

Mrs. Luce On Goldwater's Side In Fight

Clare Boothe Luce, former congresswoman and ambassador to Italy, said she is supporting Sen. Barry Goldwater of Arizona for the Republican presidential nomination.

"If Sen. Goldwater has the nomination swept from under him, there will be a very bitter breach in the Republican party and I don't see how it could be healed," she said.

She said she has had a growing conviction for some time that Goldwater is the best man for the GOP to nominate.

"After his victory in the California primary, it became clear to me that Sen. Goldwater was going to be nominated on the first ballot," Mrs. Luce said.

She said the "shameful confusion among the anti-Goldwater people at the Cleveland governors conference" strengthened her conviction to support Goldwater.

"After Gov. (William W.) Scranton of Pennsylvania maintained his deep-freeze position on that (Face the Nation) television program from Cleveland, the ball game was over," she added.

"It behooved me and others who cared for the Republican party to help Sen. Goldwater make a good and sound campaign."

"I then telephoned Sen. Goldwater and told him of my support."

"Gov. Scranton then changed his mind a few days later and announced his candidacy. I had already made my commitment for Sen. Goldwater and I am pleased with it."

Mrs. Luce said Goldwater has "virtues that have not been recognized." She said she admires his "courage, honesty, dignity and enormous patience, particularly in these last few weeks."

"I believe conservatism should be given its chance," Mrs. Luce said in explaining her advocacy of Goldwater. "Let us see what the American people feel about it."

"If he is crushed as so many people think, then the issue will be out of the way—and so will the Republican party."

Mrs. Luce, who said she is a strong supporter of civil rights, doesn't believe Goldwater's vote against the newly enacted bill will be a campaign issue.

Sen. Goldwater says he will uphold the law if he is elected president and so the problem "disappears," she explained. "He is a man of his word."

Screwworms Threaten West Texas

Screwworms are again threatening the livestock industry of West Texas, particularly in the Trans-Pecos region where infestations were discovered late in June.

Eradication workers moved quickly into Pecos County, where two cases were reported on June 29, in an attempt to prevent more infestations from developing.

Sterile screwworm flies, reared in the plant near Mission, are being released by airplanes in the area south of Fort Stockton where the cases were found in cattle castration wounds. Livestock in the immediate area are being sprayed by program inspectors.

Eradication officials expressed concern over appearance of these cases, since this region has a history of heavy screwworm infestation during late summer and early fall. Failure to check this latest outbreak could result in problems later in the season, officials warned.

Only one other screwworm case has been reported in the area this year—in Presidio County in mid-May. The first infestation last year was also in Presidio County, appearing a month earlier.

Livestock producers are encouraged to be on the lookout for infestations in coming weeks, and should immediately report them to eradication headquarters by collecting a sample of 10 or more larvae from infested wounds. Sterile flies cannot be dispersed until a confirmed sample is received, officials stated.

They also urged stockmen to use all precautions in working their animals, using smears to treat wounds caused through surgery or accidents, and using preventive sprays. Solutions of 0.25 percent Co-ral or 0.5 percent Korlan give best protection against screwworm attack, officials said.

Eradicators promised to use all means available to them to control the livestock pest in this area, but emphasized that the full cooperation and assistance of livestock producers is necessary.
