If you are troubled with Rosett or Die Back on your Pecan trees, now is the time to spray them.

Information given us by John Randles, Agriculture instructor at the High School, is to spray them with a solution of Zinc Sulfate, 2 tablespoons to a gallon of water. This treatment should be repeated every two weeks until three sprayings are

This however is for only temporary relief. For permanent relief, a trench should be dug around the base of the tree, and Zinc Sulphate poured in and covered over.






