

tutionally elected. Carrying this one step further, you reckon it's possible the Court will rule that each United States Senator has to represent the same number of people and that two Senators from a state with 250,000 people aren't entitled to the same vote as two Senators from a state with 10,000,000? Why

In 1957-59 a handful of wild desert bighorn sheep were trapped in Arizona and released in a 427-acre enclosure on the Black Gap Wildlife Management Area i east Brewster County. Since then a bighorn herd has steadily increased and now totals six adult rams, eight adult ewes, six yearlings and

three lambs. Releasing some of these sheep from the fenced pasture in 1967 or 1968 on surrounding Black Management Area terrain will be the next experimental step toward establishing a Texas desert bighorn





THERE are 59 programs for federal assistance to state and local governments. More are in the the works. 21 of these programs sprung up since 1960. A huge percentage of federal tax money is doled out in federal aid. By fiscal 1965, if the trend in Washington continues, nearly one-ninth of the income will go for these sometimes good, sometimes bad programs. One grave trouble is that Congress very seldom looks back to see if the aid programs it adopts are actually doing what they were supposed to do. And once started, few of these welfare state programs ever end. The way things are going some state and local governments will become meaningless anchorisms totally dominated by the federal leaders. Some communities already belong lock, stock, and barrel to Washington. And unless the trend to continued wild federal spending is halted, local pride, responsibility, and independence will go down the drain. Industry does not come to a community where the sign of the pauper is prominently hanging out on the town gate.
