City Receives Municipal Solid Waste Grant

Administrator, Walton, has announced that the City of Stratford has been tentatively awarded a Municipal Solid Waste Grant in the amount of \$73,735.00 to construct a new Recycling and Baling Center. Final approval by the Texas Natural Resource Conservation Commission should forthcoming within the next 10 days. The projected time-line for this project will have it in operation by June, 1998. The Grant also funds a containerized system of collection of cardboard and other recyclable material. The degree of community support will have a direct effect on stabilizing and hopefully reducing the cost of Municipal Solid Waste collection and disposal by reducing the waste Welcome stream at the point of generation. It is the City's intent to make every effort to assist all businesses in the reduction of the waste stream and separation of recyclable material.
