our unwavering commitment to economic freedom and our young, skilled, growing, and diverse workforce," Gov. Greg Abbott said.

PUC approves electric grid reliability measures

The state Public Utility Commission last week voted unanimously to enhance both short-term and long-term reliability of the state's electric grid through what it termed "major reforms" to the state's wholesale electricity market.

"In prior years, any single one of these changes would have been considered significant. Taken together, they are a generational shift in the Texas electricity market," said Peter Lake, PUC chairman. "This (is) a move away from the crisisbased business model we have operated under for the past two decades. This new model centers on reliability."

Some of the major changes:

• Changes in the mathematical formula used to price electricity when reserves become scarce. The change will provide earlier price signals to add additional generation of power and for large consumers to reduce demand.

• Increasing incentives for large consumers to cut usage when the grid needs additional power.

• New or revamped ancillary services that increase the capacity for generators to react to sudden swings in electricity supply and demand.

Phase two of the process will provide "long-term incentives for investment in reliable power generation infrastructure to ensure Texas will have the power the state's needs for decades," according to the news release.

Count of fatal job injuries for 2020 released

A total of 469 people working in Texas died in work-related incidents in 2020, according to the Texas Department of Insurance. That is a 23% decrease from 2019. The state's incident rate for fatalities was 3.9 per 100,000 full-time employees in 2020, while the national incident rate stood at 3.4.

The construction industry accounted for 27% of the fatalities, with 127 incidents, according to TDI. Fatalities in the transportation and warehousing industries had the second highest, accounting for 20.4% with 96 people killed. Natural resources and mining recorded the third-highest number with 54 fatalities, or 11.5%.

Raising the bar for higher education

The Commissioner of Higher Education said last week the state is raising the bar for higher education. In an address before nearly 200 higher education leaders, Harrison Keller released "an ambitious vision for higher education," according to a news release from the Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board.

The updated strategic plan for the state's higher education system includes:

• Adding a new goal for 35- to 64-yearolds who need new skills to compete in today's economy.

• A broader range of postsecondary credentials of value to fit workforce needs.

• The goal of students having no college debt or at least a low, manageable debt.

• A greater focus on research and development to drive innovation.

• Renewing the state's commitment to advancing equity for all Texans to complete post secondary degrees and certificates.

Keller called the present time "the greatest opportunity since the end of World War II to make an impact in higher education."

"As we emerge from the global pandemic, we arrive at another defining moment in history," he said. "In Texas, the window of opportunity is open for us to work together to advance and enhance this vision for higher education and enrich the lives of generations to come."

Vaccine battle mandate likely headed to Supreme Court

The fight over a federal COVID-19 mandate for companies with more than 100 employees is likely headed to the U.S. Supreme Court after the 6th U.S. Circuit Court of Appeals overruled a lower-court decision that had paused the mandate nationwide. The mandate from the U.S. Occupational Safety and Health Administration is now scheduled to take effect Jan. 4.

Republican state attorneys general in 27 states, including Texas, are suing OSHA over the mandate, joined by conservative groups, business associations and individual businesses, The Dallas Morning News reported.

The Biden administration issued a statement after the appeals court ruling: "Especially as the U.S. faces the highly transmissible Omicron variant, it's critical we move forward with vaccination requirements and protections for workers with the urgency needed in this moment."

Meanwhile, Abbott announced last week that he had sent a letter to U.S. Secretary of Defense Lloyd Austin reaffirming the state would not enforce the mandate on members of the Texas National Guard.

"The state of Texas will not enforce this latest COVID-19 vaccine mandate against its guardsmen," Abbott said. "If the federal government keeps threatening to defund the Texas National Guard, I will deploy every legal tool available to me as governor in defense of these American heroes."

The number of new cases of COVID-19 reported last week stood at 36,508, according to the Coronavirus Resource Center at Johns Hopkins University, down slightly from the previous week, while deaths rose to 478.

The number of law-confirmed CO-VID-19 hospitalizations totaled 3,117 on Sunday, virtually unchanged from the previous week, according to the Texas State Department of Health Services.



Commissioners to address election concerns

Parmer County Commissioners Court met in special session on Tuesday, December 21, 2021 at 10:00 a.m. in the County Courtroom of the Parmer County Courthouse in Farwell, Texas. The meeting began with prayer and the Pledge of Allegiance to the American Flag and Texas Flag. Commissioner Pct. 1 Kirk Frye conducted the meeting.

During the Open Forum portion of the meeting, Izzy Carrasco addressed the Court about issues concerning the upcoming Republican Primary Election.

Minutes from the December 13th meeting were read and approved. Commissioners approved the payment of the accounts payables as presented by County Treasurer Sharon May. The Treasurer's Payroll Report was also approved.

In other business, approval was given for a resolution authorizing Parmer County to join Oldham County and Deaf Smith County in an InterLocal Agreement to form a Multi-County Sexual Assault Response Team (SART). The County Judge would be the authorized representative for the county. Bonds for County Commissioner Pct. 1 and the

County District Clerk Deputy were approved. Approval was also given for a tap on an existing gas line under a county road.

Sheriff Randy Geries reported that he was currently housing 26 inmates in the Parmer County Law Enforcement Center. Of that total, 13 are from Deaf Smith County and costs will be reimbursed for housing those inmates.

Commissioners also met in Executive Session to discuss personnel matters. A Special called meeting of the Commissioners Court was scheduled for Thursday, December 30th at 10:00 a.m. in the County Courtroom.

The Courthouse will be closed from Noon on December 22nd through Friday, December 24th and also on Friday, December 31st.

All meetings are open to the public. The Commissioner's Court reserves the right to go into Executive Session at any time. The agenda may be found on the Parmer County website. Information in this article is only a summary. Any questions concerning specific actions should be directed to the Commissioners Court.

County's existing election precinct boundaries as described in the 2021 Revised Plan, said changes made by the Commissioners Court a result of county commissioner precinct changes made pursuant to the County's 2021 redistricting project, or for the efficiency and convenience in the holding of elections: (1) certain territory in the northwest area was transferred from Election Precinct 303 to Election Precinct 201 in the area of US Highway 60 to Country Road 1 to US Highway 85; (2) certain territory was transferred from Election Precinct 303 in the south area to Election Precinct 201; (3) the territory of Election Precinct 202 was combined with Election Precinct 203; (4) the territory of Election Precinct 301 was combined with Election Precinct 302;(5) Election Precincts 203 and 302 were discontinued since they were combined with other Election Precincts; and (6) Election Precincts 101, 401, and 402 remain unchanged.






Dodgeball Tourney Results





Costs for holiday meals up from last year

Costs for preparing holiday meals will be higher this year as prices for most everyday staples and specialty items used in traditional baking recipes are up, according to a Texas A&M AgriLife Extension Service expert.

David Anderson, Ph.D., AgriLife Extension economist, Bryan-College Station, said U.S. Department of Agriculture retail data and that agency's consumer price index report comparisons of year-overyear trends show costs for most staples are up as the holiday season nears.

Some items like flour, sugar, eggs, potatoes and milk are staples throughout the year, but consumer demand ratchets up during the holidays due to increased baking of traditional fare, Anderson said.

"I think everyone is noticing higher prices on most products, and grocery items are no different," he said. "Right now, we're seeing prices go up on many everyday staple items to specialty items we traditionally prepare for the holidays, so the cost of Thanksgiving lunches and dinners is going to be higher than recent years."

Prices for holiday baking

Sugar prices are up 2.8% compared to this time last year, according to a USDA consumer price index and outlook report. There were no official reports available focused on baking flour, but Anderson suspects extreme drought cutting


yields in major wheat production states by as much as 50% will likely mean higher prices.

Retail egg prices are up 29% to \$1.82 per dozen vs \$1.41 per dozen last year, according to the USDA egg market overview. Consumer demand has been surprisingly low but are expected to pick up heading into Thanksgiving Day, and egg production is down a little over 1% compared to last year.

The price for a gallon of fresh whole milk is up 7.6% to \$3.66 compared to \$3.38 this time last year, Anderson said. Production of total fluid milk was almost the same, and prices for other milk products like cheese, butter and sour cream have changed some, but Anderson said those changes are difficult to quantify.

Wholesale cheddar cheese is down almost 3% to \$5.40 per pound compared to \$5.58 per pound last year, while butter prices were up around 5% per pound. A separate USDA Agriculture Marketing Service report indicates cream availability has been short in central and eastern states.

Subsequently, some butter production

schedules have been hindered by tightened supplies, labor issues and delayed deliveries.

"Feed prices and decreased production are among the top factors driving egg prices up, but then the dip in cheddar prices compared to rising butter prices is a little bit more difficult to say why with the available information," he said.

Vegetable prices up

Pinpointing contributing factors for the mixed bag of price increases and decreases for other holiday staples from potatoes to cranberries is also difficult, Anderson said. Overall, fresh fruits and vegetables are 2.7% higher than last year, according to the USDA consumer price index report.

Reports focused on potatoes show red potatoes were down about 9% to 85 cents per pound compared to 90 cents per pound last year whereas russet potatoes, the typical variety used for mashed potatoes, were relatively unchanged.

Price reports for squash and onions were similarly variety dependent. Butternut and zucchini squash prices were up whereas prices for crooked-neck squash were down 23% based on weighted averages. Prices for sweet and yellow onions were down 4% and 18%, respectively, while the price of red onions was 50% higher.

A 12-ounce bag of cranberries, which are used in traditional holiday side dishes, was up 15% to \$2.14 compared to \$1.86 last year.

"The retail report is a sampling of 2,700 stores and based on price averages across the country, and this mixed bag of price fluctuations could be indicative of a number of factors. It typically goes back to supply and demand, so if prices went down, they likely had a good crop or lower than normal demand, and if the price went up, there might be an issue in production or supply and/or increased demand."






